RE: CAP-21-20, An Action Relating to an Emergency for the Navajo Nation; Approving Supplemental Funding from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance in the amount of one hundred three thousand four hundred dollars (\$103,400) to the Navajo Nation Judicial Branch Administrative Office of the Courts Waiving 12 N.N.C. §§ 820 (E) and (F) Regarding the Restriction of Matching Non-Recurring Revenues with Recurring Expenditures

Dear Speaker Damon,

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Navajo Nation President, I exercise the line item veto authority for CAP-21-20.

As Leaders of our Navajo government we must continually be mindful of our annually appropriated funds and ensure we use the funds in a prudent manner. Navajo law limits the matters constituting an emergency and here there is no showing how purchasing computer equipment falls within that definition. From the Court's guidelines it shows our courts continue to provide services on a modified basis to protect the health of the public and court staff. A request to buy laptops, kiosks presumably for the public's use, and scanners/printers does not correspond with the intent of the resolution in protecting the public and staff. It would appear to take advantage of the health emergency situation to purchase equipment that should be complete in a regular procurement process with available funds.

In addition, in a rush to pass this legislation two important procedures are missing, that is the Office of Management and Budget review and the Office of the Controller review. However, the resolution waives the applicable requirements of the Appropriations Act related to the reviews and leaving out the budget personnel's review is not good governance. That is how a government develops fiscal crisis.

For this reason, the Line Item Veto authority is applied, and I am striking the \$103,400 appropriated in CAP-21-20.

RESOLUTION OF THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL 24th NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL - SECOND YEAR, 2020

AN ACTION

RELATING TO AN EMERGENCY FOR THE NAVAJO NATION; APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF ONE HUNDRED THREE THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$103,400) TO THE NAVAJO NATION JUDICIAL BRANCH, ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE OF THE COURTS WAIVING 12 N.N.C. §§ 820 (E) AND (F) REGARDING THE RESTRICTION OF MATCHING NON-RECURRING REVENUES WITH RECURRING EXPENDITURES

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 102 (A).
- B. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §164 (A)(16) "[m]atters constituting an emergency shall be limited to the cessation of law enforcement services, and disaster relief services, fire protection services or other direct services required as an entitlement under Navajo Nation or Federal law, or which directly threaten the sovereignty of the Navajo Nation. Such an emergency matter must arise due to the pressing public need for such resolution(s) and must be a matter requiring final action by the Council."
- C. This legislation is offered as an emergency due to the need to provide continuing court services. Failure to maintain the operations of the Judicial Branch would threaten the sovereignty of the Navajo Nation.
- D. The Navajo Nation Council has the authority to approve supplemental appropriations. 12 N.N.C. § 820 (L). Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820 (L), "[t]he Navajo Nation Council may adopt and approve supplemental appropriations to the Annual Comprehensive Budget during the fiscal year. Supplemental appropriations of General Funds within the current fiscal year are permitted, if and when additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections are projected and which are also in excess of the reserve amount set forth at § 820 (J)."

- E. The Title 12 Finance Act Supplemental Appropriation requirements include:
 - 1. All requests for annual operating funds and supplemental funds shall be submitted to the Office of Management and Budget for budget impact analysis. 12 N.N.C. § 820 (M).
 - 2. When the Controller identifies additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections, supplemental appropriations may be approved by the Navajo Nation Council. 12 N.N.C. § 820 (L).
 - 3. Supplemental Appropriations made from non-recurring revenues shall only be made for non-recurring operations or purposes, as set forth at § 820 (F). The Controller of the Navajo Nation shall be responsible for designation recurring and non-recurring revenues. 12 N.N.C. § 820 (L).
 - 4. The Nation shall budget all recurring operating expenses, including capital maintenance, from recurring revenues. Long term debt shall not be used to finance recurring operating expenses. 12 N.N.C. \$820 (E).
 - 5. The Navajo Nation Code provides, "[t]he Nation shall restrict non-recurring revenues to budget non-recurring expenditures. In addition, non-recurring revenues will be budgeted only after an examination by the Controller to determine whether or not the revenues are subsidizing an imbalance between recurring revenues and expenditures, and expenditures may be authorized only if a long-term (three-five year) forecast shows that the operating deficit will not continue. Otherwise, non-recurring revenues will be added to the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund balance. This provision may be amended or waived by a two-thirds vote of the full Navajo Nation Council." 12 N.N.C. § 820 (F).

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. The novel coronavirus ("COVID-19") has caused a global pandemic and has hit the Navajo Nation especially hard. As of April $9^{\rm th}$, the Navajo Nation reported 488 cases of COVID-19 and 20 deaths from the virus.
- B. In an effort to reduce the spread of COVID-19 the President of the Navajo Nation extended the previously declared State of Emergency on the Navajo Nation and required government offices remain closed through April 26, 2020 in Executive Order 002-20.

- C. The Navajo Nation Department of Health has issued a Public Health Emergency Orders requiring Navajo Nation residents stay at home to mitigate the risk of spreading COVID-19 and to preserve the health and safety of all individuals residing on the Navajo Nation. Public Health Emergency Order No. 2020-003.
- D. The Navajo Nation Department of Health also issued a Public Health Emergency Orders extending the Stay at Home Order and implementing a curfew from 8:00 p.m. through 5:00 a.m. for Navajo Nation residents. Public Health Emergency Order No. 2020-004.
- E. This supplemental appropriation is requested for supplies and communication and utilities in the amount One Hundred Three Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$103,400). The budget documents are attached as **Exhibit A**.
- F. Due to the emergency nature of this funding request, the budget impact analysis required by 12 N.N.C. 820 (M) can be provided by the Office of Management and Budget when this matter is heard by Council either in person or telephonically.
- G. Due to the emergency nature of this funding request the Controller can satisfy the requirements provided in 12 N.N.C. § 820 (L) when this matter is heard by Council either in person or telephonically.

SECTION THREE. WAIVING 12 N.N.C. § 820 (E) AND (F)

The Navajo Nation Council waives 12 N.N.C. \S 820 (E) and (F) with regard to the restriction on matching non-recurring revenues with recurring expenditures.

SECTION FOUR. APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF ONE HUNDRED THREE THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$103,400) TO THE NAVAJO NATION JUDICIAL BRANCH, ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE OF THE COURTS

- A. This supplemental appropriation of \$103,400 shall be from that amount of funds that exceeds the minimum fund balance of the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance as determined by the Office of the Controller and as indicated the documents in Exhibit A.
- B. The Navajo Nation hereby approves supplemental funding from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance in the amount of \$103,400 for emergency funds as indicated in the documents in Exhibit A.

C. The Judicial Branch shall submit any expenditures from the UUFB to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) for reimbursement.


