17	BE IT ENACTED:	
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19	SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY.	
20	A. The Resources and Development Committee is a standing committee with oversight	
21	authority over the 110 Navajo Nation Chapters. 2 N.N.C. §500(C).	
22	B. The Navajo Nation established the Budget and Finance Committee is a standing committee	
23	with the authority to review and recommend to the Navajo Nation Council the management	
24	of all funds. 2 N.N.C. §164(A)(9); 2 N.N.C. §300(A), §301(B)(2).	
25	C. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee has the responsibility to review all final action by the Navajo	
26	Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. §164(A)(9); 2 N.N.C. §700(A).	
27	D. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. §102(A).	
28	As such, the Council may approve supplemental appropriations during the fiscal year.	
29	"Supplemental appropriations of General Funds within the current fiscal year are permitted,	
30	if and when additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue	

projections are projected and which are also in excess of the reserve amount set forth at §820(J)." 12 N.N.C. §820(L).

E. A "supplemental appropriation" is defined as: "[a]n appropriation of funds from the UUFB during the fiscal year, outside of the annual Comprehensive Budget Process." See Section XIV.33 of the FY2023 Budget Instructions Manual.

F. The Title 12 restrictions on supplemental appropriations from the UUFB include:

1. Payment of recurring government operating expenses shall be from recurring revenues, and payment of nonrecurring expenses shall be from nonrecurring revenues such as UUFB funds. 12 N.N.C. §820(E), §820(F).

2. Specifically, the UUFB shall not be used for recurring government expenditures or operations. 12 N.N.C. §820(J), §820(L).

- 3. UUFB funds may be used only after the Controller determines whether or not such revenues are subsidizing an imbalance between the Navajo Nation's recurring revenues and expenditures, and government expenditures shall only be authorized if a long-term (3-year to 5-year year) forecast shows that the operating deficit will not continue; otherwise, nonrecurring revenues are added to the UUFB account. 12 N.N.C. §820(F).
 - 4. The above provisions in Title 12 may be amended or waived by a two-thirds vote of the full membership of the Navajo Nation Council. 12 N.N.C. §820(F), §880.
 - 5. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. §820(F) all UUFB funding requests must be reviewed by the Controller. Such review is also required because the Controller determines which revenues and expenses are recurring and which are non-recurring. 12 N.N.C. §820(L).

6. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. §820(M) all UUFB funding requests must be submitted to the Office of Management and Budget ("OMB") for a budget impact analysis.

25 SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

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- A. Due to the heavy rainfall and snowfall expected for Winter 2022-23, all 110 Navajo Nation Chapters have a vital and urgent need to replenish their emergency funds accounts, so they all have the capacity to quickly respond to weather-related emergencies at the local level.
- B. On behalf of the Chapters, the Division of Community Development ("DCD") has submitted a Supplemental Funding Proposal Summary (BIM-Appendix K), requesting \$1,875,231

(rounded up) from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance to provide the Chapters sufficient funds to replenish each of their Emergency Fund accounts back to the established amount of \$25,000. EXHIBIT A.

- C. A comprehensive list showing each Chapters' individual funding need is attached hereto as **EXHIBIT B.** If the requested \$1,875,231 is approved, the Chapters will receive different dollar amounts as shown in EXHIBIT B, but all 110 Chapters will end up with the same balance of \$25,000 in their Emergency Fund accounts.
- D. On behalf of the Chapters, DCD has provided the required Navajo Nation Budget Forms, attached hereto as EXHIBIT C.

E. The Office of the Controller's memorandum required by 12 N.N.C. §820(L) is attached as **EXHIBIT D.** The Controller has indicated that the proposed expenditures are considered "non-recurring" expenses; therefore approval of the requested UUFB funds complies with 12 N.N.C. §820(E) and §820(F).

F. The Office of Management and Budget has provided a budget impact analysis as required by 12 N.N.C. §820(M), attached as EXHIBIT E.

SECTION THREE.

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A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves an appropriation of \$1,875,231 from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance for the 110 Navajo Nation Chapters Emergency Fund accounts. Each Chapter shall receive the designated dollar amount as shown in **EXHIBIT B**, so as to bring each Chapter's Emergency Fund account balance to \$25,000.

B. In accordance with 12 N.N.C. §820(J), this UUFB appropriation shall be from that amount of funds that exceeds the minimum fund reserve balance in the UUFB as determined by the Controller.

- C. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. §820(N), the UUFB funds approved herein shall not lapse at the end 25 26 of Fiscal Year 2023, so long as each Chapter budgets these funds in the subsequent fiscal 27 year for the same emergency purposes.
- D. The Navajo Nation hereby waives 12 N.N.C. §820(O) (the Chapter 50/50 formula) to allow 28 for this supplemental appropriation of UUFB funds to all 110 Chapters, in the dollar amounts 30 specified in EXHIBIT B.

SECTION FOUR. EFFECTIVE DATE

The provisions of this Action shall become effective in accordance with 2 N.N.C. 221(B) and with 2 N.N.C. 164(A)(17).

SECTION FIVE. SAVINGS CLAUSE

If any provision of this Action is determined invalid by the Supreme Court of the Navajo Nation or by any Navajo Nation District Court, without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the remainder of this Action shall remain valid as the law of the Navajo Nation.

SUBJECT: Review of 164 document #019704, Division of Community Development for 110 Navajo Nation Chapters' emergency funds in amount of \$1,875,230.64 from UUFB.

Pursuant to 12 NNC 820 (M) requiring OMB reviewed the subject document and provides the following information

- 1. Chapter Fund Balances from Navajo Nation FMIS or Navajo Nation Chapters' Wind System is as of 9/30/22, end of FY 2022. FY 2023 started October 1, 2022 and all Chapters were allocated General Funds. In previous years the Auditor General's office monitored Chapter expenditures and provided periodic reports. New Chapters expenditure is not available yet.
- 2. The Appropriation Act, Section 820, O; Distributions to Chapter, provides guidance on this. The language is: "Where not otherwise prohibited by existing law, any appropriation intended for distribution to all chapters of the Navajo Nation shall be allocated as follows: fifty percent (50%) of the appropriation shall be divided equally among all chapters and the remaining fifty percent (50%) shall be divided proportionately among the chapters using a percentage equal to that figure which the number of registered voters in each chapter bears to the whole of registered Navajo Nation voters as determined by the most current voter registration figures available as of the date of the appropriation...." As proposed, a waiver of this section may be required. DOJ should advise.
- 3. Some Chapters have deficit spending; e.g. Tohajiilee-\$67,286, Thoreau-\$99,669, Smith Lake-\$14,092, Standing Rock-\$6,437, Ramah-\$4,044, Iyanbito-\$16,195, Crownpoint-\$30,791, Churchrock-\$9,672, and Dilkon-\$\$46,802. The additional funding would cover these deficits and leave a balance of \$25,000. How do these deficits occur?
- 4. Some Chapters have balances far exceeding the \$25,000 threshold amount; e.g. Forest Lake \$55,399, Counselor \$78,849, Beclabito-\$68,039, St. Michaels \$42,206, and etc., there are others.

Good morning Council Delegates,

Since the COVID-19 pandemic started in March 2020, Crownpoint Chapter has spent over \$230,000 in Fund 01 General and in Fund 17 Emergency combined for food and supply purchases for the community to fight the COVID-19 virus, and to employ PEP employees for helping with food and supply distribution and to assist with water at our watering point and at the trash transfer station free of charge at the start of the pandemic. We have submitted documentation to FEMA for reimbursement, however as of today we have not been reimbursed. As with all other FEMA reimbursements, it will take a few years for our chapter to get a reimbursement. Please consider the Actual Expenditure Reports from the MIP software for the correct Emergency Expenditure amount starting from March 13, 2020 to current for all Navajo Nation Chapters. The fund balances from the WIND System for chapters are not the actual expenditures accumulated since the pandemic, it is only a balance amount left in a fund account.
