RE: CAP-22-20, An Action Relating to an Emergency for the Navajo Nation; Approving Supplemental Funding from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance in the amount of two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) for Burial Assistance to the Navajo Division of Social Services

### Dear Speaker Damon,

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Navajo Nation President, I must exercise the line item veto authority granted to me relative to CAP-22-20 for the reasons explained below and should not be misinterpreted that our office does not care for our People. We care very much for every family who lost a loved one, who cannot properly grieve for their lost, and who cannot gather to share stories of the life now missing from the family. We pray for the spouses, the children, mothers and fathers, relatives, and close friends who must go on not having the chance to say good-bye.

The Navajo Nation lost 73 lives to COVID-19. Because of this virus' affect on our People we are working day and night to stop its spread but we need to listen to our health officials when they urge us to stay home and stay safe to save lives. We thank the Council for this Resolution but we must keep in mind the future of our Nation and preserve our resources should it be needed later.

The Health Command Operations Center, the Navajo Department of Health, and the Navajo Division of Social Services are working to address the need for burials during this time. They have made available \$250,000 from the previous appropriation for COVID-19 related matters and have worked together to add \$500,000 from grant funds for a total of \$750,000 now available to help our families bury their loved ones. Saving the funds appropriated in CAP-22-20 is the wisest course of action at this time as we may see a second wave of the virus later in the year.

Many of the responses from the People agree with the appropriation but one person, in particular, was insightful with this comment:

In the supporting documents submitted, Navajo Nation Division of Social Services requested \$250,000.00 based on 100 burials. It may be wise to increase this amount due to the following reasons: 1) There is NO cure for the virus. Experts have estimated that a vaccine will not be available until fall of 2020 or early 2021 perhaps longer. 2) It appears those patients who have tested COVID-19 positive are not self-quarantining as families are having to bury multiple family members. 3) We do not know when the Navajo Nation will be able to contain the spread of this virus. There are many

uncertainties at this time and as a nation, its best to be prepared to help the Navajo people take care of loved ones without delay during this time. Therefore, increasing the amount of the proposed budget may be wiser.

We have increased the budget through available resources and we must plan for our future if we are looking to a continued battle with this virus into late 2020 and into 2021.

We are looking into other readily accessible funding to continue helping our families and we are keeping track of our spending so we may submit it to the Federal Emergency Management Agency for reimbursement. We truly appreciate the action of the Navajo Nation Council and we look forward to the continued support.

Be assured our families who have lost loved ones will be supported.

# RESOLUTION OF THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL 24th NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL - SECOND YEAR, 2020

#### AN ACTION

RELATING TO AN EMERGENCY FOR THE NAVAJO NATION; APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF TWO HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$250,000) FOR BURIAL ASSISTANCE TO THE NAVAJO DIVISION OF SOCIAL SERVICES WAIVING 12 N.N.C. §§ 820 (E) AND (F) REGARDING THE RESTRICTION OF MATCHING NON-RECURRING REVENUES WITH RECURRING EXPENDITURES

#### BE IT ENACTED:

#### SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 102 (A).
- B. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §164 (A)(16) "[M]atters constituting an emergency shall be limited to the cessation of law enforcement services, and disaster relief services, fire protection services or other direct services required as an entitlement under Navajo Nation or Federal law, or which directly threaten the sovereignty of the Navajo Nation. Such an emergency matter must arise due to the pressing public need for such resolution(s) and must be a matter requiring final action by the Council."
- C. This legislation is offered as an emergency due to the critical need to provide emergency and disaster relief services.
- D. The Navajo Nation Council has the authority to approve supplemental appropriations. 12 N.N.C. § 820(L). Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820 (L), "[t]he Navajo Nation Council may adopt and approve supplemental appropriations to the Annual Comprehensive Budget during the fiscal year. Supplemental appropriations of General Funds within the current fiscal year are permitted, if and when additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections are projected and which are also in excess of the reserve amount set forth at § 820(J)."
- E. The Title 12 Finance Act Supplemental Appropriation requirements include:

- 1. All requests for annual operating funds and supplemental funds shall be submitted to the Office of Management and Budget for budget impact analysis. 12 N.N.C. § 820 (M).
- 2. When the Controller identifies additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections, supplemental appropriations may be approved by the Navajo Nation Council. 12 N.N.C. § 820 (L).
- 3. Supplemental Appropriations made from non-recurring revenues shall only be made for non-recurring operations or purposes, as set forth at § 820(F). The Controller of the Navajo Nation shall be responsible for designation recurring and non-recurring revenues. 12 N.N.C. § 820 (L).
- 4. The Nation shall budget all recurring operating expenses, including capital maintenance, from recurring revenues. Long term debt shall not be used to finance recurring operating expenses. 12 N.N.C. §820 (E).
- 5. The Navajo Nation Code provides, "[t]he Nation shall restrict non-recurring revenues to budget non-recurring expenditures. In addition, non-recurring revenues will be budgeted only after an examination by the Controller to determine whether or not the revenues are subsidizing an imbalance between recurring revenues and expenditures, and expenditures may be authorized only if a long-term (three-five year) forecast shows that the operating deficit will not continue. Otherwise, non-recurring revenues will be added to the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund balance. This provision may be amended or waived by a two-thirds vote of the full Navajo Nation Council." 12 N.N.C. § 820 (F).

#### SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. The novel coronavirus ("COVID-19") has caused a global pandemic and has hit the Navajo Nation especially hard. As of April 9th, the Navajo Nation reported 488 cases of COVID-19 and 20 deaths from the virus.
- B. In an effort to reduce the spread of COVID-19 the President of the Navajo Nation extended the previously declared State of Emergency on the Navajo Nation and required government offices remain closed through April 26, 2020 in Executive Order 002-20.

- C. The Navajo Nation Department of Health has issued a Public Health Emergency Orders requiring Navajo Nation residents stay at home to mitigate the risk of spreading COVID-19 and to preserve the health and safety of all individuals residing on the Navajo Nation. Public Health Emergency Order No. 2020-003.
- D. The Navajo Nation Department of Health also issued a Public Health Emergency Orders extending the Stay at Home Order and implementing a curfew from 8:00 p.m. through 5:00 a.m. for Navajo Nation residents. Public Health Emergency Order No. 2020-004.
- E. This supplemental appropriation is requested for burial assistance in the amount of <del>Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000)</del>. The budget documents are attached as **Exhibit A**.
- F. Due to the emergency nature of this funding request, the budget impact analysis required by 12 N.N.C. 820(M) can be provided by the Office of Management and Budget when this matter is heard by Council either in person or telephonically.
- G. Due to the emergency nature of this funding request the Controller can satisfy the requirements provided in 12 N.N.C. § 820 (L) when this matter is heard by Council either in person or telephonically.

#### SECTION THREE. WAIVING 12 N.N.C. § 820 (E) AND (F)

The Navajo Nation Council waives 12 N.N.C. \$ 820 (E) and (F) with regard to the restriction on matching non-recurring revenues with recurring expenditures.

SECTION FOUR. APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF TWO HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$250,000) FOR BURIAL ASSISTANCE TO THE NAVAJO DIVISION OF SOCIAL SERVICES, OFFICE OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, BUSINESS UNIT 117001

- A. This supplemental appropriation of \$250,000 shall be from that amount of funds that exceeds the minimum fund balance of the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance as determined by the Office of the Controller and as indicated the documents in Exhibit A.
- B. The Navajo Nation hereby approves supplemental funding from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance in the amount of \$250,000 for emergency funds as indicated in the documents in Exhibit A.

C. The Division of Social Services through the Health Command Center shall submit any expenditures from the UUFB to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) for reimbursement.
