Dear Speaker Damon,

Thank you to the Navajo Nation Council, Navajo Chapters, and the Division of Community Development for working together to present this resolution in support of our Navajo students. The pandemic has brought many issues to the forefront, including our Nation's ability to build itself from within, through infrastructure development, economic growth and workforce investment.

The need for educated professionals and skilled workers has never been more apparent. Our Navajo students are in need of support and income to further their educational and career development. Summer Youth Employment has been an important part of many of our current Navajo professionals whom are leaders within our government. Our assistance is needed to cultivate that development. A majority of our Navajo people choose to reside in urban areas to employ their education and skills for career opportunities and provide for their families; we need to do all we can to provide positive work experience for our youth that will keep them here on the Nation and contribute productively to our Navajo communities.

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Navajo Nation President, I am signing Resolution CJN-28-22 into law.

RESOLUTION OF THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL 24th NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL - FOURTH YEAR, 2022

AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HEALTH, EDUCATION, AND HUMAN SERVICES, RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT, BUDGET AND FINANCE, AND NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEES, AND THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING \$4,000,000 FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE ("UUFB") FOR THE 110 NAVAJO NATION CHAPTERS' SUMMER 2022 YOUTH EMPLOYMENT PROGRAMS; WAIVING 12 N.N.C. § 820(E), § 820(F), § 820(J), and § 820(L) TO ALLOW USE OF UUFB FUNDS FOR RECURRING CHAPTER EXPENSES

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Navajo Nation established the Health, Education, and Human Services Committee as a Navajo Nation Council standing committee and empowered the Committee to review and recommend resolutions regarding employment matters. 2 N.N.C. § 401(B)(6)(A).
- B. The Navajo Nation established the Resources and Development Committee as a Navajo Nation Council standing committee and gave the Committee oversight over the 110 Navajo Nation Chapters. 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(9); 2 N.N.C. § 500(A); 2 N.N.C. § 501(C)(1).
- C. The Navajo Nation established the Budget and Finance Committee as a Navajo Nation Council standing committee and authorized the Committee to review and recommend to the Navajo Nation Council the management of all funds. 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(9); 2 N.N.C. § 300(A); 2 N.N.C. § 301(B)(2).
- D. The Navajo Nation established the Naabik'íyáti' Committee as a Navajo Nation Council standing committee, and all proposed legislation that requires final action by the Navajo Nation Council is assigned to the Naabik'íyáti' Committee for its review and consideration. 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(9); 2 N.N.C. § 700(A).
- E. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 102(A). As such, the Council ". . . may adopt and approve supplemental appropriations to the Annual Comprehensive Budget during the fiscal year. Supplemental appropriations of General Funds within the current fiscal year are permitted, if and when additional sources of revenues above

and beyond the initial or current revenue projections are projected and which are also in excess of the reserve amount set forth at § 820(J)." 12 N.N.C. § 820(L).

- F. The Title 12 restrictions on supplemental appropriations, including all amounts from the UUFB, include:
 - Payment of recurring government operating expenses shall be from recurring revenues, and payment of nonrecurring expenses shall be from nonrecurring revenues such as UUFB funds. 12 N.N.C. § 820(E); 12 N.N.C. § 820(F).
 - 2. Specifically, the UUFB shall not be used for recurring government expenditures or operations. 12 N.N.C. § 820(J); 12 N.N.C. § 820(L).
 - 3. Nonrecurring revenues such as UUFB funds may be used only after the Controller determines whether or not such revenues are subsidizing an imbalance between the Navajo Nation's recurring revenues and expenditures, and government expenditures shall only be authorized if a long-term (3-year to 5-year) forecast shows that the operating deficit will not continue; otherwise, nonrecurring revenues will be added to the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance. 12 N.N.C. § 820(F).
 - 4. The above provisions in Title 12 may be amended or waived by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the full membership of the Navajo Nation Council. 12 N.N.C. § 820(F); 12 N.N.C. § 880.
 - 5. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(F) all UUFB funding requests must be reviewed by the Controller. Such review is also required because the Controller determines which revenues and expenses are recurring and which are non-recurring. 12 N.N.C. § 820(L).
 - 6. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(M) all UUFB funding requests must be submitted to the Office of Management and Budget ("OMB") for a budget impact analysis.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

A. All 110 Navajo Nation Chapters have indicated a need for supplemental funds to pay for their summer youth employment programs for the Summer of 2022. On behalf of the 110 Chapters, the Division of Community Development ("DCD") is requesting \$4,000,000 in UUFB funds to distribute among all 110 Chapters.

- B. The required Budget Forms, including Appendix K "Supplemental Funding Proposal Summary" for the Chapters' proposed expenditures, are attached as **EXHIBIT A**.
- C. DCD has prepared a comprehensive list of each Chapters' needed amount to fund its Summer 2022 Youth Employment Program, showing the total amount needed of \$4,000,000 for all 110 Chapters. EXHIBIT B.
- D. Diné Customary Law declares and teaches that: "[i]t is the right and freedom of the people that our children are provided with education to absorb wisdom, self-knowledge, and knowledge to empower them to make a living and participate in the growth of the Navajo Nation." 1 N.N.C. § 204(F).
- E. The Navajo Nation honors Diné Customary Law by assisting high school and college students with temporary employment during their summer breaks. Chapter summer youth employment programs offer these students the opportunity to gain work experience during their summer breaks, and to earn funds to pay for their school expenses.
- F. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, many Navajo Nation youth were largely unable to secure summer employment during the Summers of 2020 and 2021; therefore, this \$4,000,000 in funding is badly needed to assist them with jobs and income this Summer.
- G. The Office of the Controller was asked to provide a memorandum as required by 12 N.N.C. § 820(L). This memorandum shall be provided to the assigned Committees and the Navajo Nation Council when this legislation is up for consideration.
- H. The Office of Management and Budget was asked to provide a budget impact analysis as required by 12 N.N.C. § 20(M). This analysis shall be provided to the assigned Committees and the Navajo Nation council when this legislation is up for consideration.

SECTION THREE. ALLOCATING \$4,000,000 FROM THE UUFB TO THE DIVISION OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT FOR THE 110 CHAPTERS' SUMMER 2022 YOUTH EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM

A. The Navajo Nation hereby allocates \$4,000,000 out of the UUFB to the Division of Community Development to be used for the 110 Chapters' summer youth employment programs for 2022, as shown in the attached EXHIBIT A and EXHIBIT B.

- B. This supplemental appropriation shall be from those funds that exceed the minimum fund reserve balance in the UUFB required by 12 N.N.C. § 820(J), as determined by the Controller.
- C. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(0) the \$4,000,000 shall be deposited with each of the 110 Chapters as follows: "fifty percent (50%) of the appropriation shall be divided equally among all chapters and the remaining fifty percent (50%) shall be divided proportionately among the chapters using a percentage equal to that figure which the number of registered voters in each chapter bears to the whole of registered Navajo Nation votes as determined by the most current voter registration figures available as of the date of the appropriation." The \$4,000,000 approved herein may be used to reimburse Chapters for their verified expenditures for their Chapters' summer youth employment, which expenditures have occurred prior to the effective date of this Act going back to May 1, 2022.
- D. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(N) the amount received by each of the 110 Chapters under the overall \$4,000,000 allocation approved herein shall not lapse at the end of the fiscal year, so long as each Chapter accounts for any funds that remain after the conclusion of its Summer 2022 Youth Employment Program and then budgets such funds in the next fiscal year for its Summer 2023 Youth Employment Program.

SECTION FOUR. WAIVING 12 N.N.C. § 820(E), § 820(F), § 820(J), and § 820(L) TO ALLOW USE OF UUFB FUNDS FOR RECURRING CHAPTER EXPENSES

The Navajo Nation hereby waives 12 N.N.C. § 820(E), § 820(F), § 820(J), and § 820(L) to allow use of the UUFB for the 110 Chapters' summer youth employment programs for Summer 2022, as shown in EXHIBIT A and EXHIBIT B. These waivers are necessary because the proposed Chapter UUFB expenditures are considered recurring government expenses.

SECTION FIVE. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Act shall become effective as provided in 2 N.N.C. § 221(B) and 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(17).

SECTION SIX. SAVING CLAUSE

If any portion of this Act is determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or by a District Court of the Navajo Nation without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the remainder of this Act shall be the law of the Navajo Nation.
