Dear Speaker Damon,

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Navajo Nation President, I am exercising the Line Item Veto authority in CO-39-19.

The should be no mistake or misinterpretation, the Tohatchi Area of Opportunity & Services provides an invaluable service to our Navajo children with developmental disabilities. The program deserves our support; however, that support must follow the appropriate process so there is no question of the validity of our support.

First, the requirements for a grant to eligible external entities is outlined in the Budget Instruction Manual, Section X. A requirement for a grant application is the assignment to a Navajo Nation Branch or Division to be responsible for overseeing the administration of the grant. In this instance, there is no assignment to the Division of Social Services, which is the appropriate Division. The purpose of the assignment is to ensure the Division monitors the grantee's performance; insuring the funds are spent in accordance with our laws and policies. Related to the assignment is the proper signatures on the budget forms which should have the signatures of the appropriate Division and proper Branch designee; this requirement was not followed in the budget forms attached to the Resolution.

Second, the Appropriations Act requires supplemental appropriations made from non-recurring revenues shall only be made for non-recurring operations or purposes, and the Controller of the Navajo Nation shall be responsible for designating recurring and non-recurring revenues and purpose. The Resolution makes reference to an Exhibit E as the memorandum from the Office of the Controller that determines the request for supplemental appropriations is a non-recurring cost. That memorandum, Exhibit E, is not included in the Resolution and no determination can be made on the position of the Controller.

For this reason, I am exercising the Line Item Veto authority granted to me and strike the \$400,000 appropriated in CO-39-19.

TAOS is supported by many local Navajo Nation Chapters and local organizations, we appreciate their support. TAOS' concern for the safety of the children in their care should be addressed and we fully support TAOS. Working with the Division of Social Services, TAOS may bring this request for future consideration using the process for our grant application.

RELATING TO HEALTH, EDUCATION AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMITTEE, BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE; RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE, NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING A NAVAJO NATION GRANT AND SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$400,000.00 (FOUR JM) HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS) FOR THE TOHATCHI AREA OF OPPORTUNITY & SERVICES, INC (TAOS, INC.) TO PURCHASE VEHICLES

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820 (L), "[t]he Navajo Nation Council may adopt and approve supplemental appropriations to the Annual Comprehensive Budget during the fiscal year. Supplemental appropriations of General Funds within the current fiscal year are permitted, if and when additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections are projected and which are also in excess of the reserve amount set forth at § 820(J)."
- B. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 401 (B)(6)(a), the Health, Education and Human Services Committee is to recommend resolutions relating to social services and health.
- C. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 300 (C)(1)(3) and (4) the Budget and Finance Committee is authorized to recommend adoption of resolutions related to the expenditure of the Nation's financial resources.
- D. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 501 (B)(4)(c), the Resources and Development Committee is to review and recommend to the Navajo Nation Council supplemental appropriations to the capital

- improvement projects annual budget to fund necessary additional capital improvement projects.
- E. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A)(9), a proposed resolution that requires final action by the Navajo Nation Council shall be assigned to the Naabik'íyáti' Committee before it is heard by the Navajo Nation Council.

SECTION TWO. TITLE 12 FINANCE ACT SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION PROCESS

- A. The Title 12 Finance Act Supplemental Appropriation requirements include:
 - Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(L), when the Controller identifies additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections, supplemental appropriations may be allocated by the Navajo Nation Council.
 - 2. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820 (L), "Supplemental appropriations made from non-recurring revenues shall only be made for non-recurring operations or purposes, as set forth at § 820 (F). The Controller of the Navajo Nation shall be responsible for designating recurring and non-recurring revenues and purposes."
 - 3. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(M), all requests for annual operating funds and supplemental funds shall be submitted to the Office of Management and Budget ("OMB") for budget impact analysis.

SECTION THREE. FINDINGS

A. The Tohatchi Area of Opportunity & Services, Inc. (TAOS, Inc.), formerly known as A School For Me, Inc., was created "[t]o promote, develop, implement, manage and acquire training programs and activities as well as opportunities and specialized services including, but not limited to, custodial, residential care and related services for individuals with disabilities residing on or near the Navajo Indian

Reservation." See Restatement of Articles of Incorporation in **Exhibit C**, the Navajo Nation Grant Application.

- B. The Tohatchi Area of Opportunity & Services, Inc. must ensure the safety and well-being of individuals and staff as they go about their daily activities, including the use of safe and reliable vehicles. TAOS maintains a vehicle fleet of 22 vehicles, most have high mileage and need constant vehicle maintenance. Tohatchi Area of Opportunity & Services, Inc. is requesting \$400,000.00 to purchase vehicles to replace vehicles with high mileage.
- C. The budget documents requesting \$400,000.00 from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance (UUFB) for the Tohatchi Area of Opportunity & Services, Inc. are attached as Exhibit A.
- D. The Office of the Controller has determined memorandum identifying additional revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections, pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(L), attached as **Exhibit E**.
- E. The Office of the Controller has determined this request for supplemental appropriation is a non-recurring cost, pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820 (L), and is attached as Exhibit E.
- F. The Office of Management and Budget Impact Analysis is attached as Exhibit B.
- G. Chapter resolutions and letters of support are attached as Exhibit D.

SECTION FOUR. APPROVING A NAVAJO NATION GRANT AND SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$400,000.00 FOR TOHATCHI AREA OF OPPORTUNITY & SERVICES, INC. TO PURCHASE VEHICLES JMN

A. The Navajo Nation Council, having received certification by the Office of the Controller of the availability of certain funds from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance (UUFB) for supplemental appropriation hereby approves a Navajo Nation Grant and the supplemental appropriation of \$400,000.00 for

Tohatchi Area of Opportunity & Services, Inc. to purchase JMN vehicles.

B. This supplemental appropriation of \$400,000.00 shall be from that amount of funds that exceeds the minimum fund balance of the UUFB.

Any savings realized after the eight vehicles are purchased are to be reverted back to the UUFB.

TAOS operates 2 homes in Tohatchi, NM, 9 homesand 3 apartments in Gallup, NM to benefit individuals. Besides maintaining these facilities, TAOS must ensure for the safety and well being of individuals and staff as they go about their daily activities. This includes the use of safe and reliable vehicles. TAOS maintains a vehicle fleet of 22 vehicles mostly with high mileage and deemed unsafe. The past 3 years the NMDOT has awarded TAOS monies to purchase 2 vehicles each year with the expectation of another award for 2 vehicles this year and the following year. NM purchased vehicles are for the specific use of NM funded individuals. For the reason funding is limited to purchase replacement vehicles for 28 NN funded Navajo individuals, TAOS is requesting \$400,00.00 to purchase 8 vehicles to replace old, high maintenance vehicles presently in use to transport 28 Navajo individuals and staff funded by the Navajo Nation.

- 2. A School For Me, Inc. School Board has successfully operated A School For Me, Inc. for six years and wishes to continue to do so; and
- 3. By Resolution ECMY-144-82, the Education Committee of the Navajo Tribal Council has recommended the approval of the Plan of Operation for educational and vocational services for A School For Me, Inc., and has recommended that the Board of Directors of A School For Me, Inc. be given authority to contract for said services with the Bureau of Indian Affairs under P.L. 93-638 for operation of the educational and vocational programs of the school; and
- 4. The Advisory Committee of the Navajo Tribal Council has granted an interim charter to the Board of Directors of A School For Me, Inc. and has therefore recognized said board as a "tribal organization" as defined under 25 CFR 271.3(r) for the purpose of contracting under P.L. 93-638.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The Advisory Committee of the Navajo Tribal Council hereby approves the Plan of Operation for educational and vocational services for A School For Me, Inc. (attached).
- 2. The Advisory Committee of the Navajo Tribal Council hereby grants authority to the Board of Directors of A School For Me, Inc. to apply for, negotiate and execute a contract with the Bureau of Indian Affairs under the provisions of P.L. 93-638 for the educational and vocational services of A School For Me, Inc. for the period of October 1, 1982 through September 30, 1983.

RESTATEMENT OF ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

CORPORATION BUREAU

We the undersigned persons acting with the approval of the majority of the Board of Directors do hereby sign and acknowledge the following Restatement of the Articles of Incorporation as correctly setting forth the provisions of the Articles of Incorporation as amended, that they have been duly approved as required by law and that they supersede the original Articles of Incorporation and all amendments thereto.

Article I

Name-Place-Duration

SECTION 1: The name of the corporation shall be:

TOHATCHI AREA OF OPPORTUNITY & SERVICES, INC.

SECTION 2: The principal place of business of this Corporation shall be 100 Manuelito Drive, Tohatchi, New Mexico, 87325 determined by the Board of Directors and shall be set forth in the By-Laws.

SECTION 3: The Corporation's period of duration shall be perpetual, unless the Board of Directors chooses to dissolve the corporation after a shorter period of time.

Article II

Objective and Purposes



SECTION 1: Said corporation is organized exclusively for charitable and education purposes, including for such purposes the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law. The primary purposes of the Corporation shall be:

(a) To promote, develop, implement, manage and acquire training programs and activities as well as opportunities and specialized services including, but not limited to, custodial, residential care and related services for individuals with disabilities residing on or near the Navajo Indian Reservation as

for poor, disadvantaged or underprivileged persons or groups comprised substantially of such persons residing on or near the Navajo Indian Reservation. These programs and activities shall be developed and implemented in order to provide opportunity for education, training or experience for all these individuals as well as to enhance their life skills so that they may become integrated into and become contributing members of their respective communities and gain employment or employment opportunity;

(b) To design, develop, construct, promote and implement, economic development projects on or near the Navajo Indian Reservation that provide opportunity for disabled individuals residing on or near the Navajo Indian Reservation as well as for poor, disadvantaged or underprivileged persons or groups comprised

substantially of such persons residing on or near the Navajo Indian Reservation in order to provide education, training or experience for all these individuals, to enhance their life skills including their abilities to gain employment in business enterprises as well as to manage, operate or own such business enterprises so that such individuals may become integrated into and become contributing members of their respective communities and gain employment or employment opportunity;

- (c) To design, develop, promote and implement accounting systems and procedures as well as to provide accounting and other support services to various entities including but not limited to local chapters of the Navajo Nation as well as to non-profit corporations, organizations, groups, foundations and funds organized and operated exclusively for charitable, religious, scientific, literary or educational purposes;
- (d) To own, manage, operate, construct and acquire residential homes for individuals with disabilities residing on or near the Navajo Indian Reservation in order to enhance the life skills of individuals with disabilities and to assist them in becoming viable members of their respective communities;
- (e) Either directly or indirectly, and either alone or in conjunction or in cooperation with others, whether such others be persons or organizations of any kind or nature, such as corporations, firms, associations, trusts, institutions, foundations, groups or governmental bureaus, departments, or agencies, to

undertake any and all lawful activities which may be necessary, useful or desirable in the furtherance, accomplishment or fostering any other legitimate purposes of this Corporation.

SECTION 2: In furtherance and not in limitation of the general powers conferred by the laws of the State of New Mexico, and the objectives and purposes herein set forth, it is expressly provided that this Corporation shall also have the following powers:

- (a) To receive by gift, bequest, devise, grant or in any other manner, money assistance and any other form of contribution, or otherwise contract for, lease, by or acquire property or things of value of every nature whether of real, personal or mixed property, from any person, firm, corporation or government, whether national, state, local or tribal, upon such terms and conditions as the Board of Directors of the Corporation shall deem reasonable and equitable and in the best interest of the corporation, to be used in the furtherance of the purposes of the corporation;
- (b) To hold, use, improve, deal in, sell, lease, exchange or otherwise dispose of any or all of its assets, to borrow money, issue bonds, debentures, notes or other evidence of indebtedness, with or without giving security therefore;
 - (c) To loan any of its assets with or without security;
- (d) To retain and invest any of its assets in such manner as the Board of Directors may deem advisable;

(e) To do any and every other act, thing or undertaking necessary, convenient, incidental or desirable, directly or indirectly, to the attainment of any end in furtherance of the purposes herein above enumerated which an individual or corporation might do.

SECTION 3: It is the further purpose of this Corporation to engage in, participate in, or carry on any activity which reasonably contributes to the education, training or experience of disabled persons residing in or near the Navajo Indian Reservation as well as to the alleviation or elimination of poverty, the furtherance of education and the promotion of economic development in economically depressed areas to the same extent as natural persons could, consistent with the laws of the United States, the State of New Mexico, the Navajo Nation, the Restatement of the Articles of Incorporation as well as the Amended Bylaws of this Corporation.

SECTION 4: All words and clauses appearing in this article are used in their broadest sense and are intended to be so construed. The use of a specific or related word or clause is not intended to in any way limit any other word or clause in this article.

Article III

Limitations

SECTION 1: This Corporation shall not own or hold more real property than is reasonably necessary to carry out its purposes.

SECTION 2: No part of the asset s or any net earnings of this Corporation shall inure to the pecuni ary benefit of or be distributed to its members, officers or directors of this Corporation or other private persons, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article II hereof.

SECTION 3: The greatest amount of indebtedness of liability, direct or contingent, to which this corporation may at any time be subject shall be five million dollars unless the Board of Directors shall specifically authorize a greater indebtedness or liability.

SECTION 4: No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the Corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue code of 1954 or corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law.

Article IV

Membership

This Corporation shall issue no capital stock and shall be composed of members rather than stock holders. The qualification of members shall be set forth in accordance with applicable law, including but not limited to the laws of the State of New Mexico. The private property of the members, officers and Directors of this Corporation shall be forever exempt from liability for it corporate debts and obligations.

Article V

Board of Directors

SECTION 1: The general affairs of this Corporation shall be managed and its policies set by a Board of Directors.

SECTION 2: The exact number of Directors, their manner of selection, and terms of office shall be specified by the Bylaws of the Corporation or by applicable law to the extent not established in the Bylaws.

SECTION 3: The officers of this Board shall be a Chairman, Vice Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer, to have such powers, responsibilities and terms of office as provided in the Bylaws.

SECTION 4: The original officers of the Board of the Corporation elected at the first organizational meeting held on the 29th of December, 1975 at Window Rock, Arizona, as well as their then-current addresses were: Annie D. Wauneka, President, P.O. Box 811 Ganado, Arizona; Wilson Halona, Vice-President, P.O. Box 429

Tohatchi, New Mexico; and Jack L. Crowder, Secretary/Treasurer, P.O. Box 250, Bernalillo, New Mexico. Two additional original Board members of the Corporation and their then-current addresses were Willis H. Peterson, P.O. Box 264 Window Rock, Arizona and Shirley Bowman, member, General Delivery, Tohatchi, New Mexico. All of the above individuals were incorporators of the Corporation.

Article VI

Amendments

SECTION 1: The Board of Directors shall have the power to amend these Articles by majority vote at any regular or special meeting where a quorum is present.

SECTION 2: Written notice of any proposed amendment shall be given to each of the Board of Directors at least fourteen (14) days prior to the meeting at which the amendment is to be considered.

SECTION 3: Any amendments duly proposed and adopted by the Board of Directors shall be signed and acknowledged by the President, and the Secretary shall certify that the amendments was adopted by the Board of Directors. The amendments shall then be filed, recorded and published as provided by law.

Article VII

Bylaws

SECTION 1: The Bylaws of this Corporation may contain any provisions for the regulation and management of the affairs of the Corporation not inconsistent with applicable law or with these Articles.

SECTION 2: The Board of Directors shall have the power, to adopt, alter, amend or repeal the Bylaws of this Corporation by majority vote at any regular or special meeting where a quorum is present.

Article VIII

Dissolution

In the event of the dissolution of this Corporation, its remaining assets, if any, shall be distributed as the Directors of this Corporation shall determine, to one or more non-profit charitable organizations or corporation which are exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law). Any such assets not so distributed shall be disposed of by the court or courts having jurisdiction, to another organization to be used in a manner that will best accomplish the general purposes for which this Corporation was organized.



OFFICE OF MANAGEMENT & BUDGET

The following Restatement of Bylaws, having been approved by CORPORATION a majority of the Board of Directors, correctly sets forth the provisions of the Bylaws as amended and supersedes the prior Bylaws and all amendments thereto.

ARTICLE I OFFICE

Section 1: Principal Office

Principal Office of the Corporation shall be located at Tohatchi, McKinley County, New Mexico.

Section 2: Program Office

The Corporation shall locate and maintain program offices at Tohatchi, McKinley County, New Mexico.

Section 3: Other Offices

The Corporation may locate and maintain any other offices, mobile office units, part-time offices or any other facility in furtherance of its purposes, by resolution of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE II BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1: General Powers

The business and affairs of the Corporation shall be managed by its Board of Directors.

Section 2: Number and Qualifications

The number of Directors of the Corporation shall be five (5) or such other number as specified by applicable law. Directors need not be residents of the State of New Mexico but must reside within the exterior boundaries of the Navajo Nation. At least four

(4) Directors shall reside within the Tohatchi, Naschiti, Coyote Canyon, Twin Lakes or Mexican Springs chapters of the Navajo Nation. If there are no qualified applicants from these chapter areas, preference will be given to applicants who reside within the service area of the Corporation, defined as the exterior boundaries of the Navajo Nation.

Section 3: Terms of Office

Each Director shall serve a term of a minimum of four (4) years or such other period as provided by applicable law, provided that the Director retains membership on the Board of Directors. Elections as to any open positions on the Board of Directors shall be held at the annual meeting of the Board. Only current members of the Board of Directors shall be entitled to vote as to any candidate(s) seeking election to the Board.

- (a) Any Director may be removed by a majority vote of the Board of Directors for just cause or by resignation or in accordance with applicable law.
- (b) Any Director may be elected to serve additional terms in accordance with applicable law.
- (c) The current Directors of the Corporation, the end date of each respective term as well as the time remaining on each term are all as set forth below:

(d) The initial Board of Directors of the Corporation

was selected at a meeting held on December 15, 1975 at Window Rock, Arizona.

Section 4: Meetings Generally

Meetings of the Board of Directors, regular or special, may be held either within or outside New Mexico and upon such notice as prescribed herein. Attendance of a Director at any meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of the meeting except when a Director attends a meeting for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened. Neither the business to be transacted at, nor the purpose of, any regular or special meeting of the Board of Directors need be specified in the notice or waiver of notice of the meeting unless otherwise required herein. Except as otherwise restricted by the articles of incorporation or these bylaws, members of the Board of Directors or any committee designated thereby may participate in a meeting of the Board or committee by means of a conference telephone or similar communications equipment whereby all persons participating in the meeting can hear each other at the same time and participation by such means shall constitute presence in person at a meeting.

Section 5: Regular Meetings

The Board of Directors shall hold regular meetings at least every two months. Meetings shall normally be held at Tohatchi, McKinley County, New Mexico. The Board of Directors may provide by resolution a time and place, either within or outside the State of New Mexico, for the holding of additional regular meetings without notice other than a resolution which shall be mailed to each Board

member by the President at least five days prior to the meeting. The President of the Board of Directors shall also provide notice in writing to each Director of any regularly scheduled meeting as early as possible prior to each regular meeting, but in no event less than five days prior to the meeting.

In addition to notice of meetings provided to Directors, notice of all meetings shall also be given to the Parent Advisor designated by the Board of Directors. The Parent Advisor is a parent or guardian of a person or persons using the services of the Corporation whose role is to advise the Board of the perspective of parents or guardians of Corporate clients on such issues as may come before the Board. The Parent Advisor may attend all meetings and shall so advise the Board but shall not be entitled to voting rights or to participation in any executive sessions of Board meetings. The Board of Directors by resolution may authorize the payment of a small per diem to the Farent Advisor for attendance at meetings of the Board of Directors.

Section 6: Annual Meeting, Special Meetings, Work Sessions and Emergency Meetings

The Annual Meeting of the Corporation shall be held within the first two weeks of December each calendar year. Special Meetings or Work Sessions of the Board of Directors may be called by the Board in its discretion. The Board of Directors may fix any place, either within or outside the State of New Mexico, as the place for holding any special meeting or work session. The President of the Board of Directors shall also provide notice in writing to each Director of any specially scheduled meeting as early as possible

prior to each special meeting, but in no event less than three (3) days prior to the meeting. In the emergency circumstances, meeting may be held on as little as twenty four (24) hours notice.

Section 7: Ouorum

The majority of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the Board of Directors requiring formal action by the Board, but if less than such majority is present at a meeting, a majority of the Directors present may adjourn the meeting from time to time without further notice until a quorum is present.

Section 8: Manner of Acting

- (a) An act of the majority of the Directors entitled to vote who are present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Board of Directors.
 - (b) There shall be no voting by proxy.
- (c) Robert's Rules of Order will be followed in the conducting of all meetings of the Board.
- (d) All meetings of the Board will be open to the public residing within the service area of the Corporation, except that the public generally or any particular person may be excused from a meeting for unduly interfering with the orderly conduct of business.

Section 9: Compensation

The Directors shall not receive a set salary for their services; Directors, however, shall receive a fixed sum and expenses for attendance at meetings of the Board or for time spent on business directly involving the Board.

Section 10: Vacancies

Any vacancy occurring on the Board of Directors may be filled by the affirmative vote of the remaining Directors though less than a quorum of the Board of Directors or by such other manner as may be mandated by applicable law. A Director chosen to fill a vacancy shall serve for the unexpired term of his predecessor in office. Any directorship to be filled by reason of an increase in the number of Directors or by a vacancy may be filled through appointed by approval of the Board of Directors for a term of office continuing only until the next election of the Directors or by such other manner as may be mandated by applicable law.

Section 11: Removal

Any Director may be removed from office for just cause by a majority vote of the Board of Directors at a duly called meeting of the Board of Directors. Just cause shall include but not be limited to missing three (3) consecutive meetings of the Board, conviction of a felony in any jurisdiction, conduct detrimental to the Corporation or for other good and sufficient reasons. Directors may also be removed by such other method or means and for such other reasons as may be permitted by applicable law.

ARTICLE III OFFICERS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1: Officers The Officers of the Board of Directors of the Corporation shall be a President, Vice-President, a Secretary/Treasurer, each of whom shall be elected by the Board of Directors.

Section 2: Elections and Terms of Office

- (a) The officers of the Board of Directors of the Corporation shall be elected at the annual meeting of the Corporation or at such other time as may be permissible under applicable law.
- (b) Each officer of the Board shall hold office until his successor shall have been duly elected or appointed and takes office.
- (c) The initial officers of the Corporation, then known as A School for Me, Inc., were elected at the organizational meeting of the Board on the 15th day of December, 1975, at Window Rock, Arizona, and held office until the first meeting of the Board of Directors.
- (d) Any officer(s) of the Board of Directors may be removed for just cause by majority vote by the Board of Directors at any regular meeting of the Board or by such other method or means as may be mandated by applicable law.

Section 3: Vacancies

A vacancy in any office because of death, resignation, removal or otherwise may be filled by action of the Board of Directors for the unexpired portion of the term, pursuant to Article II, Section 10 of the Amended Bylaws.

Section 4: President

(a) The President shall be the principal officer of the Board of Directors of the Corporation. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors. The President shall sign, with the Executive Director, any deeds, mortgages, bonds, contracts or other instruments which the Board has authorized to be

executed. The Board of Directors by resolution may impose additional signatory requirements pertaining to the Corporation as the Board deems fit from time to time.

- (b) The President of the Board shall see that all orders and resolutions of the Board and of any Executive Committee as may be established by the Board are carried into effect, and, in general, perform all duties incident to the position of President of the Board of Directors.
- (c) The President of the Board shall have such other duties and authority as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors and the Plan of Operation of the Corporation which has been duly adopted by the Board at a regular meeting of the Board.

Section 5: Vice-President

The Vice-President of the Board shall have the authority to perform the duties of the President in the event of the absence or inability of the President to act, or when requested to do so by the President. The Vice-President of the Board shall have such other duties and authority as may be prescribed by the Board from time to time.

Section 6: Secretary/Treasurer

- (a) The Secretary/Treasurer of the Board of Directors shall cause the minutes of the meeting of the Board to be kept in a manner best suited to provide an accurate and complete record. The Secretary/Treasurer shall see that all notices of meetings are given in accordance with these Bylaws.
- (b) The Secretary/Treasurer of the Board shall appoint a custodian for all corporate records and assets and shall monitor

the preparation of accurate and complete financial records and books of account.

(c) The Secretary/Treasurer of the Board shall have such other duties and authority as may be prescribed by the President or the Board from time to time.

ARTICLE IV EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Section 1: Executive Director

The Board of Directors shall employ an Executive Director to supervise the day-to-day activities of the Corporation. The Executive Director shall have such qualifications as the Board determines. The Executive Director shall serve at the pleasure of the Board and shall have the duties and authority prescribed in the Bylaws or by the resolution of the Board of Directors.

Section 2: Duties and Authority

- (a) The Executive Director shall be responsible to the Board. He shall maintain utmost loyalty to the Board and to the purposes of the Corporation.
- (b) The Executive Director shall faithfully and diligently execute his duties and shall exercise his authority prudently and wisely in the best interests of the Corporation and those people whom the Corporation serves.
- (c) The Executive Director will at all times keep the Board fully informed of the activities of the Corporation and will also inform the Board of any special problems or occurrences requiring the Board's attention or action.
 - (d) The Executive Director shall have the duty and

responsibility to conduct and administer the activities of the Corporation. The Board of Directors shall delegate to the Executive Director and shall ensure that the Corporation properly meets any and all of its obligations.

- (e) Subject to limitations or guidance as may be provided by the Board of Directors from time to time, the Executive Director shall select, employ, supervise, and may discharge hourly personnel of the Corporation.
- expend funds received from the U.S. Government, funds obtained from private foundation grants, or other public grants made for specific purposes as well as other (unrestricted) corporate funds up to the amount of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) except for expenditures for capitol assets which shall in all events require prior approval of the Board for any one purpose or activity. Any expenditure(s) exceeding \$5,000.00 of federal, non-federal or unrestricted funds of the Corporation shall require prior approval of the Board or any Executive Committee established by the Board unless authorized by resolution of the Board. The authority granted to the Executive Director by this sub-section is subject to all contractual, regulatory or other applicable restrictions as to any particular funds and to such accountability procedures as the Board may designate.
- (g) The Executive Director, in conjunction with the President of the Board of Directors, may sign any bonds, contracts, or other instruments or agreements on behalf of the corporation in furtherance of the purposes of the Corporation as may be permitted

by resolution duly passed by the Board of Directors.

- (h) The Executive Director shall have such other authority and duties as prescribed by the Board.
- (i) The Executive Director may delegate authority to staff members as he sees fit, subject to limitations set by the Board.

ARTICLE V COMMITTEES

Section 1: Committees

The Board of Directors, by resolution, may designate one or more committees, including an Executive Committee.

Section 2: Authority of Committees

Any committees of the Board shall have and exercise the authority of the Board to the extent provided in the resolution creating the committee.

Section 3: Responsibility of the Board of Directors

The designation of any committee by the Board and the delegation to that committee of authority shall not relieve the Board of any responsibility imposed upon it by applicable law or by these Bylaws.

ARTICLE VI CONTRACTS AND FISCAL MATTERS

Section 1: Contracts and Other Instruments

The Board of Directors may authorize any officer, the Executive Director, or any agent of the corporation, in addition to the officers and executive director so authorized by these Bylaws, to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the corporation and such authority may

be general or specific.

Section 2: Checks and Drafts

All checks, drafts, or orders for the payment of money, notes, or other evidence of indebtedness issued in the name of the Corporation shall be signed by such officers or employees of the corporation as determined by a resolution of the Board of Directors.

Section 3: Deposits

All funds of the Corporation shall be deposited to the credit of the Corporation in such banks or other depositories as the Board of Directors may select.

Section 4: Gifts and Contributions

The Board of Directors may accept on behalf of the Corporation any gift, contribution, bequest or devise for the general purposes or for any special purpose of the Corporation.

Section 5: Records and Accounts

The Corporation shall keep adequate, correct and complete records and books of account, including property, personnel and financial records and provide for such other accounting for all corporate funds as may be necessary for the efficient operation of the Corporation.

Section 6: Records of Activities

The Corporation shall keep appropriate records of its activities and of the activities of its personnel.

Section 7: Conflict of Interest

No member of the Board of Directors shall engage or have a direct or indirect financial or personal interest in any activity

that conflicts or raises a reasonable question of conflict with his/her duties and responsibilities to the Corporation.

ARTICLE VII WAIVER OF BOTICE

Section 1: Waiver of Notice

Whenever any notice is required to be given by applicable law, by the Restated Articles of Incorporation or these Bylaws, a waiver thereof in writing signed by the person entitled to such notice shall be deemed equivalent to such notice.

ARTICLE VIII REGISTERED AGENT

Section 1: Registered Agent

The name of the current registered agent for service of process is Raymond Z. Ortiz and the street address of the registered office for service of process of the Corporation is 347 East Palace Avenue, Santa Fe, New Mexico 87501.

ARTICLE IX

Section 1: Amendments

These Amended Bylaws may be altered, amended or repealed and new Bylaws may be adopted at any annual, regular or special meeting of the Board if at least fourteen (14) days written notice is given of the intention to alter, amend, repeal or to adopt any Bylaws at such meeting.

ARTICLE X CORPORATE SEAL

Section 1: Seal

The Board of Directors may, by resolution, provide a corporate seal which may be in any form and have any words inscribed thereon

as may be directed by the Board, except that the seal shall include the name of the Corporation.

ARTICLE XI EFFECTIVE DATE

Section 1: Effective date

The effective date of these Amended Bylaws shall be October 7, 2000.







The Office of the Controller has reviewed the above referenced document.

- 1. The balance of the UUFB is \$37,960,422 as of June 20, 2019. Within the Three Branch Chief agreement an amount of \$21,000,000 is intended to be set aside as part of the FY 2020 comprehensive budget to address the impending FY 2021 projected General Fund Revenue decrease. Unmet needs amounts have yet to be determined but would also reduce this available amount. In addition, there are requests from the UUFB for water rights and DALTC that would further reduce the amount of the UUFB.
- 2. This funding request is in the amount of \$400,000 to purchase vehicles for Tohatchi Area of Opportunities & Service Inc. This is an outside entity that is requesting this purchase. In the body of the legislation it appears to be a grant. That would lead to the question of who would the vehicles belong to? The Navajo Nation or the Tohatchi Area Of Opportunity & Service Inc. The budget

forms attached have the budget amounts in the Capital Line items which would indicate that the Navajo Nation would purchase these vehicles., but the quotes from the dealership are to Tohatchi Area of Opportunity & Services. So the question would be whether this is a grant, or a Navajo Nation capital purchase. If it is a Navajo Nation Purchase, a program would need to be identified to take responsibility of these vehicles and the procurement rules of the Navajo Nation would need to apply to this purchase. Also, if they are Navajo Nation vehicles the program responsible would be the authorized drivers and the vehicles would need to be tagged as a Navajo Nation fixed asset.

This request is funding for a non-recurring cost for a grant. It would also be a non-recurring cost if it is capital purchase.
