Sadly, the Navajo Nation has lost 1,260 members, as of this week, to COVID-19 and we know this deadly virus will continue to take lives. As a Nation we have banded together to fight this monster in every way possible – mask wearing, social distancing, good hygiene practice – and we must continue these safety measures. While there are vaccines available to help, we cannot let our guard down with the latest coronavirus variants that we now see creeping onto the Navajo Nation.

For every life lost there are family members who grieve their loss and we continue to pray for their comfort. We appreciate the Division of Social Services stepping forward to offer burial assistance to those who truly are in need. The Division has worked tirelessly in finding sources of funding to help our People but those sources are limited. We thank the Navajo Council for supporting the Division and their work.

We are looking forward to working with the Federal Emergency Management Agency offer of funeral assistance as a separate source of funding for our citizens. The Division of Social Services is working on how applications are processed and will provide that information to all. We continue our fight against the monster virus and we offer our prayers for all Navajo People for their continued health and safety. We sign CMA-14-21 into law.

RESOLUTION OF THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL $24^{\rm th}$ NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL - THIRD YEAR, 2021

AN ACTION

RELATING TO AN EMERGENCY FOR THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING AN ALLOCATION OF SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF TWO-MILLION, TWO-THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,002,000) TO THE NAVAJO NATION DIVISION OF SOCIAL SERVICES FOR COVID-19-RELATED BURIAL ASSISTANCE; WAIVING 12 N.N.C. §§ 820(E), (F), AND (J) OF THE APPROPRIATIONS ACT

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing of body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 102(A).
- B. The Navajo Nation Code provides, "[m]atters constituting an emergency shall be limited to the cessation of law enforcement services, and disaster relief services, fire protection services or other direct services required as an entitlement under Navajo Nation or Federal law, or which directly threaten the sovereignty of the Navajo Nation. Such an emergency matter must arise due to the pressing public need for such resolution(s) and must be a matter requiring final action by the Council. 2 N.N.C.\$ 164(A)(16).
- C. This Resolution is offered as an emergency due to the unprecedented number of burials required as a result of deaths related to COVID-19.
- D. The Navajo Nation Council has the authority to approve supplemental appropriations. 12 N.N.C. § 820(L). Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(L), "[t]he Navajo Nation Council may adopt and approve supplemental appropriations to the Annual Comprehensive Budget during the fiscal year. Supplemental appropriations of General Funds within the current fiscal year are permitted, if and when additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections are projected and which are also in excess of the reserve amount set forth at § 820(J)."
- E. The Title 12 Finance Act Supplemental Appropriation requirements include:

- 1. All requests for annual operating funds and supplemental funds shall be submitted to the Office of Management and Budget for budget impact analysis. 12 N.N.C. § 820(M).
- 2. When the Controller identifies additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections, supplemental appropriations may be approved by the Navajo Nation Council. 12 N.N.C. § 820(L).
- 3. Supplemental Appropriations made from non-recurring revenues shall only be made for non-recurring operations or purposes, as set forth at § 820(F). The Controller of the Navajo Nation shall be responsible for the designation of recurring and non-recurring revenues. 12 N.N.C. § 820(L).
- 4. The Nation shall budget all recurring operating expenses, including capital maintenance, from recurring revenues. Long term debt shall not be used to finance recurring operating expenses. 12 N.N.C. § 820(E).
- 5. The Navajo Nation Code provides, "[t]he Nation shall restrict non-recurring revenues to budget non-recurring expenditures. In addition, non-recurring revenues will be budgeted only after an examination by the Controller to determine whether or not the revenues are subsidizing an imbalance between recurring revenues and expenditures, and expenditures may be authorized only if a long-term (three-five year) forecast shows that the operating deficit will not continue. Otherwise, non-recurring revenues will be added to the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund balance. This provision may be amended or waived by a two-thirds vote of the full Navajo Nation Council." 12 N.N.C. § 820(F).

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. The World Health Organization (WHO) declared a Public Health Emergency of International Concern related to the outbreak of coronavirus (COVID-19), a highly contagious and sometimes fatal respiratory virus on January 30, 2020; the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services declared a Public Health Emergency related to the COVID-19 outbreak on January 31, 2020; and the WHO declared a global pandemic due to COVID-19 on March 11, 2020.
- B. The Navajo Nation Commission on Emergency Management, with the concurrence of Navajo Nation President Jonathan Nez, declared a Public Health State of Emergency on the Navajo Nation on March 11, 2020 due to COVID-19. Resolution No. CEM 20-03-11.

The Navajo Nation Department of Health subsequently issued numerous Public Health Emergency Orders. Public Health Emergency Orders 2020-001 through 2021-01 ("Public Health Emergency Orders") are incorporated by reference into this resolution.

- C. As of February 25, 2021, the Navajo Nation Health Command Operations Center has confirmed 29,655 COVID-19 cases and 1,161 total confirmed COVID-19-related deaths on the Navajo Nation; COVID-19 cases and COVID-19-related deaths on the Navajo Nation have not subsided and continue to rise at an alarming rate.
- D. The Navajo Nation Division of Community Development is requesting supplemental funding in the amount of \$2,002,000 to provide financial assistance for the burial of 572 Navajo decedents, who passed away because of COVID-19-related complications. The Division's budget justification documents regarding this requested funding are attached as **Exhibit A**.
- E. The COVID-19 pandemic has created a public health disaster that the Navajo Nation is attempting to mitigate with relief funding. Failure to provide burial assistance will be a failure to provide disaster relief services to the Navajo people, and this resolution therefore requires emergency action by Navajo Nation leadership pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A) (16).
- F. The Office of Management and Budget has provided its review required pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(M). See memo attached as **Exhibit B**.
- G. Due to the emergency nature of this legislation the Office of the Controller has yet to provide the information required pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(L). The Controller can provide this information when the matter is heard before the Navajo Nation Council.

SECTION THREE. WAIVING 12 N.N.C. §§ 820(E), (F), AND (J), TO THE EXTENT THESE PROVISIONS PREVENT THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE TO BE USED TO FUND RECURRING EXPENDITURES

The Navajo Nation Council hereby waives 12 N.N.C. §§ 820(E), (F) and (J) in order to allow UUFB funds to be used for recurring expenditures.

SECTION FOUR. APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF TWO-MILLION, TWO-THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,002,000) TO THE NAVAJO NATION DIVISION OF SOCIAL SERVICES

- A. This supplemental appropriation of \$2,002,000 shall be from that amount of funds that exceeds the minimum fund balance of the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance as determined by the Office of the Controller, and as shown in **Exhibit B**.
- B. The Navajo Nation hereby approves supplemental funding from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance to the Navajo Nation Division of Social Services in the amount of \$2,002,000 for funds as indicated in the documents in **Exhibit A**.
- C. The Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance shall be reimbursed for any eligible expenditures set forth in this legislation from any FEMA reimbursements and/or other federal funding, specifically including additional Congressional appropriations for COVID-19-related relief, made available to the Navajo Nation.

SECTION FIVE. DIRECTIVES

The Navajo Nation Division of Social Services shall provide a written report regarding the expenditures under this resolution to the Health, Education and Human Services Committee at the end of each Quarter until all funds under this appropriation are expended.

SECTION SIX. SAVING CLAUSE

Should any provision(s) of this Act be determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court or the District Courts of the Navajo Nation, without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the remainder of the Act shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.


