TITLE OF RESOLUTION: AN ACTION RELATING TO NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; ESTABLISHING POLICY THAT THE NAVAJO NATION GOVERNMENT SHALL NOT ENDORSE CANDIDATES OR POLITICAL PARTIES IN FEDERAL, STATE AND LOCAL ELECTIONS

PURPOSE: This resolution, if approved, will establish Navajo Nation policy against the Navajo Nation government endorsing candidates or political parties in federal, state and local elections.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committee. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each committee member to review the proposed resolution in detail.

16	SECTION ONE. FINDINGS	
17	A. The Navajo Nation Council or the appropriate Standing Committee(s) must	
18	review and approve statements of policy of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. §164	
19	(A) (2012) see also CO-45-12.	
20	B. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation	
21	Council with the enumerated power to recommend resolutions to the Navajo	
22	Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 701 (A) (3).	
23	C. Navajo Nation President Nez recently spoke at the Democratic National	
24	Convention in support of Presidential Candidate Joe Biden; Navajo Nation	
25	Vice-President Lizer recently spoke at the Republican National Convention in	
26	support of re-electing President Trump.	
27	D. Although neither President Nez nor Vice-President Lizer specifically stated that	
28	they were appearing at the respective Conventions on behalf of the Navajo	
29	Nation, much of the Navajo Nation public thought that President Nez was	
30	endorsing Mr. Biden and the Democratic Party on behalf of the Navajo Nation	

- and that Vice-President Lizer was endorsing President Trump and the Republican Party on behalf of the Navajo Nation.
- E. 1 N.N.C. § 203(A), Diyin Bits [] áádéé; Beehaz [] áaníí declares and teaches it is the right and freedom of the Diné to choose leaders of their choice; leaders who will communicate with the people for guidance; leaders who will use their experience and wisdom to always act in the best interest of the people; and leaders who will also ensure the rights and freedoms of the generations yet to come.
- F. 1 N.N.C. § 203(B), Diyin Bits'áádéé' Beehaz Dáaníí declares and teaches that all leaders chosen by the Diné are to carry out their duties and responsibilities in a moral and legal manner in representing the people and the government; people's trust and confidence in the leaders and the continued status as a leader are dependent upon adherence to the values and principles of Diné bi beenahazáanii.
- G. It is a fundamental right of the Diné to elect the leader(s) of their choice be it Navajo leaders or leaders at the federal, state or local level; this right should not be usurped by Navajo Nation leadership endorsing candidates and political parties on behalf of the Navajo Nation.

SECTION THREE. ESTABLISHING POLICY AGAINST THE NAVAJO NATION GOVERNMENT ENDORSING POLITICAL CANDIDATES AND PARTIES

As an official statement of policy, the Navajo Nation government shall not endorse any candidate or political party at the tribal, federal, state or local level.

SECTION FOUR. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Action is effective upon its approval pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §221 (A) and (B).


SECTION SIX. SAVING CLAUSE

Based on existing law and review of documents submitted, the resolution as drafted is legally sufficient. As with any action of government however, it can be subject to review by the courts in the event of proper challenge.

The Office of Legislative Counsel confirms the appropriate standing committee(s) based on the standing committees powers outlined in 2 N.N.C. §§301, 401, 501, 601 and 701. Nevertheless, "the Speaker of the Navajo Nation Council shall introduce [the proposed resolution] into the legislative process by assigning it to the respective oversight committee(s) of the Navajo Nation Council having authority over the matters for proper consideration." 2 N.N.C. §164(A)(5).

Please ensure that his particular resolution request is precisely what you want. You are encouraged to review the proposed resolution to ensure that it is drafted to your satisfaction.
