(A) The tenant is not offered reimbursement for all reasonable out-ofpocket expenses incurred in connection with the move; or

(3) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (h)(1) of this section, a person does not qualify as a "displaced person" (and is not sligible for relocation assistance under the URA or this section), if:

(i) The person moved into the property after the submission of the application for financial assistance to HUD. but, before signing a lease or commencing occupancy, was provided writ-ten natice of the project, its possible impact on the person (e.g., the person may be displaced, temporarily relocated or suffer a rent increase) and the fact that the person would not qualify as a "displaced person" or for any assistance provided under this section as a result of the project;

(8) Developing and publishing or posting a community development state-ment in such a manner as to afford af-

fected residents an opportunity to examine its contents and to submit com-

menta.

(4) Affording residents an opportunity to review and comment on the applicant's performance under any active community development block

(b) Prior to submission of the application to HUD, the applicant shall certhat it has met the requirements of paragraph (a) of this section; and

(1) Considered any comments and views expressed by residents and, if it deems it appropriate, modified the ap-

plication accordingly; and
(2) Made the modified application available to residents.

(c) No part of the requirement under paragraph (a) of this section shall be construed to restrict the responsibility and authority of the applicant for the development of the application and the execution of the grant. Accordingly, the citizen participation requirements

2015 Public Hearing Comments Eastern and Northern Agencies Huerfano Chapter October 15, 2015

Presentation outline and public comments:

An overview of the Navajo CDBG Program History and requirements was provided. The program started since 1976 and the current ceiling limit of \$5.5 million per funding cycle for the Navajo Nation was provided.

Proposal Requirements and Rating System: The two-year time frame for project completion and key components to determine construction ready category which include verification of Environmental Review Records, House wiring, Pre-engineering were shared. Also, the 100 point rating sheet and eligible activities were provided to the audience.

Application Process Flow Chart. The process and concerned entities' responsibilities during the ICDBG application cycle is shared with the audience. Important aspects provided are: Timely submission of the proposal to the CDBG Office; submit a complete proposal in accordance to the format and guidelines; provide additional information when requested during the grace period. See attached Public Hearing booklet.

Public Comments/Questions: For non-profit organization applicants, is economic development, public facilities, natural gas line and facilities eligible, has anyone ever submit a proposal for these activities.

Response: Those are eligible activities. Such activities were submitted before and the chapters are encouraged to submit such proposals for consideration.

Public Comments/Questions: The school that want to go in conjunction with chapters, will they also qualify as non-profit organization, New Mexico has a potential interest in these projects which will qualify as matching.

Response: CDBG does not have the requirements for the non –profit organization and needs to be recognized by the Navajo Nation thru Business Regulatory. A proposal from a Non-profit would need chapter support resolution.

Public Comments/Questions: Regarding the requirements, does CDBG use the CIO Land use plan and ICIP to increase the points on proposal, and how does CDBG get access to the chapters land use plan, the priority list is always shuffled.

Response: Land use plan or ICIP Plan is a new requirement under CDBG's rating factor Five — Coordination and will help increase the points in that category. The chapter can access their ICIP website with the help of CIO personnel.

In addition, the chapter resolution is an important factor and current, it shows commitment from the chapter for their clients and common objectives is health and community interest of the low and moderate families.

Public Comments/Questions: Explain further on pre-incurred contribution.

Response: For example, a project that will cost \$200K, the matching will only cover that. However, associated cost with House Wiring, Archeology, pre-engineering is the preliminary costs and they are not counted as matching; except the powerline activity, the program used the ROW cost as matching. Most chapters do not have matching funds, this is the reason why effort was made ROW cost is counted as matching.

Public Comments/Questions: the money that was spent for ROW, etc. I can use those as matching? In-kind services, there is no company that provides in-kind services, would like to see how NTUA does this service. CDEC gives credit until after the construction is done, due to previous complications. JEMEZ electric gives \$700 per home.

A utility upgrade, or extending a 3 phase, is there a contribution from NTUA?

Response: Yes, as long as they are paid in full. Consistency is needed how cost estimate is prepared with all Utility Companies to ensure proposal requirements are addressed. In-kind contribution is usually not included for a 3-phase powerline project, because the estimate is not home-specific meaning client's names are not listed.

Pinon Chapter
October 17, 2015

Presentation outline & public comments:

An overview of the Navajo CDBG Program History and requirements was provided. The program started since 1976 and the current ceiling limit of \$5.5 million per funding cycle for the Navajo Nation was provided.

Proposal Requirements and Rating System: The two-year time frame for project completion and key components to determine construction ready category which include verification of Environmental Review Records, House wiring, Pre-engineering were shared. Also, the 100 point rating sheet and eligible activities were provided to the audience.

Application Process Flow Chart. The process and concerned entities' responsibilities during the ICDBG application cycle is shared with the audience. Important aspects provided are: Timely submission of the proposal to the CDBG Office; submit a complete proposal in accordance to the format and guidelines; provide additional information when requested during the grace period. See attached Public Hearing booklet.

Public Comments/Questions: ROW is part of leveraging for higher rating on the proposals, was HUD able to accept that as project cost?

Response: HUD has accepted it in the past when the ROW was part of the project cost and when it wasn't paid.

Public Comments/Questions: Tell us about the guidelines, what are eligible and ineligible activities are all the requirements in the handouts.

Response: We will cover all sections of the Public Hearing booklet.

Public Comments/Questions: It says that the public hearing comments will be posted but have not seen anything or received a copy. CDBG gets drawdown, do you also get IDC, and did CDBG get 2013 and 2014 get funded for these grant years.

Response: Public comments are available at the CDBG office. CDBG program has generated indirect cost (IDC) money for the Navajo Nation but none has returned to the program. 2013 and 2014 CDBG application experience is as follows:

2013 ICDBG Application

Navajo Nation application lost points due to:

1. Not securing maximum points for leveraging. 25 percent or more of project would need to come from non-CDBG source. In addition to projects, HUD evaluated leveraging requirement against Admin cost we requested. In 1992, NN Council used to allocate \$1million for CDBG matching then went down to \$500k and today there is no NN matching money. 100 percent of staff salary also comes from ICDBG, none from NN. By bringing in ICDBG, the program has generated thousands of dollars in Indirect Direct Cost money for the Nation; and the program never received a dime back. Other tribes use their NAHASDA funds to match projects and able to secure maximum points for leveraging.

- 2. Staff Capacity. One of the key staff did not receive full points for successful experience within the past 5 years. The same key staff received points in prior years.
- 3. Operation & Maintenance. HUD rating panel evaluated NN utility projects like a commercial building. For example, O/M Elements required further cost breakdown for insurance to do a utility project. Prior years the program provided a basic breakdown and we received points. Under 2014 the O/M insurance component was no longer a requirement for infrastructure project.
- 4. Audits. Lost points although the program has cleared all of its audit findings. HUD evaluated this factor as a cross-cutting issue, meaning, if other NN federal HUD programs have findings, it is a strike against the program. The program received points prior to 2013.
- 5. HUD rating panel turnover. The program noticed there are new HUD staff on a rating panel who are not familiar with the living conditions on Navajo land. Four HUD staff had recently retired and all of them had visited Navajo homes in remote areas; and visited I.H.S. Sanitation Facilities Construction and NTUA staff and were aware with O/M functions within the Nation.
- 6. Shift toward Housing Rehab Projects. Under 2013, over 90 percent of the tribal ICDBG applications awarded were for Housing Rahab projects. HUD favorably awarded Housing Rehab projects, a shift away from utility projects. The Navajo Nation has been the only applicant requesting ICDBG for powerline and waterline projects for families in remote areas across the reservation.
- 7. Under 2012 application the NN received maximum funding. The application scored the highest and the program was awarded Most Valuable Partnership Award. Therefore, there are inconsistencies between 2012 and 2013 application results.
- 8. ICDBG is a competitive grant application. Ceiling limit is \$5.5 million for the Navajo Nation. ICDBG is not an entitlement like NAHASDA to NHA. ICDBG is an Indian set-aside. Therefore, ICDBG is not a set-aside for Navajo. There is no guarantee the tribe will receive ICDBG each year. Between 1992 and 2012 the Navajo Nation received funding each year, many times maximum amount. Prior to 1992 the Nation didn't received funding for over two years. Under 2013, the tribes within the Southwest region (140 federally recognized tribes) compete for \$19.8 million. 82 applications were submitted for 94 projects, only 24 projects were awarded. In this competition, the amount of requests exceeded \$81.4 million.

The program challenged HUD on each item, but to no avail, we didn't succeed. There are other factors but these are the highlights

2014 ICDBG Application

2014 ICDBG application was submitted through electronic submission before the deadline date and time. The CDBG's temporary office location at Field House Rd, Bldg # 2474 in Fort Defiance, in an old dilapidated modular structure. The grant application contained 470 pages (72 MB). First submission was kicked back; and second submission went through before timeline, but it took half an hour until we received a confirmation from grants.gov website which was after the timeline. The staff was not aware of Kilobits Per Second (KBPS) system being insufficient to accommodate the staffs' workload like submission an enormous application submission. The staff electronically submitted 2013 application from Gallup; and 2012 and prior applications were submitted from WR Administration Building 2.

At this temporary location, the program is experiencing a low internet speed since we moved from admin. building #2 in January 2013. The DSL internet speed doesn't have the capacity to serve multiple staff and a large workload. Every day, the internet goes off and on, especially when the volume of workload is heavy.

The program requested DCD-IT to up the internet capacity because its low internet service is of great hindrance to the program operations and it limits the staff ability to perform efficiently.

Public Comments/Questions: Housing program needs to be elaborated on description of what decent housing means as far as suitable living conditions.

Response: When the health problems are alleviated or reduced of the clients resulting from funding the project, the living conditions will be improved.

Public Comments/Questions: If a program, department or entity did not get funded from your program for the past five years, based on what method do you use from your office to evaluate points that one may be entitled to a particular proposal.

Response: Five components on CDBG rating scale are used to evaluate projects. \$5.5 million is the ceiling limit per funding cycle on completive basis for the Navajo Nation based on population. This ceiling is not enough to serve more projects per year. An entitlement basis type of funding allocation like NHA and other federal entitlement programs will provide a based amount to Navajo Nation and other tribes. This might be less than \$5.5 million but at least will provide funding each year.

Public Comments/Questions: Sample of the breakdown on family size regarding the income level and field assessment to each client, in the survey we are seeking to determine one thing is the income level of low and moderate income, does that mean that if the project is successful the 51% that is low income, the 49% that is over income, are they still part of the p/l project.

Response: The clients' income is evaluated against HUD's low/moderate income limits by counties which are issued every year by HUD. Rating factor for low/moderate income section is a sliding scale and it assigns up to 12 points. 85 percent or more of L/M awards 12 points.

Public Comments/Questions: Interest to see proceeds for the old wool building in Chinle, will this considered multi-purpose or governmental building.

Response: This would be considered as an economic activity which is an eligible activity.

Public Comments/Questions: What do the numbers in the capacity section represent?

Response: The capacity factor part of the HUD's rating system. This factor relates to Managerial/Technical/Administrative capabilities and past performance of the Program. This factor assigns up to 33 points. At HUD level, in order to be considered and reviewed, it has to receive a minimum of 15 points.

Public Comments/Questions: Do you accept online proposal submission, or does it have to be hard copy?

Response: Paper submission of the proposal is acceptable. Online or fax submission is not acceptable. The program will take this under advisement; and will provide recommendation for future CDBG application process.

An Agenda is established for each hearing. The Hearing Body follows the Order of Business on the Agenda. This includes:

- 2015 PH Outline Packet
- Notice of Public Hearing
- 2015 Application Preparation Schedule
- Sign-in-Sheet
- Comment Sheet

TYPES OF PUBLIC HEARINGS

Public hearings can generally be classified as Quasi-Judicial or Legislative or Federal Regulations. The program will be presenting a Federal Regulatory & Program Review matters usually involve issues of Community-wide scope. Examples are recommended changes to Federal/HUD regulations or Community Development needs.

HEARING BODIES

The Hearing Body will be the following:

- Division of Community Development
- Community Housing & Infrastructure Department
- Community Development Block Grant Program
- RDC Committee resolution to certify the Citizen Participation requirement

PREPARATION TASK

Distributing Information in Advance — Information is disseminated to the public in advance of the Hearing so they can become familiar with the matters and aware of meeting location, time and date.

Space for the Meeting — Suitable meeting space is provided. Staff will arrange the facility, open and set it up in advance.

Special Equipment — Staff to arrange for equipment such as microphones, amplifier/speaker systems, tape recorders, projectors, power cords, equipment stands, charts, markers, and other items to be available as needed. Locate the electrical outlets needed to operate power equipment.

HEARING PROCEDURES

The staff presiding over the hearing will call the meeting to order and introduce each new item of business. This individual has the authority to take any necessary measures to control the hearing, to include closing the meeting, clearing the hearing room, and calling the public in one at a time to testify.

Members of the Staff will participate to introduce the Application purpose.

PUBLIC TESTIMONY

- Anyone wishing to testify must sign in on a comment sheet and turn it in to the Hearing Secretary

IN SUPPORT/NEUTRAL/OPPOSED: Persons in support/neutral/opposed to the community development needs or regulations changes will be given a suitable time period to present testimony 5-10 minutes. The Hearing Body may hear all of the testimony in support, in neutral, then all in opposition, or may alternate.

REBUTTAL: The Applicant will be given a suitable time period to rebut testimony presented, generally 10 to 15 minutes.

The Hearing Body may ask questions during the presentation. Questions to the Applicant from the public must be addressed to the Hearing Body. The Hearing Body will determine whether to ask the question of the Applicant.

HEARING BODY DISCUSSION AND DELIBERATIONS

After closing public testimony, the Program staff will record the comments, questions, recommendations and rebuttal. Hearing Body will discuss the issue with the Program Staff.

The Staff will not make informal recommendation at the public hearing. After the Hearing, a signed recommendation written will be submitted for filing at the CDBG Program.

On March 25, 2015, the Department of Justice (DOJ) provided a presentation on the Executive Order. During that presentation, DOJ also provided recommendations when processing the Community Development Block Grant (CBDG) grant application. The grant application instruction requires that prospective grantee obtain approval of a Citizen Participation document. The Citizen Participation requires a tribal resolution confirming that prospective grantee has met the citizen participation requirement as required by 24 C.F.R. § 1003.604.

In this case, Community Housing and Infrastructure Department (CHID) would be processing two (2) transactions Grant Application: Citizen the Participation related to Agreement and the Grant Application. DOJ previously advised that in processing the Citizen Participation Agreement to use the Executive Review Form, and to list this document as "Other." As you will note on the "Other" area is blank. add "Office incorporate the information. Please also Management and Budget" and "Office of the Attorney General" for the Reviewers. Office of Management and Budget (OMB) included as a Reviewer because Contract and Grant Section of OMB serves as the contracting officer.
