21	A. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation, pursuant to 2

- F. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(L), the Navajo Nation Council may adopt and approve supplemental appropriations to the Annual Comprehensive Budget during the fiscal year. Supplemental appropriations of General Funds within the current fiscal year are permitted, (1) if and when additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections are projected and which are also in excess of the reserve amount set for in § 820(J) or (2) when the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund balance is in excess of the reserve amount set forth at § 820(J); and
- G. The Navajo Nation finds it in the best interest to approve Supplemental Appropriation for a powerline extension for four relocation households in the Navajo Partition Land area of Forest Lake Chapter Community.

SECTION 2. APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$132,412.87 FOR A POWERLINE EXTENSION

- A. The Navajo Nation Council, having received certification by the Office of the Controller, attached as Exhibit B, of the availability of certain funds from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance (UUFB) for supplemental appropriation hereby approves the supplemental appropriation of \$132,412.87 for a powerline extension to four relocation households in the Navajo Partition Land Area of Forest Lake Chapter Community, as further described in budget documents attached as Exhibit A. See also Resident Relocation Powerline Extension Amendment Proposal attached as Exhibit C.
- B. This supplemental appropriation of \$132,412.87 shall be to a new Business Unit Number and from that amount of funds that exceed the minimum fund balance of the UUFB.

BACKGROUND

Source: Feabody Western Coal Co.

The Navajo Nation's Forest Lake Chapter is located on top of Black Mesa in the mid, north central part of the Navajo Reservation in Arizona. Located within Navajo County, the Western Agency chapter has a population of 471 according to the 2010 Census. Forest Lake Chapter is unique because of its isolated location. The chapter is also located on/near the Peabody Western Coal Co., (PWCC) Lease area. The PWCC complex leasehold is 100-square miles and is made up of 5 impacted chapters, (Kayenta, Forest Lake, Shonto, Black Mesa and Chilchinbeto). Local area residents live within the lease area that is located in or near the major coal resource areas. The residents for this powerline extension project live in the Navajo Partitioned Land area.

Peabody Western Coal Company (PWCC) operates the Kayenta and former Black Mesa surface coal mines on Black Mesa, a large upland located on the Navajo and Hopi Indian Reservations in northeastern Arizona. The mines are located approximately 160 miles northeast of Flagstaff, Arizona and 26 miles southwest of Kayenta, Arizona. Access is by U.S. Highway 160 and then south on Navajo Route 41 from Black Mesa Junction. The mines are operated under the terms and conditions of leases with the Navajo and Hopi Tribe, and mining and reclamation permits issued by the Office of Surface Mining Reclamation and Enforcement (OSM), United States Environmental Protection Agency Region IX (USEPA), Navajo Nation EPA (NNEPA), and Hopi Tribe.

POWERLINE EXTENSION PROJECT

This project aims to complete a powerline extension for 5 families located within the Forest Lake Chapter. There are 3 sections to Peabody's relocation project. Peabody has agreed to cover the cost for 2 of the 3 project locations. One project location is within the PWCC lease and the other location is in Kayenta. The Off-site lease relocatee homes are near completion and ready for the power line extension. We have been working with Peabody Western Coal Company and the residents for the completion of the relocation process. The Homesite Leases have been approved by the Navajo Land Department and are awaiting finalization from BIA Land Realty Office. The NTUA cost estimates are attached for review.

CHAPTER RESOLUTION

The Forest Lake Chapter has passed several resolutions to indicate its support for the powerline extension project and to meet the needs of NTUA's requirements.



14. REPORT /X/ OR SUMMARY (REPORT ATTACHED) OR PRELIMINARY REPORT




Figure 1. Specific Project Location of NNAD 15-044. A Cultural Resources Inventory of a Proposed Powerline Extension for (4) Homesite Lease Locations on Black Mesa near Forest Lake. Navajo County. Arizona. USGS 7.5° map is Yucca Hill. Arizona 1968.

- A. **Description of Undertaking:** The lead federal agency for this project is the Bureau of Indian Affairs. The Navajo Tribal Utility Authority (NTUA) proposes to extend powerline utility service to four individual homesite lease areas that were previously surveyed for archaeological inventory. Both surface and subsurface disturbances will be extensive at each pole placement location within the Right-of-way (ROW), resulting from construction of the powerline. The entire length of the proposed powerline for the four homesite leases measures approximately 3.745.9 ft (1.141.7 m). For this project the area of potential effect is approximately 2.57 ac 1.04 ha. Please see Figure 1 for specific USGS map location of project area.
- B. Existing Data Review: A check of Navajo Nation Historic Preservation Department archival records indicates that two archaeological projects, HPD 94-645 and HPD 07-437, with no recorded archaeological sites, have been conducted within a 328 ft (100 m) of the project area. In addition, a TCP database check at the NNHPD revealed that there are no TCPs located in the vicinity of the project area. See the attached "Traditional Cultural Property (TCP) Record Search Verification Form."
- Area Environmental & Cultural Setting: The project area along a valley with surrounding heavily wooded hillside ridges between Black Mesa and Forest Lake, approximately 8 mi (12.8 km) north of the Forest Lake Chapter. The nearest water source is Dinnebito Wash located approximately .40 mi (.64 km) to the west of the project area. The elevation in the area is 6,849 ft (2,087 m). Vegetation includes pinon, juniper, sage, cliff rose, snakeweed, and various low grasses. The cultural setting is rural with surrounding multiple scattered nearby homesteads. Causes of disturbance include vehicular traffic, livestock grazing/trampling, nearby homesteads, and natural erosional activity.
- D. Field Methods: The archaeological survey inventory was conducted by Harriett K. Sandoval: and interviews regarding Traditional Cultural Properties (TCP) were previously conducted on a prior survey with the local residents. No TCPs and no burials were located within the vicinity of the project area. The Navajo Tribal Utility Authority (NTUA) requires a 30 ft (9 m) ROW for construction of powerlines, and NNAD routinely adds an additional 35 ft (10.6 m) buffer zone on each side of the ROW for a total survey width of 100 ft (30 m). Each of the proposed centerlines was staked prior to the survey and NNAD was provided preliminary maps. A Class III pedestrian survey was conducted by walking parallel transects spaced no more than 50 ft (15 m) apart on both sides of the centerline for the proposed utility line extensions providing 100% survey coverage of the area (see Table 1 for UTM Coordinates). The powerline extensions will extend off from a nearby existing main line that runs in a east-west direction where Beginning-of-Power (BOP) will occur, then extend southwards towards the homesite lease locations. The End-of-Power (EOP) will end within the general vicinity of the proposed home structures. For this project, the proposed measurement of the combined length of the NTUA powerline for all four homesite lease areas is

approximately 3,745.9 ft (1.141.7 m). The area of potential effect for this project is approximately 112.377 sq ft (10,440.2 sq m) or 2.57 ac/1.04 ha; and the total area surveyed equals approximately 374,590 sq ft (34,800.6 sq m) 8.5 ac/3.48 ha.

15. CULTURAL RESOURCE FINDINGS:

- A. Location/Identification of Each Resource: Two Isolated Occurrences (IOs) were encountered on the Alice Yazzie powerline north of the drainage. The UTM Coordinates for the IO are listed in Table 2. No other cultural resources were encountered during the survey.
- B. Evaluation of Significance of Each Resource: The IOs are not eligible for nomination to the National Register of Historic Places, nor should they be protected under the Archaeological Resources Protection Act. The IOs do not warrant consideration under the American Indian Religious Freedom Act, nor are they associated with known graves or grave goods; thus, the Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act does not apply.

16. MANAGEMENT SUMMARY (RECOMMENDATION): For this project, a determination of "no historic properties affected" is recommended for the proposed undertaking, and we further recommend that the client be allowed to proceed with construction as planned.



- A. Description of Undertaking: The client proposes to construct a house with associated utility facilities within a one acre homesite lease area and an access road leading to the homesite location. Both surface and subsurface ground disturbance activities will be intensive and extensive. The area of potential effect for the homesite is approximately 1 ac/40 ha; and area of effect for the access road is 0.21 ac/0.08 ha.
- B. Existing Data Review: A check of Navajo Nation Historic Preservation Department (NNHPD) archival records reports indicate that no archaeological projects have been conducted within a 328 ft (100 m) radius of the project area. A TCP database check at the NNHPD revealed that there are no TCPs located in the vicinity of the project area. See the attached "Traditional Cultural Property (TCP) Record Search Verification Form."
- C. Area Environmental & Cultural Setting: The project is located within Forest Lake Chapter, which is located approximately 6.5 mi (10.4 km) south of the project area. The nearest water source is Dinnebito Wash located approximately .58 mi (.92 km) to the northwest of the project area. The elevation of the area is 6,787 ft (2,069 m). Vegetation includes pinon, juniper, sage, snakeweed, Russian thistle, and various grasses. The cultural setting is rural, with surrounding multiple scattered homesteads, rolling hills of bed rock, and colian sand dunes.




Figure 1. Specific Project Location of NNAD 14-080: A Cultural Resources Inventory of a Proposed One Acre Homesite for Leo C. Begay on Black Mesa, Navajo County, Arizona. USGS 7.5' map is Yucca Hill, Arizona 1968.



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

Joint Tenancy with right of Survivorship: is held by two or more persons jointly, with equal rights to possession and enjoyment during their lives. It is distinguished from other forms of cotenancy by the right of survivorship. Under the doctrine of survivorship, the entire estate, upon the death of one of the joint tenants, goes to the survivor, (or, in the case of more than two joint tenants, to the survivors, and so on to the last survivor); the estate of the deceased joint tenant has no interest, and because there is no interest for a testamentary will to transmit, a joint tenancy may not devise his or her interest in the joint tenancy.

In community property jurisdictions, including the Navajo Nation, it is possible for spouses to hold property in joint tenancy, but such property is separate and not subject to the court's distribution upon divorce, nor is it subject to probate upon the death of one spouse.

Absence of a valid contrary contractual agreement among or between the joint tenants, each joint tenant may unilaterally sever the joint tenancy by conveying or encumbering his/her fractional interest. The grantee then becomes a tenant in common (see below) with other joint tenant or tenants and the right of survivorship is destroyed. The fractional interest of each joint tenant can also be taken in satisfaction of debts; such taking severs the joint tenancy. NO PROBATE REQUIRED, HOMESITE GOES TO SURVIVING PERSON.

Tenancy in Common: is identical to a joint tenancy in all but one significant attribute - it lacks the right of survivorship. When a cotenant in common dies, the surviving cotenant(s) does not succeed to the decedent's interest. Rather, the decedent's fractional interest in the property must be probated. - A. Description of Undertaking: The client proposes to construct a house with associated utility facilities within a one acre homesite lease area and an access road leading to the homesite location. Both surface and subsurface ground disturbance activities will be intensive and extensive. The area of potential effect for the homesite is approximately 1 ac. 40 ha; and area of effect for the access road is 0.21 ac/0.08 ha.
- B. Existing Data Review: A check of Navajo Nation Historic Preservation Department (NNHPD) archival records reports indicate that no archaeological projects have been conducted within a 328 ft (100 m) radius of the project area. A TCP database check at the NNHPD revealed that there are no TCPs located in the vicinity of the project area. See the attached "Traditional Cultural Property (TCP) Record Search Verification Form."
- C. Area Environmental & Cultural Setting: The project is located within Forest Lake Chapter, which is located approximately 6.5 mi (10.4 km) south of the project area. The nearest water source is Dinnebito Wash located approximately .58 mi (.92 km) to the northwest of the project area. The elevation of the area is 6,991 ft (2,131 m). Vegetation includes pinon, juniper, sage, snakeweed, Russian thistle, and various grasses. The cultural setting is rural, with surrounding multiple scattered homesteads, rolling hills of bed rock, and eolian sand dunes.
- D. Field Methods: Harriett K. Sandoval, Senior Archaeologist, conducted a Traditional Cultural Properties (TCP) Interview with the client's mother, Alice Begay. Mrs. Begay stated there are no TCPs and no burials in the vicinity of the project area for the homesite lease location. A Class III pedestrian survey was conducted by walking concentric transects spaced 15 m (45 ft) apart for a 200 ft (61 m) radius around the homesite area, and parallel transects for the 309 ft (94 m) access road with a survey width of 100 ft (30 m). The area of effect for the homesite measures approximately 43,560 sq ft (4,046 sq m) or 1 ac/.40 ha, which is to be positioned within the 200 ft radius, since there was no legal land/tract description at time of survey; and the area surveyed is approximately 125,664 sq ft (11,674 sq m) or 2.88 ac (1.17 ha). For the access road, the area of effect is 9,270 sq ft (861 sq m) or 0.21 ac/0.08 ha, and the area surveyed is approximately 30,900 sq ft (2,870 sq m) or 0.71 ac/0.28 ha. The total area surveyed for this project is approximately 156,564 sq ft (14,545 sq m) or 3.59 ac/1,45 ha.

15. CULTURAL RESOURCE FINDINGS:

- A. Location/Identification of Each Resource: Site A2-J-38-24 consisting of a historic collapsed Navajo hogan measuring approximately 3.5 m in diameter was identified and recorded. According to Lena Begay (sister), the structure once belonged to her paternal great-grandmother. The structure is located along the inner edge of the ESE of the 200 A radius.
- B. Evaluation of Significance of Each Resource: Site AZ-J-38-24 is eligible for nomination to the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP) as It meets the 50 year guideline and Criterion D. The site does not merit protection under the Archaeological Resources Protection Act (ARPA) because it is unknown if it meets the 100 year guideline or not. The site also does not warrant consideration under the American Indian Religious Freedom Act (AIRFA), nor is it associated with human remains or known graves or grave goods, thus, the Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act (NAGPRA) does not apply.




Figure 1. Specific Project Location of Site AZ-J-38-24 Recorded During NNAD 14-078: A Cultural Resources Inventory of a Proposed One Acre Homesite for Phillip C. Begay and Theresa Rose Begay on Black Mesa, Navajo Connty, Arizona. USGS 7.5' map is Yucca Hill, Arizona 1968.




Figure 1. Specific Project Location of NNAD 14-079: A Cultural Resources Inventory of a Proposed One Acre Homesite for Martha Begay on Black Mesa, Navajo County, Arizona. USGS 7.5' map is Yucca Hill, Arizona 1968.



Part 162, and all amendments or successors thereto, which by this reference are made a part hereof. In the event this Lease is held by two or more persons, it shall be held in the following tenure:

Joint Tenancy with right of survivorship WITNESSETH:

- 1. **DEFINITIONS.** (A) "Secretary" means the Secretary of the Interior or his duly authorized representative or successor.
- (B) "Approved Encumbrance" means an encumbrance approved in writing by the Secretary and Lessor. "Encumbrancer" means the owner and holder of an Approved Encumbrance, or either of them.
- 2. **LEASED PREMISES.** For and in consideration of the rents, covenants, agreements, terms and conditions contained herein, Lessor hereby leases to Lessee all that tract or parcel of land situated within the **Forest Lake** Chapter of the Navajo Nation, (County of **Navajo**, State of **Arizona**) which is more particularly described in Exhibit "A," attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof, containing approximately **1.00** acre(s), more or less, subject to any prior, valid existing rights-of-way. There is hereby reserved and excepted from the leased premises rights-of-way for utilities constructed by or on authority of Lessor.
- 3. **USE OF LEASED PREMISES.** (A) Lessee shall develop, use and occupy the leased premises for residential purposes only and said premises shall not be used for any other purpose. Lessee may construct, improve and maintain a dwelling and related structures on the leased premises and may otherwise develop, use or occupy said premises for residential purposes only.

- (B) Lessee agrees not to use or cause to be used any part of the leased premises for any unlawful conduct or purpose.
- 4. **TERM.** Lessee shall have and hold the leased premises for a term of sixty-five (65) years, beginning on the date of approval of this Lease by the Secretary. This Lease may be renewed for an additional term of up to twenty-five (25) years, provided that this Lease is in good standing. Lessee shall give written notice of intent to renew this Lease to the Director of the Navajo Land Department, or its successor, at least six (6) months, but no more than twelve (12) months, prior to the expiration date of this Lease. Renewal of this Lease is subject to the approval of Lessor and the Secretary and to the provisions of Navajo Nation law and the regulations contained at 25 C.F.R. Part 162, including all amendments and successors thereto.
- 5. **RENT.** (A) In consideration of the foregoing and the terms and conditions of this Lease, Lessee hereby covenants and agrees to pay Lessor, in lawful money of the United States, an annual rental of One Dollar (\$1.00). In accordance with 25 C.F.R. §162.5(b)(2), only nominal rental is provided for herein because this Lease is for homesite purposes to a Tribal member and the leased premises are not commercial or industrial in character. Lessee agrees that there shall be no adjustment of the rental required herein in the event that this Lease is terminated before its term otherwise would expire or in the event that any part of the leased premises is taken under the laws of eminent domain.
- (B) Rental payments are due and payable on or before the effective date of this Lease and thereafter on or before each anniversary date of this Lease. Lessee may pay the total amount due at any time prior to the expiration of this Lease. Rental payments shall be made by check or money order made out to the Navajo Nation, and shall be paid at the local Navajo Land Department Homesite Section Office, or at such other location as Lessor hereafter may designate in writing. Failure to make rental payments when due shall constitute a default under this Lease.
- (C) While the leased premises are in trust or restricted status, the Secretary in his discretion may suspend the direct rental payment provisions of this Lease, in which event the rental payments provided for herein shall be paid directly to the Secretary. Lessor, Lessee and an Encumbrancer, if any, shall be notified of any such change in the direct rental provisions of this Lease.

6. DEVELOPMENT OF LEASED PREMISES; IMPROVEMENTS.

(A) Lessee shall develop the leased premises within two (2) years of the effective date of this Lease. Prior to the expiration of said period, Lessee may request in writing from Lessor an extension of the development period for a period not to exceed two (2) additional years. Lessor shall not unreasonably withhold approval of such request. Failure to develop the leased premises in accordance with this provision shall constitute a default under this Lease.

- (B) All buildings and other improvements now existing, or hereafter constructed on the premises, shall be the leasehold property of Lessee during the term of this Lease, including any renewal thereof.
- (C) Lessee is hereby specifically authorized to enter into appropriate service line agreements with utility companies for the provision of utility services to the leased premises, including gas, water, sewer, electricity, telephone, television and other utilities, without further consent by Lessor, on the condition that:
 - (1) such agreements are for the sole purpose of supplying utility services to the leased premises;
 - (2) such agreements authorize utility service lines only within the leased premises;
 - (3) such agreements do not extend beyond the term of this Lease, including any extensions thereof;
 - (4) executed copies of such agreements, together with plats or diagrams showing with particularity the location, size and extent of such service lines, are filed by the utility companies with the Lessor and with the Secretary within thirty (30) days of their execution; and
 - (5) such agreements are otherwise in accordance with the provisions of 25 C.F.R. §169.22, including any amendments or successors thereto.

Nothing contained herein shall be construed to limit the right of Lessor to enter into service line agreements with utility companies for service lines across the leased premises, nor otherwise to affect the rights-of-way reserved to Lessor in Section 2 of this Lease.

- 7. **DELIVERY OF PREMISES; CUSTOMARY USE RIGHTS.** (A) Subject to the provisions of subsection (B) below, upon expiration or termination of this Lease, Lessee shall peaceably and without legal process deliver up possession of the leased premises to Lessor, including all improvements thereon, in good condition, usual wear and tear excepted.
- (B) In the event that Lessee holds customary use rights to the leased premises under the laws and customs of the Navajo Nation at the beginning date of this Lease, and has not otherwise transferred, surrendered, or abandoned such customary use rights during the term of this Lease, then upon the expiration or termination of this Lease, Lessee shall be entitled to possession of the leased premises, including all improvements thereon, in accordance with the laws and customs of the Navajo Nation.

- 8. **INHERITANCE.** This Lease may be transferred by will or by intestate succession in accordance with the laws and customs of the Navajo Nation, including all amendments and successors thereto.
- 9. **ASSIGNMENT.** This Lease may be assigned with the prior written approval of Lessor and the Secretary, subject to the laws of the United States and the Navajo Nation, including all amendments and successors thereto. No assignment of this Lease or any interest therein shall be valid and binding without such prior written approval. In the event this Lease or any interest therein is mortgaged or pledged as security for a loan, approval of any subsequent assignment shall be required by the lender, sureties, and loan guarantors, if any.
- 10. **ENCUMBRANCE.** (A) This Lease or any interest therein may not be encumbered without the prior written approval of Lessor and the Secretary, and no such encumbrance shall be valid without said prior approval. An Approved Encumbrance must be confined to the leasehold interest of Lessee, and shall not jeopardize in any way Lessor's interest in the land. Lessee agrees to furnish any requested financial statements or analyses pertinent to the proposed encumbrance that Lessor and the Secretary may deem necessary to justify the amount, purpose and terms of said proposed encumbrance.
- (B) In the event of default by Lessee of the terms of an Approved Encumbrance, Encumbrancer may exercise any rights provided in such Approved Encumbrance, provided that prior to any sale of the leasehold, Encumbrancer shall give to Lessor and the Secretary written notice of the same duration as is required to be given to Lessee by the terms of such Approved Encumbrance and by applicable law. In the event of such default, Lessor shall have the following rights which may be exercised at any time prior to the completion of sale:
 - (1) To pay to Encumbrancer any and all amounts secured by the Approved Encumbrance, plus unpaid interest accrued to the date of such payment, plus expenses of sale incurred to the date of such payment.
 - (2) To assume the obligation secured by the Approved Encumbrance, including unpaid interest accrued to the date of such assumption plus expenses of sale incurred to the date of such assumption.
 - (3) To execute in favor of Encumbrancer a promissory note and a new encumbrance, which new encumbrance must be approved by the Secretary, for any and all amounts secured by the Approved Encumbrance, plus unpaid interest accrued to the date of such execution, plus expenses of sale incurred to the date of such execution, upon the same terms and conditions as originally

provided by the Approved Encumbrance, or upon such other terms and conditions as Lessor and the lender may agree, and paying to Encumbrancer the proceeds of the loan evidenced by such promissory note, and delivering to Encumbrancer a policy of title insurance in the face amount of such promissory note, issued by a reputable title insurance company acceptable to Encumbrancer, and insuring that the new encumbrance is a first lien upon the property described in this Lease, subject only to current taxes and to conditions, restrictions and reservations of record which are acceptable to Encumbrancer at the time of recording the new encumbrance.

- (C) If Lessor exercises any of the above rights, all right, title and interest of Lessee in this Lease shall terminate and Lessor shall acquire this Lease; provided, however, that such termination shall not relieve Lessee of any obligation or liability which shall have accrued prior to the date of termination. Acquisition of this Lease by Lessor under these circumstances shall not serve to extinguish this Lease by merger or otherwise.
- If Lessor declines to exercise any of the above rights and sale of the leasehold under the Approved Encumbrance shall occur, the purchaser at such sale shall succeed to all of the right, title and interest of Lessee in this Lease. It is further agreed that if the purchaser at such sale is Encumbrancer or an agency of the United States which makes, insures or guarantees either the loan secured by the Approved Encumbrance or the Approved Encumbrance ("Federal Agency"), Encumbrancer or Federal Agency may sell and assign this Lease without any further approval by Lessor and the Secretary, provided that the assignee shall agree in writing to be bound by all the terms and conditions of this Lease. During such period of time Encumbrancer or Federal Agency retains title thereto, it may sublease the property for periods not to exceed one year in accordance with terms of the mortgage, notwithstanding any contrary provision contained within the Lease. If Encumbrancer or Federal Agency is the purchaser, it shall be required to perform the obligations of this Lease only so long as it retains title thereto. If the purchaser is other than Encumbrancer or Federal Agency, written approval by Lessor and the Secretary of any assignment shall be required and said purchaser shall agree in writing to be bound by all the terms and conditions of this Lease.
- 11. **DEFAULT.** (A) Time is declared to be of the essence in this Lease. Should Lessee default in any payment of monies when due under this Lease or be in violation of any other provision of this Lease, said violation may be acted upon by the Secretary in accordance with 25 C.F.R. Part 162, or any amendments or successors thereto.
- (B) In addition to the rights and remedies provided by the aforementioned regulations, Lessor and the Secretary, either jointly or severally, may exercise the following options upon Lessee's default, subject to the provisions of subsection (D) below and subject to applicable law:

- (1) Enforce, by suit or otherwise, Lessee's compliance with all terms of this Lease; or
- Re-enter the leased premises, if Lessee has abandoned the premises or has otherwise failed to use the leased premises for residential purposes, and remove all persons and property therefrom, and re-let the premises without terminating this Lease as the agent and for the account of Lessee, but without prejudice to the right to terminate the Lease thereafter, and without invalidating any right of Lessor or the Secretary, or Encumbrancer, if any, or any obligations of Lessee hereunder. The terms and conditions of such re-letting shall be in the sole discretion of Lessor, who shall have the right to alter and repair the premises as it deems advisable and to-re-let with or without any equipment or fixtures situated thereon. Rents from any such re-letting shall be applied first to the expense of re-letting, collection, altering and repairing, including reasonable attorney's fees and any reasonable real estate commission actually paid, insurance, taxes and assessments and thereafter toward payment to liquidate the total liability of Lessee. Lessee shall pay to Lessor monthly when due, any deficiency and Lessor or the Secretary may sue thereafter as each monthly deficiency shall arise; or
- (3) Take any other action authorized or allowed under applicable law.
- (C) No waiver of a breach of any of the terms and conditions of this Lease shall be construed to be a waiver of any succeeding breach of the same or any other term or condition of this Lease. Exercise of any of the remedies herein shall not exclude recourse to any other remedies, by suit or otherwise, which may be exercised by Lessor or the Secretary, or any other rights or remedies now held or which may be held by Lessor in the future.
- (D) Lessor and the Secretary, as the case may be, shall give to an Encumbrancer a copy of each notice of default by Lessee at the same time as such notice of default shall be given to Lessee. Lessor and the Secretary shall accept performance by an Encumbrancer of any of Lessee's obligations under this Lease, with the same force and effect as though performed by Lessee. An Encumbrancer shall have standing to pursue any appeals permitted by applicable federal or Navajo Nation law that Lessee would be entitled to pursue. Neither Lessor nor the Secretary shall terminate this Lease if an Encumbrancer has cured or is taking action diligently to cure Lessee's default or has commenced and is pursuing diligently either a foreclosure action or an assignment in lieu of foreclosure, or has assigned, filed and is diligently pursuing a claim under a guarantee of an approved encumbrance by Federal Agency.

- 12. **SANITATION.** Lessee hereby agrees to comply with all applicable sanitation laws, regulations or other requirements of the United States and the Navajo Nation. Lessee agrees to dispose of all solid waste in compliance with applicable federal and Navajo Nation law either in an approved sanitary landfill or transfer station, or with a commercial sanitary collection service. Lessee further agrees at all times to maintain the entire leased premises in a safe and sanitary condition, presenting a good appearance both inside and outside the leased premises.
- 13. **HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES.** Lessee shall not cause or permit any hazardous substance to be used, stored, generated or disposed of on or in the leased premises without the prior written approval of Lessor, which approval may be given, given upon conditions, or denied in the sole discretion of Lessor and Encumbrancer, if any, respectively; provided, that Lessee may use or store or permit to be used on or in the leased premises small amounts of hazardous substances that generally are recognized to be appropriate to normal residential uses and to maintenance of the leased premises.
- 14. **TERMINATION OF FEDERAL SUPERVISION.** Nothing contained in this Lease shall operate to delay or prevent a termination of federal responsibilities with respect to the leased premises by the issuance of a fee patent, or otherwise, during the term of this Lease, however, such termination shall not serve to abrogate this Lease. Lessor and Lessee and an Approved Encumbrancer, if any, shall be notified of any such change in the status of the leased premises.
- 15. **INTEREST OF MEMBER OF CONGRESS.** No member of or delegate to Congress or any Resident Commissioner shall be admitted to any share or part of this Lease or to any benefit that may arise herefrom.
- 16. **OBLIGATIONS TO THE UNITED STATES.** It is understood and agreed that while the leased premises are in trust or restricted status, all of Lessee's obligations under this Lease are to the United States as well as to Lessor.
- 17. **EMINENT DOMAIN.** If the leased premises or any part thereof is taken under the laws of eminent domain at any time during the term of this Lease, Lessee's interest in the leased premises or the part of the leased premises taken shall thereupon cease. Compensation awarded for the taking of the leased premises or any part thereof, including any improvements located thereon, shall be awarded to Lessor and Lessee as their respective interests may appear at the time of such taking, provided that Lessee's right to such awards shall be subject to the rights of an Encumbrance under an Approved Encumbrance.

- 18. **MINERALS.** All minerals, including sand and gravel, contained in or on the leased premises are reserved for the use of Lessor. Lessor also reserves the right to enter upon the leased premises and search for and remove minerals located on the property, paying just compensation for any damage or injury caused to Lessee's personal property or improvements constructed by Lessee.
- 19. **GOVERNING LAW AND CHOICE OF FORUM.** Except as may be prohibited by applicable federal law, the law of the Navajo Nation shall govern the construction, performance and enforcement of this Lease. Any action or proceeding brought by Lessee against the Navajo Nation in connection with or arising out of the terms and conditions of this Lease shall be brought only in the Courts of the Navajo Nation, and no such action or proceeding shall be brought by Lessee against the Navajo Nation in any court of any state.
- CONSENT TO JURISDICTION; COVENANT NOT TO CONTEST JURISDICTION. Lessee hereby consents to the jurisdiction of the Navajo Nation, including its legislative, judicial and regulatory jurisdiction, including but not limited to jurisdiction to levy fines and to enter judgments for compensatory and punitive damages and injunctive relief, in connection with all activities conducted by Lessee in the Navajo Nation of which have a proximate legal effect on persons or property within the Navajo Nation. Lessee hereby covenants and agrees never to contest or challenge the legislative, executive or judicial jurisdiction of the Navajo Nation on the basis that such jurisdiction is inconsistent with the status of the Navajo Nation as an Indian nation, or that the Navajo Nation government is not a government of general jurisdiction, or that the Navajo Nation government does not possess full police power (i.e., the power to legislate and regulate for the general health and welfare) over all lands, persons and activities within its territorial boundaries, or on any other basis not generally applicable to a similar challenge to the jurisdiction of a state government. Nothing in this Section shall be construed to negate or impair federal responsibilities with respect to the leased premises or to the Navajo Nation.
- 21. **NO WAIVER OF SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY.** Nothing in this Lease shall be interpreted as constituting a waiver, express or implied, of the sovereign immunity of the Navajo Nation.
- 22. **SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS.** The terms and conditions contained herein shall extend to and be binding upon the successors, heirs, assigns, executors, administrators and agents, including all contractors and subcontractors, of Lessee. Except as the context otherwise requires, the term "Lessee," as used in this Lease, shall be deemed to include all such successors, heirs, assigns, executors, administrators and agents.
- 23. **NOTICES.** All notices, payments and demands shall be in writing, and shall be sent to the parties hereto at the respective addresses herein recited or to such other addresses as the parties may hereafter designate in writing. Copies of all notices and demands shall be sent to the Secretary.

This lease shall take effect on the date of approval of this Lease EFFECTIVE DATE. by the Secretary.





Figure 1. Specific Project Location of NNAD 12-079: A Cultural Resources Inventory of a One Acre Homesite for Alice Rose Yazzie in Forest Lake, Navajo County, Arizona. USGS 7.5' map is Yucca Hill, Arizona 1968.

 - (2) Any acquisition or lease of land;
 - (3) Purchase of major equipment or vehicles, with a life expectancy of five years or more, valued in excess of an amount to be established by the Controller;
 - (4) Major building improvements that are not routine maintenance expenses and that substantially enhance the value or extend the useful life of a structure;
 - (5) Construction of new buildings or facilities including engineering, design, and other preconstruction costs with an estimated cost in excess of an amount to be determined by the Controller; and/or
 - (6) Major equipment or furnishing required to furnish new buildings or other projects, the cost of which is above a certain amount to be established by the Controller,
- 2. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §820 (I), the "[d]evelopment of the Capital Budget shall be coordinated with development of the Operating Budget. All budget requests for capital improvements shall be in compliance with the Plan."
- 3. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §820(M), the Office of Management and Budget shall coordinate the overall preparation, adoption and implementation of both the annual operating and capital budgets of the Navajo Nation. All requests for annual operating funds and supplemental funds shall be submitted to the Office of Management and Budget for budget impact analysis and other appropriate action.
- 4. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §501 (B)(4)(c), the Resources and Development Committee is to review and recommend to the Navajo Nation Council through the appropriate process supplemental appropriations to the capital improvement projects annual budget to fund necessary additional capital improvement projects.
- 5. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. §860(C)(2) "[t]he appropriate portion of the Capital Improvement Plan is subject to approval of the Navajo Nation Council upon recommendation of the Budget and Finance Committee. Any modification or amendment affecting the approved Capital Improvement Plan is subject to review and concurrence by the Resources and Development Committee prior to consideration by the Navajo Nation Council."
 - I. The powerline extension to four relocation households in the Navajo Partition land area of Forest Lake Chapter community are not included in the Title 12 Capital Improvement Plan.

 Any modification or amendment affecting the approved Capital Improvement Plan is subject to review and concurrence by the Resources and Development Committee prior to consideration by the Navajo Nation Council, 12 N.N.C. §860

Amber Crotty: Thank you Speaker, my colleagues here on the floor, so what amendment the two amendments, I have a question I brought this up when we were I believe at one of the Committees. There was an issue regarding if this was a grant appropriation from Peabody, and I don't know if you ever got that cleared up Speaker regarding the review process it was reviewed as a grant, accepting a grant and the Legislation as stated is asking for supplemental. So, if I could ask the sponsor if that was corrected, and if this amendment corrects that review process. I reserve my time Speaker.



Speaker: 3:51 for Honorable Crotty, Honorable Tsosie on the main motion.

Leonard Tsosie: Thank you Mr. Speaker, members of the Council, I'm somewhat troubled by this proposal this was a settlement by Peabody and Peabody has already done its compensation and Peabody should pay for the power lines. So, to resolve the (inaudible) of these families is through the mining and that is something that is the responsibility of Peabody. Let them pay for it.

Second thing is, and then the other too is that Peabody has already given this family good compensation, and this family just kind of fined the Navajo Nation we're going to Peabody have them give us this. So, but pretty much in terms of relocation, they are self-relocating themselves out to pay them. So I don't think we should especially when we're dipping into the Minimum Fund Balance to do it in this manner.

And then the other thing is I think the chapter will give them some additional money to do capital projects, and I would encourage the Chapter instead to do permit range. It was quite interesting that when I asked them use your money, your Capital money they don't want to. And so if they build just these four power line then they should do so. I'm not real picky about this proposal. This is a result of Peabody's Coal Mining, and Peabody should pay for it. So, it appears that the family have been adequately compensated they forgot the power line and then they try to say this Council did not pay for them. So, I don't we should allow such a situation to dip into the minimum fund balance. So, I would encourage the body to vote against this. Thank you members of the Council, I reserve my time.

追 Nelson BeGaye: Thank you very much Speaker and my colleagues here. I really have a problem with the Capital Improvement Projects, not the Capital Improvement that the chapters put together but just what we're doing for them. We had the Chapters do a five year, multi-year listing, and we just shelved it now, we have individual delegates that are coming to take money for these projects. And I think that should be one of our first priorities; I have been saying this since Monday. We need to really plan these things out, otherwise individually I like to bring my own legislation just like Kee Allen Begay said the other day. So, that's where I have a problem with this Capital Improvement process, and I don't know why we have to waive do these things because they're not on the Capital Improvement process. And so if we're not even going to fund that, then we shouldn't even have to waive laws to say that they are not on the Capital Improvement List. We're just really spinning our wheels on this and the other thing I have a little problem with is not a little but I have some projects that were funded it was actually given to NTUA and they have not even done the job yet. They have not scheduled these, I don't know what they're doing but I have a little problem with it If they can't do the job maybe we could get somebody else to do these jobs. Other than that I just have a problem with the CIP on what we're doing I like to get power line to individuals out in the rural areas also like waterline still have to haul water, including myself hauling water. We need to get to business as much as we can. I just ike to bring out those concerns.



Speaker: I see no one else on the list Honorable Brown.

Nathaniel Brown: Mr. Speaker and 23rd Navajo Nation Council, I would like to express my support to this four power line extension project. When I was Legislative Assistant, I know we've worked extensively with five chapters as well as Peabody, is that brings a lot of these individuals that live in this remote areas that's where coal is dug out, water was pumped out and these families still don't have, they actually did some businesses to some of these phones out there. All the homes that I've visited they have been asking for waterline so the one thing that they keep requesting, I know that some of the Peabody funds that is distributed with the five chapters \$1.5 million so that is \$250,000 to each of the five chapters and with that they can actually do what they want. So some of the chapters like Chilchinbeto, they're not taking the funds back into the Peabody Lease Area.

So, they're actually using it on other infrastructure projects as well as Kayenta they're working on other power line projects. So, they were funding the Hallburns Power Line project which has 31 clients in Kayenta.

And for the next five years, I know the other chapters will be spending these funding with Peabody funding on other infrastructure projects. So, I ask my colleagues to help support our Navajo families that live in these areas that are still in need for power line project, they have [projects that might not even get funding that I know previous Delegates have been working diligently on is the Manymules Waterline Projects unfortunately; because of the hard rock surface in the Black Mesa Area, the rough terrain. They might not even get water line, and this is where we get a lot of our funding. So, still a lot of our Navajo, our Dine our elders are still without water, they're still without power. So, please let's help these individuals to get this funding for the four families. That would be my comment thank you.



Speaker: I see no one else on the board sponsor requested amendments. OMB.

Lisa Jymm: Thank you Mr. Speaker, members of the Navajo Nation Council, in reviewing the budget forms, I'm looking at Budget Form 4, I have \$132,412.82, but on Budget Form 1, I have \$132,412.87, is that a typo you're off by five cents, and the Fiscal Year says 2015, but the date are for FY'16, I think you met for FY'16 in that account. I mean that line item, another question is, it has customer numbers will these monies be going to the chapter constituent, or will it be going straight to the chapter for power lines or NTUA Mr. Speaker?



Speaker: Sponsor.

Dwight Witherspoon: Thank you certainly the funds are going to be going to NTUA to do the project, and certainly maybe they're glad to take the chapters to get the power line project from them, to the cost that Navajo Tribal Utility Authority has for these families. I have a lot to try to catch the five cents referred to. I guess it'll be a typo. I've answered all the questions



Speaker: OMB are we good, Honorable Filfred.

Davis Filfred: Mr. Speaker and members of the Council, and the sponsor of this legislation. I like to offer an amendment; my first amendment is to add the budget forms that were just corrected. Add those documents to the legislation Mr. Speaker.

Speaker: Second, second to the amendment? Motion to add the budget forms the new budget forms, insert new budget forms; second by Honorable Phelps, any discussion on Amendment 1, going once, twice, and three times Honorable Crotty.

Amber Crotty: Thank you Speaker, so I apologize then my question was all this amendment. Does this amendment fix the issue of the reviewed process from the grant agreement to now a supplemental request that was my question I'll reserve my time thank you.



Speaker: 1:43 for Honorable Crotty, Honorable Crotty who are you directing your question to?

Amber Crotty: The Sponsor.

Speaker: Honorable Filfred.

Davis Filfred: Mr. Speaker I'll refer that question to the Sponsor of the Legislation and OMB.

Speaker: Honorable Witherspoon.

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Dwight Witherspoon: Thank you if you look at the 164 review form there is the third box down is checked and it states Grant and then there's a slash so it could be a grant that's being reviewed it could be a grant funding agreement that's being reviewed for an amendment. And so if you look at box No. 2, it states as Intergovernmental Agreement that's not what this is.

This is not a budget resolution this is not a budget reallocation, or an amendment, so I certainly understand Delegate Crotty's concern. If you look at the reviewers on 1 above OMB, OOC and OAG. So this is reviewed by the Division, OMB, OOC, OAG, so I don't quite understand the position that the wrong review process was done as a supplemental. That would be my response, thank you.

Speaker: Honorable Crotty 4:41, reserve time.

Amber Crotty: Thank you Speaker and my colleagues, this was brought up because your Legislation states that the OMB has a memo attached as Exhibit B, on the legislation Exhibit "B" was just OOC, and so when we called it Mr. Beyal of OMB he acknowledged it came before this I believe that at NABI when we last heard this that he recollected that it was more of a grant, accepting a grant and because what I wanted was in the other Chapter CIP Projects, OMB always had a memo stating the project questioning if it was on the Five Year Plan, and that's missing from this document, and really that's why this amendment has to come onto play I had asked the Legislative Counsel if this is a Capital Improvement Project and that's why this amendment needs to be added because legislation did not identify that it was a Capital Improvement Project. So, it's really a question regarding, I need to know if this legislation is in order and if maybe I can go to OMB and to make sure that this is the remedy and so I reserve my time. Thank you.

Speaker: Reserve time 3:08. OMB.

Lisa Jymm: Thank you Mr. Speaker, members of the Council, reading the amendment in the Letter I, where he states not included in the Capital Improvement Plan. As I understand it is not part of the CIP Plan, CAP-18-14. Ms. Crotty.

Speaker: Honorable Crotty 3:08

Amber Crotty: Thank you Speaker so, yeah I see that here, that it's now this amendment, my question was in the review process that's what brought up the issue was is the Chapter looking for Navajo Nation money or initially were they going to receive a grant from Peabody to provide this service. In looking at the Legislation there's a lot of documentation that is signed by Mr. Jarvis Williams who is the Tribal Liaison for Peabody, and so that was the question that was asked.

Because of looking at the documents, I also see that the Chapter itself is not providing some of their CIP money that they have at their disposal, at this very moment. And so the reason why these issue with the review is if it started off as a grant review it appears that the review was correct but any other Chapter CIP Project, I compared it with Wide Ruins, and I compared it with Teesto, I know it was a different review process. So, those are my questions, and I would like to get answered regarding this amendment, and I reserve my time.

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Speaker: 1:51 for Honorable Crotty. OMB

Lisa Jymm: Thank you Ms. Crotty, members of the Navajo Nation Council, I believe Ms. Crotty's question is, is this part of the CIP plan? No, it's not. And what she's asking is, is it going to be a Tribal grant, it would be a grant but it would be under the chapter funds. So, what would happen is if this budget is approved it would go under the chapter account for Forest Lake. And the best situation would be to make it an end account then they work with NTUA to make the power lines. But since it set precedence last year in FY'15, it would most likely just go to the Chapter and they would have to work with NTUA themselves with the money we give to do the power lines, Mr. Speaker.



Speaker: Honorable Crotty 1:51.

Amber Crotty: I think I raised my issues with this I do want these community members to get this resource so like the question would be to the Sponsor we're waiving the 5 Year CIP placing, is that then the Chapter wanting to then take their current project off of the Five Year listing or do they anticipate to get this project funded and then when money is available then have their Five Year identified Projects also be funded. I reserve my time.



Speaker: 1:16 for Honorable Crotty, Sponsor.

Dwight Witherspoon: Thank you that's a very good question certainly in the Plans for 2015 and certainly for Capital Improvement, their No. 1 Project was the Manymules Water Line Project which has actually fell in Phases, and this project came about because these families were going to be moved, and have been moved during the year, certainly one of the Vice President's checks being sent shall then change our Capital Project by wording before 2016 to make the Powerline project down to one project for the purposes coming before this body. They haven't had a chance to do that. So, I can't speak to the issue. But at least they're being made aware of such.

The families that Delegate Tsosie was referring to they are getting moved and they're getting compensated for their homes so they're being moved to their homes, and that's where the cost are going is to have new homes at a new location.

Bu they're also getting compensated for what was existing at the previous homes so there were corrals, sheds or oven, bread house or any of those other things that were around their property they're being compensated for that. The other cost that were included in the compensation was to be able to set them up certainly with clearances, and attracting them for more power as well. The portion of the Nation what's being requested here is outside the leasehold area. So, the cost to run the powerline from off of the leasehold area, which Peabody has a lease on to where these homes are I suggest on that leasehold area so that's the cost that the Nation pays for. Thank you.



Speaker: Honorable Crotty 1:16.

Amber Crotty: Thank you Speaker, colleagues, so I am now having some concern that we're pushing these critical projects yes but we're not doing any adjustments to the Five Year Capital Plan. I'm looking at Auditor general's 2nd Quarterly Report, as of maybe March, and Forest Lake has \$210,000 in their Capital Improvement Plan, and that's more than enough to fund this project. I think overall we have to start having a discussion it looks like the Chapters in whole have \$25 million in Capital Improvement Projects, so I support getting these projects funded. I'm always having concern that Navajo Nation money is going to the Chapter's Capital Improvement, and he Chapters are not entering or having any cost shared with this particular project or many of the projects that have come before and those are my concerns in terms of financial management. Thank you Speaker, I appreciate it.

Speaker: Any further comments? Honorable Crotty was the last one on the screen. Going once, twice and going three times, let's go to the board folks for amendment one, going once, going twice, going three times lock in the votes, by a vote of 11 in favor and 4 opposed, amendment 1 carries. Back to Honorable Filfred 4:38.

David Filfred: Thank you Speaker, thank you for this legislation again you know people are in need of residential powerline, that's what it's all about for our constituents, we talked about yesterday and today speaking about all these names this is one of them. My second amendment is this page here and I'll let Tom read the whole page if he can. Mr. Speaker I reserve my time.



Speaker: 4:17 for honorable Filfred.

Tom Platero: Mr. Speaker and members of the Council the proposed amendment of Legislation 0301-15. Reading the proposed amendments into the record as follows:

On Page 1, line 17, ADD THE FOLLOWING LANGUAGE
AND WAIVING 12 N.N.N.C. §820(I) AND 860 (C) REALATING TO THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROCESS

On page 2, line 15, add a new letter H. Capital Improvement Process includes:

- 1, Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. §810(F), "Capital Improvement" means a major project undertaken by the Navajo Nation that is generally not recurring on an annual basis and which fits within one or more of the following categories:
 - (1) All projects requiring debt obligation or borrowing;
 - (2) Any acquisition or lease of land;
 - (3) <u>Purchase of major equipment or vehicles</u>, with a life expectancy of five years or more valued in excess of an amount to be established by the Controller;
 - (4) Major building improvements that are not routine maintenance expenses and that substantially enhance the value or extend the useful life of a structure;
 - (5) Construction of new buildings or facilities including engineering, design, and other preconstruction costs with an estimated cost in excess of an amount to be determined by the Controller; and/or

- (6) Major equipment or furnishing required to furnish new buildings or other projects, the cost of which is above a certain amount to be established by the Controller.
- 2. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. §820(I), the "[d]evelopment of the Capital Budget shall be coordinated with development of the Operating Budget. All budget requests for capital improvements shall be in compliance with the Plan."
- 3. Pursuant to 12 NNC §820(M), the Office of Management and Budget shall coordinate the overall preparation, adoption and implementation of both the annual operating and capital budgets of the Navajo Nation. All requests for annual operating funds and supplemental funds shall be submitted to the Office of Management and Budget for budget impact analysis and other appropriate action.
- 4. Pursuant to 2 NNC § 501 (B)(4)(c), the Resources and Development Committee is to review and recommend to the Navajo Nation Council through the appropriate process supplemental appropriations to the capital improvement projects annual budget to fund necessary additional capital improvement projects.
- 5. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 860 (C) (2) "[t]he appropriation portion of the Capital Improvement Plan is subject to approval of the Navajo Nation Council upon recommendation of the Budget and Finance Committee. Any modification or amendment affecting the approved Capital Improvement Plan is subject to review and concurrence by the Resources and Development Committee prior to consideration by the Navajo Nation Council."

The powerline extension to four relocation households in the Navajo Partition Land area of Forest Lake Chapter community are not included in the Title 12 Capital Improvement Plan. Any modification or amendment affecting the approved Capital Improvement Plan is subject to review and concurrence by the Resources and Development Committee prior to consideration by the Navajo Nation Council. 12 N.N.C. § 860.

J. The Navajo Nation finds it in the best interest to waive 12 N.N.C. § 860 (C) regarding authorizing the powerline extension to four relocation households in the Navajo Partitioned Land area of Forest Lake Chapter Community.

SECTION 3. WAIVING 12 N.N.C. §§ 820(I) AND 860(C) REGARDING THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

The Navajo Nation Council hereby waives 12 N.N.C. §§ 820 (I) and § 860(C) regarding the powerline extension to four relocation households in the Navajo Partitioned Land area of Forest Lake Chapter Community

Speaker: Motion, motion by Honorable Davis Filfred, second by Honorable Nathaniel Brown. Any further discussion, going once, going twice on amendment 2. Honorable Phelps.

Walter Phelps: Thank you Mr. Speaker, so this amendment that was read to us, so does this amend the code or what does this do, or does it just stay there? Can I get an explanation? Reserve my time.

Speaker: Honorable Filfred 4:16. Honorabl Filfred.

Davis Filfred: Thank you again Speaker, and thank you for the question that is being posed, also I just want to say a big shout out to the people that are listening and watching online, its 8 o'clock and I'll go ahead and defer that question to the Sponsor of this legislation Mr. Speaker.

Speaker: Honorable Vice Chair Witherspoon.

Dwight Witherspoon: Refer it to the Legislative Counsel. I can answer the powerline project is not within that Five year Capital Project listing and so it should have been drafted with this language in there initially. And the Legislative Counsel put together this legislation, but can defer to Legislative Counsel.

Speaker: Mariana.

Mariana Kahn: Mr. Speaker, members of the Navajo Nation Council, this particular engrossed amendment will satisfy the requirement. Well, as you know projects for capital improvement must be on this project Capital Improvement Plan, this particular project is not on the Five Year Capital Improvement Plan therefore, in order for it to be funded it must specifically state that requirements of Capital Improvement the specifications in the Appropriations Act with regards to Capital Improvement must be waived in this manner. And it does have two pages of sentencing an language having to do with requirements of the Capital Improvement Plan and very specific in waiving those requirements, Mr. Phelps.

Speaker: Honorable Phelps 4:46.

Walter Phelps: Thank you Mr. Speaker I just needed some clarifications on this because I support request for the community and the need for infrastructure. I guess I just wanted to make sure that these amendments would satisfy and hopefully expedite the process, thank you Mr. Speaker.

Speaker: I see no other on the screen for amendment 2 go to the board; going once, going twice, going three times, by a vote of 9 in favor and 6 opposed, amendment 2 passes. Back to the main motion there was a request also to consider tabling. I have reserve time for Honorable Crotty 3:51 you want it now Honorable Crotty.

Amber Crotty: Speaker, thank you I did have a question. These amendments are not numbered and I just have one, so if there is two amendments I like to have the other copy. On page 1 line 17 add the following language.

Speaker: The Amendment 1 is the budget forms. Honorable Crotty time is running.

Amber Crotty: It was a request I made......

Speaker: You're on reserve time save it? Honorable Crotty did you reserve your time? Honorable Tsosie reserves his, Honorable Filfred 4:17.

Davis Filfred: Thank you again Mr. Speaker, members of the Council, everybody here in the gallery. Just remembering that in my area Aneth Chapter we have over 300 people they still have no electricity and I do understand the need and the people living in the Black Mesa area but I sure hate to do this but its been requested I'll go ahead and motion to table this Mr. Speaker and for how long I'll refer that back to the Sponsor of this legislation.

Speaker: Motion to table by Honorable Filfred, second by Honorable Lee Jack, Sr., Sponsor response to the Tabling Motion.

Dwight Witherspoon: Thank you for the motion, I agree with my colleagues to not try and go into the Minimum Fund Balance, we'll wait a couple of weeks until we have the budget pulls out to see what's in the UUFB at the next I guess Special Session than the Legislation can be considered for appropriation thank you.

Speaker: Go to the board on tabling motion. Going once, going twice, going three times tabling motion passes by a vote of 9 to 5. Just for the record so we don't get into this at some point. These are the individuals that have zero time Honorable Crotty waives off her time, Honorable Tsosie 2:33, Honorable BeGaye 3 seconds, Honorable Brown used up his time, Honorable Filfred has 4:17; Honorable BeGaye.

Nelson BeGaye: Mr. Speaker, my colleagues, I'm doing a question of privilege but I need to find out what the status of the CIP is? We approved it through Council, President signed it and then there was an issue from the Auditor General saying that it did not go through the right process so do we have a CIP Plan or not? Because we're waiting we just had one here a while ago. And we need to find out to see if our CIP is valid or not, and it seem like it is valid on one hand and on the other hand we're saying that it didn't go through the right process. I think if we get some information Mr. Speaker sometime down the road.

Speaker: We'll address before this legislation comes up again we'll get something for Friday. Honorable Kee Allen.

Kee Allen Begay: Mr. Speaker please I e-mailed you back there is a deadline that he requested by the Finance Office, so we're here all night and I was here this morning, this morning up to now so we don't' have enough time to work on those.



Speaker: We have completed our agenda.



Walter Phelps: Motion to adjourn.

Speaker: Motion by Honorable Phelps to adjourn; second by Honorable Jonathan L Hale; all in favor push you r buttons for adjournment, ice Chair Witherspoon, second by Chairman Hale; push your buttons see if we have a quorum for adjournment. Going once, going twice, going three time lock it down, 10 in favor and 3 opposed. Thank you very much be save going home.
