Financial Update-(General Fund Revenue, Expenditures, UUFB)

The following is the financial data from the General Fund for FY 2015. The total year to date gross General Fund Revenues, see Exhibit "A", as of September 30, 2015 is \$232,543,289 and the total set asides is \$58,557,792. The Net Revenue for the General Fund is \$173,985,497 which is 100.77% of the projection. The total expenditures by branch are shown on Exhibit "B". The Legislative Branch has actual expenditures of \$14,795,813, encumbrances of \$1,050,377, with a remaining budget of \$3,539,902. The Executive Branch actual expenditures are \$192,097,515, encumbrances of \$7,825,088 with a remaining budget of \$28,644,345. The Judicial Branch actual expenditures are \$13,907,018, encumbrances of \$60,335 and remaining budget of \$1,674,649. Total General Fund expenditures are \$220,800,346; total encumbrances are \$8,935,800 leaving an overall remaining General Fund budget of \$33,858,656. The updated UUFB as of September 30, 2015 is \$4,306,679, attached Exhibit "C."

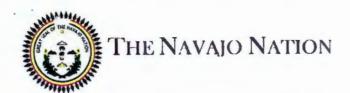

Division of Health

The Office of Management and Budget (OMB) has reviewed the above document and has the following comments:

- This document is a proposal for supplemental funding. All supplemental funding requests for the Executive Branch require approval from the Office of the President and Vice-President and review by OMB. A copy of the Executive Order #02-2011 is attached. Further, the FY 2016 Budget Instructions Manual, Section XI, B. 2. and C, address Branch Chief recommendations.
- 2. OMB has recently advised the Branch Chiefs to prioritize over 16Q Additional Need Proposals in total exceeding \$116 million so that the government can consider priorities. Is this proposal one of those priorities?
- Budget Form 4, page 3, has different numbers and amounts. The client total is 13,076 (not 15,384) so the total cost at \$65 each would be \$849,940 (not \$1,000,000). This discrepancy must be explained and/or corrected.
- 4. The Division of Health will be reimbursing the eligible recipients, is this within their scope of work?
- 5. The eyeglasses will be provided to eligible youth and elderly. Is there any coordination with the Department of Youth at this time?
- 6. There are limited funds available: \$14,080,043 in UUFB; however, there is \$472 million in the Sihasin Fund. Planning and prioritization is needed.
