20	A. The Budget and Finance Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council

23	B. The Resources and Development Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation

26	C. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council that

- A. Pinedale Chapter is requesting \$296,211 from the Síhasin Fund for the purchase of a new motor grader for the Chapter. The grader they have been using is over 15 years old, frequently

B. The Chapter has provided a detailed price quote for the proposed purchase. **EXHIBIT B**.

- D. Approving the \$296,211 for the Chapter's proposed purchase of a new motor grader satisfies the preference for leveraging of funds in 12 N.N.C. §2502(C), because the State of New Mexico, Indian Affairs Department has approved \$100,000 for this purchase. **EXHIBIT C**.
- E. The Pinedale Chapter has passed a resolution supporting and recommending the request for the \$296,211 in Síhasin funds for the motor grader purchase. **EXHIBIT D**.
- F. The new motor grader will enable the Pinedale Chapter to better serve Chapter residents and nearby communities with road maintenance, homesite preparation, agricultural grading services, and other needs.
- G. The Navajo Nation therefore finds the approval of the requested Síhasin funds to be in the best interests of the Navajo Nation and the Navajo People.

SECTION THREE. APPROVING \$296,211 FROM THE SÍHASIN FUND FOR A NEW MOTOR GRADER FOR PINEDALE CHAPTER; APPROVING THE RELATED EXPENDITURE PLAN

- A. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. §2505(A), the Navajo Nation hereby approves \$296,211 from the Síhasin Fund for the purchase of a new motor grader for the Pinedale Chapter, as explained in **EXHIBITS A-D**. The Navajo Nation hereby approves the related Expenditure Plan as set forth in **EXHIBIT B** and **EXHIBIT C**.
- B. The Navajo Nation Controller shall determine whether the source of the approved Síhasin funds will be from Fund Principal or Fund Income or a combination of both.
- C. The Síhasin funds allocated for the Expenditure Plan approved herein may be further leveraged by bond or loan financing pursuant to the Navajo Nation Bond Financing Act, at 12 N.N.C. §1300 et seq., as amended, using Síhasin Fund earnings for repayment and financing costs upon the recommendation of the Budget and Finance Committee and approval by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all members of the Navajo Nation Council.
- D. The Síhasin funds approved herein shall be provided to the Division of Community

- Development ("DCD") within ten (10) business days following the effective date of this Action. DCD shall then promptly implement the Expenditure Plan approved herein by purchase and arranging for delivery of the new motor grader to the Pinedale Chapter.
- E. To fully protect the Navajo Nation from any claims or liability, prior to delivery of the motor grader to the Chapter, DCD shall verify: (1) proper insurance coverage for the motor grader with appropriate damage, collision, and liability coverages, as set by New Mexico law; and (2) proper training of any person(s) who will be operating the motor grader, as generally practiced or regulated in New Mexico.
- 9 F. The Pinedale Chapter shall be responsible for all operation, maintenance, storage, and repair costs associated with the motor grader.
 - G. The approved Síhasin funds shall be used strictly for the Expenditure Plan approved herein, and DCD shall be responsible for ensuring compliance with the approved Expenditure Plan, as well as all mandates set forth in this Action.
 - H. If the purchase of the motor grader is not completed by September 30, 2023, the approved Síhasin funds shall revert to the Síhasin Fund, unless otherwise determined by the Resources and Development Committee and the Naabik'íyáti' Committee.
 - I. With respect to any and all unspent Síhasin funds that remain after completion of the purchase of the motor grader (savings), promptly upon completion of purchase DCD shall transfer all savings to the Office of the Controller ("OOC") and OOC shall then immediately deposit such savings back into the Síhasin Fund principal.
 - J. The Síhasin Fund may be reimbursed in the amount of the allocation approved herein, using funds available to the Navajo Nation from any and all state and federal sources, including Congressional appropriations under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 or other COVID-19-related relief, if the expenditure for the Pinedale Chapter described herein is deemed eligible under the legal scheme governing such funding.

SECTION FOUR. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Action and the related Expenditure Plan shall become effective pursuant to 12 N.N.C. §2505(A) and 2 N.N.C. §221(B).

SECTION FIVE. SAVING CLAUSE

If any part of this Action is invalidated by the Supreme Court of the Navajo Nation, or by any Navajo Nation District Court without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the remainder of this Action shall be the law of the Navajo Nation.

RESOLUTION OF THE PINEDALE CHAPTER RESOLUTION NO. PDC-2023-06-081

A RESOLUTION REQUESTING, SUPPORTING, AND RECOMMENDING TO THE 25TH NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL, AND THE OFFICE OF PRESIDENT AND VICE-PRESIDENT TO UTILIZE SIHASIN FUND IN THE AMOUNT OF \$296,210.88 TO PURCHASE A NEW 140JOY-BR MOTOR GRADER FOR THE PINEDALE CHAPTER

WHEREAS. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., Section 3 (A) the Pinedale Chapter is a duly recognized certified chapter of the Navajo Nation Government, as listed at 11 N.N.C., part 1, section 10. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., Section 1 (B) Pinedale Chapter is vested with the authority to review all matters affecting the community and to make appropriate corrections when necessary and make recommendations to the Navajo Nation and other local agencies for appropriate actions; and

WHEREAS. The Pinedale Chapter currently has three heavy equipment, a 2008 Caterpillar 140M Motor Grader, a 2008 Caterpillar 420E Backhoe, and a 2020 Caterpillar 420 backhoe. Two of the three heavy equipment currently are over 15 years old and need replacement. Since 2008, the Pinedale Chapter has been providing public and private services to community members, and the Navajo people with heavy equipment need; and

WHEREAS. The Pinedale Chapter provides free services for burial, funeral, outhouse digging, and monthly road clearances. The Chapter provides paid services to private requests such as land clearance, and smaller projects within 10 miles of the Pinedale Chapter. Since 2018 the chapter has provided these paid services at costs to the public at \$35 per hour for backhoe and \$40 per hour for motor grader; with a \$5 increase in 2021; and

WHEREAS. There is a substantial increase in cost for repair and maintenance of the two older equipment as supported by the attachment to this resolution indicating the total amount paid from 2017 to today. In 2022 the Pinedale Chapter approved a resolution to include purchasing a new motor grader in its State of New Mexico ICIP (Infrastructure Capital Improvement Plan). During this past 60-day State of New Mexico Legislative session, the Pinedale Chapter successfully lobbied the State Legislature and Governor to support funding for a new motor grader. The State of New Mexico through the Capital Outlay Fund allocated \$100,000 towards the purchase of a new motor grader, under House Bill 505. Further the chapter has also researched possibly trading in the heavy equipment, but it was recommended to not trade-in due to less value of the old backhoe and motor grader.; and

WHEREAS. The Pinedale Chapter reached out to the sole area vendor for Caterpillar and requested a quote for a new 2023 140JOY-BR Motor Grader totaling \$369,285.07. See attached. With the approved funding of \$100,000 from the State of New Mexico, the Pinedale Chapter is still needing \$269,285.07. Below is the total amount requested from the Navajo Nation Sihasin Fund with the additional 10% contingency to request for the purposes of price increase in purchasing the equipment:

WHEREAS. It is therefore requested by the Pinedale Chapter to request the 25th Navajo Nation Council to approve a matching fund in the amount of \$296,210.88 which includes a 10% contingency cost that will be applied to the increase in cost to purchase the equipment. That the need is vitally important to continue to provide direct services to the Pinedale Chapter. And to further stipulate that there is a need for new motor graders to maintain public access roads to residents within Pinedale and throughout the region to the Mariano Lake and Churchrock communities. To further state for the record that the Pinedale Chapter does provide services to regional communities when requested.

NOW THEREFORE IT BE RESOLVED THAT the Pinedale Chapter approves resolution requesting, supporting, and recommending to the 25th Navajo Nation Council, and the Office of President and Vice-President to utilize Sihasin Fund in the amount of \$296,210.88 to purchase a new 140JOY-BR Motor Grader for the Pinedale Chapter.
