Of the 23rd Navajo Nation Council---Second Year 2016**

AN ACTION

**RELATING TO RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT; CONFIRMING THE APPOINTMENT
OF MR. STANLEY ROBBINS TO THE NATIVE BROADCAST ENTERPRISE BOARD OF
DIRECTORS.**

BE IT ENACTED:

Section One. Authorities

A. The Native Broadcast Enterprise shall operate under the legislative oversight of the Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council. 5 N.N.C. § 1654.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

A. The management board for Native Broadcast Enterprise shall be appointed by the President of the Navajo Nation and confirmed by the Resources and Development Committee. See 5 N.N.C. §§ 1653, 2 N.N.C. § 501(B)(9), and Article 5, Plan of Operation EDCJA-50-11.

B. Qualifications for the Board of Directors are education and experience in broadcast management, electrical engineering, and business management. See Article 5, Plan of Operation, EDCJA-50-11.

C. Knowledge in modern technology is also a requirement. *Id.*

D. At least one member of the Board must have substantial knowledge of Navajo culture and tradition (not subject to English and experience requirements). *Id.*

E. Appointed members must either reside within the Navajo Nation or within 50 miles thereof. *Id.*

F. Members of the Board serve staggered terms of four (4) years. *Id.*

G. Pursuant to Article 5 of the Plan of Operations for Native Broadcast Enterprise, the Navajo Nation President, upon the recommendation of the Board of Directors has reappointed Mr. Stanley Robbins as a continued member of the Board of Directors. See **Exhibit A** (Notice of Appointment), **Exhibit B** (Letter of Interest) and **Exhibit C** (Recommendation from Board of Directors).

H. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council grants final confirmation. 2 N.N.C. §501(B)(9).

SECTION THREE. CONFIRMING APPOINTMENT

The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby confirms the appointment of Mr. Stanley Robbins to the Native Broadcast Enterprise Board of Directors, for a term of four years.

As a Senior Planner I worked with various consultants and Tuba City Western Agency Local Support Center; to establish the five management system consisting of accounting, procurement, filing, personnel management and property management. WHEREAS:



Native Broadcast Enterprise (NBE) Board of Directors finds that under the NBE Plan of Operation, Article 5, (G) vacancies in the Board of Directors will be filled by appointment by the President of the Navajo Nation for the remainder of the term of the vacant office. In the event the President of the Navajo Nation fails to fill a vacant Board of Directors position within 60 days of the vacancy, the vacancy will be filled in accordance with the Board of Directors appointment procedures;
