TITLE OF RESOLUTION: AN ACT RELATING TO LAW AND ORDER, BUDGET AND FINANCE, NAABIK IYATI AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF ONE MILLION FOUR HUNDRED FORTY-EIGHT THOUSAND, EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-EIGHT DOLLARS (\$1,448,868.00) FOR THE ADULT DETENTION PROGRAM WITHIN THE NAVAJO DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS, DIVISION OF PUBLIC SAFETY, BUSINESS NUMBER - NEW; WAIVING 12 N.N.C. §§ 820(F) AND (L) REGARDING THE RESTRICTION OF APPROPRIATIONS OF NON-RECURRING REVENUES TO RECURRING COSTS

PURPOSE: This resolution will approve supplemental funding from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance in the amount of One Million Four Hundred Forty-Eight Thousand, Eight Hundred and Sixty-Eight Dollars (\$1,448,868.00) for the Adult Detention Program within the Navajo Department of Corrections, Division of Public Safety. Sections of law to be waived are at 12 N.N.C. §§ 820(f) and (l) (regarding the restriction of appropriations of non-recurring revenues to recurring costs).

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review each proposed resolution in detail.

24	SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY	
25	A. The Navajo Nation established the Law and Order Committee as a Navajo Nation	
26	Council standing committee and as such gave the committee oversight authority over	
27	the Navajo Nation Division of Public Safety and departments within the division,	
28	among other programs. 2 N.N.C. § 601(C)(1).	
29	B. The Navajo Nation established the Budget and Finance Committee as a Navajo	
30	Nation Council standing committee and as such empowered the committee to review	

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- and recommend to the Navajo Nation Council the management of all funds. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(9), 300 (A), 301 (B)(2).
- C. The Navajo Nation Council established the Naabik'íyáti' Committee as a Navajo Nation standing committee, and as such, proposed legislation that require final action by the Navajo Nation Council are assigned to the Naabik'íyáti' Committee. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(9) and 700 (A).
- D. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 102(A).

# SECTION TWO. TITLE 12 FINANCE ACT SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION PROCESS

- A. The Title 12 Finance Act Supplemental Appropriation requirements include:
  - Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(L), when the Controller identifies additional sources
    of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections,
    supplemental appropriations may be allocated by the Navajo Nation Council.
  - Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820 (L), "Supplemental appropriations made from non-recurring revenues shall only be made for non-recurring operations or purposes, as set forth at § 820 (F). The Controller of the Navajo Nation shall be responsible for designating recurring and non-recurring revenues and purposes."
  - Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(M), all requests for annual operating funds and supplemental funds shall be submitted to the Office of Management and Budget ("OMB") for budget impact analysis.

#### SECTION THREE. FINDINGS

A. The Navajo Department of Corrections, Division of Public Safety, requests a supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$1,448,868.00 for continued operations for the Adult Detention Program covering August 27, 2019 to December 31, 2019. Among other purposes, the appropriation will be for personnel costs, a recurring expenditure. *See* "Supplemental Funding Proposal Summary" attached hereto within **Exhibit A**.

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- B. Pursuant to the 2019 Budget Instructions Manual Section XIV (B) and (C), the requisite supplemental funding request budget forms are attached hereto as Exhibit
- C. The Office of Management and Budget has provided a Budget Impact Analysis for the supplemental funding request pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(M). See Exhibit B.
- D. The Office of the Controller has provided a memorandum dated August 3, 2019, indicating the balance in the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance as of June 30, 2019 is \$37,960,422.00. See Exhibit C. This memorandum is provided to meet the requirements of 12 N.N.C, 820 (L). The Controller of the Navajo Nation designated the funds for the Department of Corrections as a recurring cost. Id.
- E. The Navajo Nation finds it in the best interest of the Navajo Nation to approve this supplemental appropriation request. It is also in the best interest to waive the restriction of appropriations of non-recurring revenues to recurring costs as stated 12 N.N.C. §§ 820(F) and (L), and to waive 12 N.N.C. § 820(N) regarding the lapses of funds at the end of a fiscal year.
- SECTION FOUR. APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,448,868.00 FOR NAVAJO DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS, BUSINESS UNIT NUMBER - NEW
- A. This supplemental appropriation of \$1,448,868.00 shall be from that amount of funds that exceeds the minimum fund balance of the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance as determined by the Office of the Controller and to the Department of Corrections, Adult Detention Program, Business Unit Number - new.
- B. The Navajo Nation hereby approves supplemental funding from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance in the amount of \$1,448,868.00 for the Department of Corrections, Adult Detention Program, Business Unit Number - new, to fund personnel and other purposes.
- C. The supplemental funding will cover the period as described in Exhibit A. The appropriation shall not lapse at the end of fiscal year 2019.

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SECTION FIVE. WAIVING 12 N.N.C. §§ 820(F) AND (L) REGARDING THE RESTRICTION OF APPROPRIATIONS OF NON-RECURRING REVENUES TO RECURRING COSTS

The Navajo Nation Council hereby waives 12 N.N.C. §§ 820(F) and (L) with regard to the restriction of appropriations of non-recurring revenues to recurring costs.

#### SECTION SIX. EFFECTIVE DATE

The provisions of this Act shall become effective in accord with 2 N.N.C. § 221(B).

OMB is responding to your memorandum of July 18, 2019 to NDOC and your concern with NDOC making changes to the Navajo Nation Budget Forms (NNBF) after initial submission by NDOC. OMB has reviewed the subject document and has the following comments.

- NDOC originally requested appropriation of \$3,235,790 to continue operation of Adult Detention Program from August 16, 2019 to December 31, 2019. NDOC estimated existing 638 funds will be fully expended by August 26, 2019. Based on letter of July 16, 2019, BIA OJS approved transfer of \$1.6 million from P.L. 93-638 BIA Contract Juvenile Detention Program to Adult Detention Program. Therefore, the adjusted need by NDOC is \$1,635,790 (\$3,235,790 – 1,600,000).
- 2. By memorandum (memo) of July 22, 2019, NDOC has resubmitted a revised request for \$1,448,868 as two (2) modifications were issued to award additional funding by BIA NRO. In the memo NDOC provides calculation how \$1,448,868 was determined. But the numbers do not calculate to the amount being requested. Instead the calculation show \$1,012,094 which is a \$436,774 less the amount requested of \$1,448,868. Therefore, NDOC needs to show correct amount of request.
- 3. The documents resubmitted does not include NNBF 3 to support Personnel Salaries budget request which is required per FY 2019 NN Budget Instruction Manual (BIM) Appendix K - "The purpose is to provide pertinent and critical information regarding supplemental proposals for funding. This form must be completed along with standard budget forms 1 through 5 for all supplemental funding requests."
- Pursuant to the FY 2019 NN BIM Section XIII. C. b)., subject document will need to be approved by oversight committee.

- 1. The balance of the UUFB is \$37,960,422 as of June 20, 2019. Within the Three Branch Chief agreement an amount of \$21,000,000 is intended to be set aside as part of the FY 2020 comprehensive budget to address the impending FY 2021 projected General Fund Revenue decrease. Unmet needs amounts have yet to be determined but would also reduce this available amount. In addition there are requests from the UUFB for water rights and DALTC that would further reduce the amount of the UUFB.
- 2. This revised funding request is in the amount of \$1,448,868 to continue operation of the adult detention program through December 31, 2019. This request would cross multiple fiscal years. According to 12 NNC § 820, N. Appropriations Lapse "Appropriations approved by the Navajo Nation Council will lapse at the end of the fiscal year unless otherwise designated by the Navajo Nation Council.' A

provision to carryover this supplemental request would be needed to allow the appropriation to move into the new Fiscal Year.

 This request is funding for a recurring cost of personnel normally covered by contract funds.

This memorandum is written to clarify the Navajo Department of Corrections request for Undesignated Unreserved Funds (UUFB) in the amount of \$1.4 million dollars to cover the department's personnel shortfall. Our original request was for \$3,235,790 in May 01, 2019. The amount being requested changed due for the following reasons.

- 1. A modification was received on May 16, 2019 for \$67,861;
- 2. A second modification was received on June 12, 2019 in the amount of \$555,835;
- 3. A meeting was held with Charles Addington, Director, Office of Justice Services on June 26, 2019 where he made a decision to transfer funds from the Juvenile Detention Services to the adult detention services to cover a portion of the shortfall. The requested transfer between the two programs is \$1.6 million was made and currently at the BIA/OJS for a final review and contract modification.
- 4. The total of these funds will cover personnel cost through December 31, 2019.

These transactions resulted in a need for \$1,448,868 million from the UUFB to cover personnel costs from September 28, 2019 to December 31, 2019 to keep the Navajo Nation adult detention facilities in operation.

As follow-up to a June 26, 2019 meeting with Navajo Nation Tribal officials and the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) Office of Justice Services (OJS) Director, Charles Addington, we received a letter dated July 2, 2019 from Cordell Shortey. Contracting Officer at the Navajo Nation Office of Management and Budget. The letter requests a transfer of corrections operations funds in the amount of \$1.6 million from the Juvenile Detention Contract No. A18AV00236 to the Adult Detention Contract No. A18AV00235 to address a shortfall of adult detention funding for FY2019. In addition, Mr. Shortey indicates that the Nation requests a permanent reduction to the juvenile corrections funding amount through a base funding transfer between the Adult and Juvenile corrections allocations.

As discussed during the meeting, the Nation has had savings/carryover funding within the juvenile detention program for many years. This would indicate that funding needs for the juvenile detention program are less than the allocation of base funding for that program. However, in recent years, the Nation has indicated that the amount of funding needed to continue adult detention program operations for the entire fiscal (calendar) year is more than the annual allocation amount appropriated.

We fully support the Nation's request to re-program excess juvenile corrections funding to be utilized to provide adult corrections program functions; however, we regret to again inform the Nation that there are no available funding sources within BIA OJS to fund any future shortfall funding requests of either programs without a congressional funding increase. Funding appropriated annually for both adult and juvenile programs reflects the Nation's full year Secretarial amount of funding in accordance with the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act (ISDA) requirements found at Section 106(a)(1). Thus, due to a lack of increased congressional appropriations to fund BIA/tribal law enforcement and corrections programs, resources to provide tribes with additional and/or "one-time" funding needed to carry out the programs, functions, services and activities (PFSA) to operate detention programs contracted under the authority of ISDA contracts are not available.

BIA OJS does "concur with and approve" the Nation's request to transfer operations funds in the amount of \$1.6 million from the juvenile corrections allocation to the adult corrections allocation for FY2019. This approval is solely for the purpose of carrying out the contract statement of work within the fully executed Annual Funding Agreements (AFAs) of each respective ISDA contract. We want to emphasize the fact that *funding* provided through the fully executed P.L. 93-638 contract(s) must be used only to carry out "necessary, reasonable and allowable" activities that contribute to the purpose and intent of the detention PFSA of each respective contract. Further, as discussed with Director Addington, the Nation should not request additional funds for Juvenile Corrections program to off-set this permeant transfer of funds.

To execute this action for FY2019, the BIA Navajo Region Awarding Official will issue modifications to each Contract. Therefore, until you receive modifications to (1) reduce Juvenile Contract No. A18AV00236 in the amount of \$1.6 million; and (2) increase Adult Contract No. A18AV00235 in the amount of \$1.6 million, this is not officially enacted. Since the Nation has already received the full-year FY2019 funding under both contracts, the modifications are to authorize and allow an internal transfer of the funding.

Finally, BIA OJS does "concur" with the Nation's request to permanently transfer \$1.6 million from the Juvenile Corrections program allocation to the Adult Corrections program allocation through a base funding re-programming beginning in FY2020. However, in order to proceed with this action to execute a permanent base funding transfer, we request submission of an authorizing Tribal resolution to approve and authorize this request. Thus, when received, the permanent transfer of \$1.6 million reducing the juvenile corrections funding and increasing the adult corrections funding will take effect in FY2020 and nothing further will be required in future years. Please submit the authorizing resolution to this office at the address above.

Here is comments on the matter which I became aware of earlier today, was in OMB for review.

 The subject program is a multi-year P. L. 93-638 BIA contracted program. The term of the contract is for five (5) years covering Jan. 1, 2018 to Dec. 31, 2022. FY 2019, which is currently in progress, is year 2 of 5. Navajo Department of Correction (NDOC) / DPS administers the contract.

- 2. Included in the packet is a letter of May 1, 2019 from the Navajo Nation (NN) to Mr. McClure of BIA Office of Justice Services (OJS). There has been no response from Mr. McClure. The letter requests additional funding of \$3,348,076.08 for the program to cover projected expenditures from Aug 27 to Dec 31, 2019. The total FY 2019 funding allocated by BIA OJS for operation is \$4,982,708. According to NDOC, these funds are not sufficient to cover the entire year from Jan. 1 to Dec. 31, 2019, but only partial from Jan. 1 to Aug. 26, 2019.
- 3. CGS believes the reason the amount of 638 funding is not sufficient to cover full year operation is as follows. NDOC should have provided the data and information to support the requests on the changes which were implemented in the recent past. While these resulted in additional costs to the program, a corresponding increase in 638 funding by BIA OJS did not happen.
  - NDOC personnel received salary increases based on approval by the Law and Order Committee.
  - Two additional correctional facilities, Kayenta and Tuba City, which were funded by ARRA grants
    went into operation. In an audit by US DOJ OIG, the NN was mandated to ensure these are fully
    operational. This resulted in an increased number of personnel among other expenses for the two
    facilities.
- Although the NN requested funding increases for the program through the budget request process that is done 2 years prior to year in question, the amount of funding allocated for NDOC remained basically the same and has not increased.
- 5. There is a provision (limitation of cost) in the Model 108 Contract that in the event that the amount of funding allocated by the Secretary is insufficient to cover expenditures for a full Annual Funding Agreement (AFA) year, the NN can request additional funding. The letter referenced at no 2. above is that request. Also, if the NN believes the amount of funding by the Secretary is insufficient, there is the option to retrocede the contract.
- 6. There is also a provision in the Model 108 Contract and AFA that the funds allocated to the program are limited to availability of Congressional appropriation. The reference to \$4,982,708 for operation in no. 2 above is that amount.

Adult Corrections/Detention Program

Emergency fund is requested in the amount \$3,235,790 from the Undesigned, Unreserved Fund Balance (UUFB) to continue the operation of the adult detention program through. December 31, 2019. The Navajo Nation Department of Corrections will have exhausted its 2019 contract funds by August 26, 2019. NDOC will need to provide layoff notice's to all NDOC personnel on August 01, 2019 and close six (6) adult detention facilities located across the Navajo Nation.

This will have an immediate impact on services due to the effect of; laying off 140 Corrections Officers, 17 support staff, closure of 6 adult detention facilities. All arrestees and serving inmates will be released and no new arrests could be made without a place to house these individuals causing immediate an increase of criminal activity and no means of protecting the Navajo public. The department service approximately 35,307 adults per year and 500 juveniles each year. These numbers include the number of arrests made by the Navajo Police and Navajo Nation Courts sentencing individuals to serve jail time.

Several meetings were held with the Office of Management and Budget, Office of Contracts and Grants to discuss possible ways to continue operations of the adult detention program. There was a letter sent to the BIA, Office of Justice Services (OJS) on November 30, 2018 and again on May 01, 2019, requesting for additional funds (as provided for in the contract). NDOC offered options that BIA/OJS could consider keeping the adult corrections/detention facilities in operation through January 3, 2019.

The first request was denied by William McClure, Special Agent in Charge, Office of Justice Services, Albuquerque office during a telephone conference on December 3 & 4, 2018. Special Agent McClure states that the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Office of Justice Services does not have any funds to give to NDOC to carry personnel through the end of 2018. Special Agent McClure has not responded to the May 01, 2019 letter.

The closure of detention facilities across the Navajo Nation will have an immediate

impact on public safety for the Navajo people. The Navajo Police will not be able to arrest criminals due to lack of detention facilities. The courts would not be able to sentence criminals for creating chaos in communities throughout the Nation.

Section 1(b) (5), Limitation of Costs, of the subject Model 108 Contract states, "If, at any time, the Contractor has reason to believe that the total amount required for the performance of this Contract or a specific activity conducted under this Contract would be greater than the amount of funds awarded under this Contract, the Contractor shall provide reasonable notice to the appropriate Secretary". Accordingly not only is the Navajo Nation (Nation) informing you the total FY 2019 funds allocated is insufficient to fully fund the Program for the calendar year 2019 but requesting additional funds herein.

The total funds allocated on CY 2019 AFA for the Program is \$5,204,511. Of this, \$221,833 is for Facility Operation and Maintenance and \$4,982,708 Tribal Priority Allocation (TPA) funds for operation. The TPA amount was budgeted for salary for one hundred fifty-three (153) personnel, fringe benefits and insurance premiums covering January 1 to August 26, 2019. The personnel are in the six (6) districts that provide direct Adult Detention Services on the Nation. Since the opening of the Tuba City and Kayenta correctional facilities, the population of inmates and costs of direct services at these two districts have increased. The cost increases are for personnel, food, hygiene supplies and clothing for inmates, and wear and tear of vehicles.

In order to continue Adult Detention Service operations at all six districts from August 27 to December 31, 2019, additional funding of \$3,348,076.08 is required, see worksheet.

#### Gentlemen:

Pursuant to the Section B(5) of the Navajo Nation's (Nation) subject contract with the BIA, be informed of the impending depletion of contract funding prior to the end of calendar year (CY) 2018 on December 31, 2018. Therefore, we are requesting you allocate additional funding of \$673,740 to continue services and finish out CY 2018. Attached as Exhibit "A" is a summary of the budget available on FY 2018 funds allocated and the additional need for the remainder of CY 2018.

Under the subject Contract, which covers Jan 1, 2018 to Dec 31, 2022, the Nation was allocated \$5,549,722 for administration in CY 2018. As of November 28, 2018, there is a balance of \$745,182.02. As shown on Rows 8 – 10 on the attached, based on average payroll per pay period ending (PPE) of \$210,900, the budget balance is sufficient for personnel salaries, fringe benefits and related expenses for PPEs November 23 and December 07, 2018. Beyond that there will be insufficient funds for the last two PPEs in CY 2018 as shown on Rows 17 – 19. Also budget for holiday pay / overtime and operating expenses is included on Row 20 - 21.

Currently, the Adult Detention Service has 147 personnel who serve six districts on the Nation. The personnel provide direct support services to all individuals who require detention placement services within the jurisdiction of the Nation and to protect the lives and property of persons visiting or residing within the boundaries of the Nation. The request for additional funds is to cover this.

At this time, the options available to Navajo Department of Correction (NDOC) who administers the said Contract on the matter are:

- As requested herein, BIA allocate additional funds to the Contract to continue services through the end of the CY 2018
- Cost share with the current Juvenile Detention contract for Districts with that have Juvenile Facilities.
- Discontinue Adult Detention Services from December 8 31, 2018 and release all inmates and 147 employees during that time period.

Additional funds allocated to the Contract will alleviate options 2 and 3 and NDOC will be able to continue services without interruption.

Dear President Begaye

The Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) Office of Justice Services (OJS) received your letter dated November 30, 2018 requesting additional funding to continue the provision of Adult Corrections program services for the remainder of calendar year 2018, and to avoid the release of all inmates and the furlough of 147 Navajo Nation employees.

In the letter, you indicated that the Nation has three (3) options available to address the immediate funding issue with which you are faced. The first option is for BIA OJS to allocate additional funding to the Nation in the amount of \$673,740 to increase the contract by the amount that will allow continued operation of Adult Corrections services. Unfortunately, the full-year base funding appropriation for the Nation's FY2018 Adult Corrections program has already been allocated and awarded under Contract No. A18AV00235. Thus, we regret to inform the Tribe that there are no available resources within BIA OJS to provide additional 106(a)(1) [ISDA] funding.

The second proposed option is to cost share expenditures with the Juvenile Corrections program funded through a P.L. 93-638 self-determination Contract No. A18AV00236. The third proposed option is for the Nation to "discontinue Adult Detention services from December 8 – 31, 2018 and release all inmates and 147 employees during that time."

Following receipt of your letter, we contacted the Nation to further discuss the options proposed in the letter, and assisted with identifying the cause of this sudden lack of funding. On December 6, 2018, we met with Tribal officials, public safety officials and personnel from the Nation's Office of Management and Budget and requested various forms of contract expenditure documentation to identify any available cost savings. During the meeting, we learned that the probable cause may be the result of salary increases granted to employees that are not sustainable without an increase to the base funding appropriations for this contract unless the number of employees is reduced.

The Nation provided financial reports and supporting documentation that verify that there will be a substantial amount of cost savings within the Juvenile Corrections Contract No. A18AV00236 at year end, December 31, 2018. Further, the Nation assured BIA OJS officials that if allowed to utilize Juvenile Corrections funding to meet the shortfall and fund the Adult Corrections program operations costs through December 31, 2018, it will not negatively affect the ability of the Nation to carry out the provision of Juvenile Corrections services under the self-determination contract.

During the meeting, we were notified that the Nation has taken necessary action to approve Tribal general funding to be used to fund this program in order to ensure that there will not be a shutdown of the Adult Corrections facility and to allow continued operation of program services under the contract. We were informed this action was taken to allow BIA OJS to respond to the notification letter and that, by doing so, it does not eliminate the Nation's request for additional funding or the possibility of exercising proposed option number two.

Given the circumstances, the discussions we have had with the Nation on this issue, and in order to support continued operation of both the Adult and Juvenile corrections programs, BIA OJS gives the Navajo Nation approval to utilize up to \$673,740 of FY2018 cost savings funding within the Juvenile Corrections Contract No. A18AV00236 for allowable Adult Corrections program expenditures under Contract No. A18AV00235 for the remainder of the calendar year 2018 funding period (through December 31, 2018). In order to accomplish this, you will need to work with the BIA Awarding Official at Navajo Region to execute the proper contract award documents to carry this out.

BIA OJS will conduct a complete and thorough review of all of the expenditure documentation provided to us during the meeting and set up a follow-up meeting to discuss options and work with the Tribe to identify proactive solutions that will work towards preventing similar situations from occurring in the future.
