


23 **Section One. Authority**

- 24 A. The Navajo Nation established the Resources and Development Committee  
25 as a Navajo Nation Council standing committee and as such gave the  
26 Committee oversight over Navajo Nation Chapters. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(9),  
27 500 (A), 501 (C)(1).  
28 B. The Navajo Nation established the Budget and Finance Committee (BFC) as  
29 a Navajo Nation Council standing committee and as such empowered BFC  
30

1 to review and recommend to the Navajo Nation Council the management of  
2 all funds. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(9), 300 (A), 301 (B)(2).

3 C. The Navajo Nation Council established the Naabik'fyáti' Committee as a  
4 Navajo Nation standing committee and as such proposed legislation that  
5 requires final action by the Navajo Nation Council shall be assigned to the  
6 Naabik'fyáti' Committee. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(9), 700 (A).

7 D. The Title 12 Appropriations Act Supplemental Appropriation requirements  
8 include:

- 9 1. When the Controller identifies additional sources of revenues above  
10 and beyond the initial or current revenue projections, supplemental  
11 appropriations may be allocated by the Navajo Nation Council. 12  
12 N.N.C. § 820(L).
- 13 2. Supplemental appropriations made from non-recurring revenues shall  
14 only be made for non-recurring operations or purposes, as set forth at  
15 § 820(F). The Controller of the Navajo Nation shall be responsible for  
16 designating recurring and non-recurring revenues. 12 N.N.C. § 820(L).
- 17 3. All requests for annual operating funds and supplemental funds shall be  
18 submitted to the Office of Management and Budget ("OMB") for budget  
19 impact analysis. 12 N.N.C. § 820(M).

20 E. The Title 12 Capital Improvement Process includes:

- 21 1. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 810(F), "Capital Improvement" means a major  
22 project undertaken by the Navajo Nation that is generally not recurring on  
23 an annual basis and which fits within one or more of the following  
24 categories:
  - 25 i. All projects requiring debt obligation or borrowing;
  - 26 ii. Any acquisition or lease of land;
  - 27 iii. Purchase of major equipment or vehicles, with a life expectancy of  
28 five years or more, valued in excess of an amount to be established  
29 by the Controller;

- iv. Major building improvements that are not routine maintenance expenses and that substantially enhance the value or extend the useful life of a structure;
- v. Construction of new buildings or facilities including engineering, design, and other pre-construction costs with an estimated cost in excess of an amount to be determined by the Controller; and/or
- vi. Major equipment or furnishing required to furnish new buildings or other projects, the cost of which is above a certain amount to be established by the Controller.

2. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820 (I), the “[d]evelopment of the Capital Budget shall be coordinated with development of the Operating Budget. All budget requests for capital improvements shall be in compliance with an adopted Capital Improvement Plan and shall not be approved unless in compliance with the Plan.”

3. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 860 (C)(2) “[t]he appropriation portion of the Capital Improvement Plan is subject to approval of the Navajo Nation Council upon recommendation of the Budget and Finance Committee. Any modification or amendment affecting the approved Capital Improvement Plan is subject to review and concurrence by the Resources and Development Committee prior to consideration by the Navajo Nation Council.”

**Section Two. Findings**

- A. This is a funding request for the construction of the Mexican Water Power Line Extension Project within the Mexican Water Chapter, further described at Exhibit D.
- B. The supplemental funding request forms are attached as Exhibit A.
- C. The Office of Management and Budget has provided a memorandum satisfying the requirements of 12 N.N.C. § 820(M) and is attached as Exhibit B.

- 1 D. The Office of the Controller has provided a memorandum dated September 8,  
2 2017 indicating the balance in the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance as  
3 of September 8, 2017 is \$31,258,307. This memorandum is provided to meet  
4 the requirements of 12 N.N.C, 820 (L), however the Controller of the Navajo  
5 Nation has not designated the funds as recurring or non-recurring. This  
6 memorandum is attached as Exhibit C.
- 7 E. The request for funds for construction of the Mexican Water Power Line  
8 Extension Project within the Mexican Water Chapter is not included in the  
9 Title 12 Capital Improvement Plan because the Plan was rescinded by Navajo  
10 Nation Council. CAP-23-17
- 11 F. Any modification or amendment affecting the approved Capital Improvement  
12 Plan is subject to review and concurrence by the Resources and Development  
13 Committee prior to consideration by the Navajo Nation Council. 12 N.N.C.  
14 § 860.
- 15 G. The Navajo Nation finds it in the best interest to waive 12 N.N.C. §§ 820(I)  
16 and 860 (C) regarding the Capital Improvement for the Mexican Water  
17 Chapter proposed Power Line Extension Project.
- 18 H. The Navajo Nation finds it in the best interest of the Navajo people to approve  
19 this supplemental appropriation request.
- 20

21 **Section Three. Waiving 12 N.N.C. §§ 820(I) 1 And 860 (C) Regarding Funding for**  
22 **the Tselani-Cottonwood Water Line Extension Project.**

23 The Navajo Nation Council hereby waives 12 N.N.C. §§ 820(I) and 860(C)  
24 with regard to the Mexican Water Power Line Extension Project.

25

26 **Section Four. Approving the Supplemental Appropriation from the Unreserved,**  
27 **Undesignated Fund Balance in the Amount of \$1,634,047.00 for the**  
28 **construction of the Mexican Water Power Line Extension Project.**

- 29 A. This supplemental appropriation of \$1,634,047.00 shall be from that amount  
30 of funds that exceeds the minimum fund balance of the Unreserved,

1 Undesignated Fund Balance as determined by the Office of the Controller  
2 and to Business Unit Number *–new number*.

3 B. The Navajo Nation hereby approves the supplemental appropriation from the  
4 Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance to the Mexican Water Power Line  
5 Extension Project, Business Unit *New Number* for \$1,634,047.00.

7 **Section Five. Effective Date**

8 The provisions of this Act shall become effective in accord with 2 N.N.C. § 221(B).



Subject: Financial Update-(General Fund Revenue, Expenditures, UUFB)

The gross General Fund Revenues, (see Exhibit "A"), as of August 31, 2017 is \$203,053,235, (see Footnote 1). The total General Fund set asides is \$ \$51,749,599 (Footnote 2). The Net Revenue for the General Fund is \$151,303,727 (see Footnote 3). The permanent fund income transfer is \$24,411,000 (Footnote 4). The reserve taken for the permanent fund income transfer is \$2,885,000 (Footnote 5). The grand total revenue for the General Fund is \$172,829,727 (see Footnote 6) which is 98.78% of the projection.

Next, are the total expenditures by Branch, (see Exhibit "B"), as of August 31, 2017, the Legislative Branch has expenditures of \$14,836,331 (see Footnote 1a); encumbrances of \$822,493 (see Footnote 1b) with a remaining budget of \$3,307,669 (see Footnote 1c). The Executive Branch expenditures are \$162,500,722 (see Footnote 2a); encumbrances are \$7,206,122 (see Footnote 2b) with a remaining budget of \$37,797,219 (see Footnote 2c). The Judicial Branch expenditures are \$11,718,156 (see Footnote 3a); with encumbrances of \$73,692 (see Footnote 3b) and remaining budget of \$2,356,349 (see Footnote 3c). Total General Fund expenditures are \$189,055,209 (see Footnote 4a); total encumbrances are \$8,102,307 (see Footnote 4b) with an overall remaining budget of \$43,461,236 (see Footnote 4c).

The updated Undesignated Unreserved Fund Balance (UUFB), (see Exhibit "C") as of September 8, 2017 is \$31,258,217. The Fiscal Year 2016 audited numbers were approved via CJY-51-17 and an amount of \$11, 728,198 that was previously reserved for debt service for capital projects was returned back to the UUFB with the approval of CJY-50-17. These two amounts have been incorporated into this new schedule.



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## I. PROJECT SUMMARY

The Mexican Water Chapter is located along the northern perimeter of the Navajo Nation straddling the Arizona-Utah state line. The chapter has a population of approximately 976 people. The Mexican Water Chapter is contending with social challenges common and prevalent across Navajo land with progressive planning, affiliating, and enactment of solutions.

In collaboration with Navajo Tribal Utility Authority and Mexican Water Chapter and State of Utah Navajo Revitalization Fund (NRF) would like to construct Twelve (12) miles of **new three-phase power line** from the Red Mesa Substation to the Multi-Purpose Building (50 Acre site). The Red Mesa Substation has the capacity available to serve the three-phase distribution power.

Navajo Tribal Utility Authority (NTUA), Mexican Water Chapter and the State of Utah Navajo Trust Fund (UNTF) are very much committed to the project. Both entities have committed \$229,380.68 toward the total project costs.

The archeological clearance, environmental assessment, and legal survey for Right Of Way acquisition has been paid for by utilizing the Mexican Water Chapter Capital Outlay Fund account. Mexican Water new Three-Phase power line extension is construction ready. The Three phase power line will serve multiple buildings in the future that will be located within the fifty (50) acre development

The Navajo Nation certified the Mexican Water Chapter Comprehensive Land Use Plan in 2007. The Land Use Plan identified a new site to anchor community growth and sustainability including construction and upgrading its utilities infrastructure for future community and economic developments. The leadership of the Mexican Water Chapter Community Land Use Planning (CLUP) Committee, administrative guidance of the chapter, Chapter Manager (CM), and partnerships with a multitude of agencies resulted in the extension of the Three Phase Power Line Project presented for FY 2017 Supplemental funding from the Undesignated Unreserved Fund Balance (UUFB) by this application.

The hard work and determination of the Mexican Water Chapter have resulted in the completion of preliminary planning and leveraging of \$129,380.70 in matching funds. The Mexican Water Chapter is requesting \$1,634,047.20 from the 2017 Supplemental funding appropriations from the Undesignated Unreserved Fund Balance (UUFB).

## II. INTRODUCTION

### **A. Chapter Profile**

The Mexican Water Chapter was created as a local government by the Navajo Nation Council on August 15, 1955. The Mexican Water Chapter is a dual state community with a location straddling the Arizona-Utah state line. The larger portion of the community is situated in Utah's San Juan County with a smaller section extending into Arizona's Apache County. The Mexican Water Chapter is located in the Northern Navajo Agency in the Navajo Nation's agency system. The 2000 Census recorded a population of 815 for the Mexican Water Chapter. The Navajo Nation Election Office currently has 641 voters registered with Mexican Water Chapter.

The newly constructed Mexican Water Chapter Multipurpose building complex 1 is located approximately 2 miles north of the U.S. Highway 160 and Utah 191 junction. Kayenta and Red Mesa are located to the west and east on highway 160. Boundary Butte is the most distinctive landmark in the Mexican Water community. This geographic formation is 543 feet high and stands majestically in the chapter's eastern region. The butte is known as "Rabbit Ears" to the local population. The Mexican Water Chapter lies in a region that's economically depressed. Employment opportunities are scarce in the community. Jobs often require considerable travel elsewhere. The commercial hub of Mexican Water includes a convenience store (formerly trading post), restaurant, and laundry on highway 160.

### **B. Background of Planned Project**

The Navajo Nation certified the Mexican Water Chapter Comprehensive Land Use Plan in 2007. The land Use Plan identified a need for a new site to anchor community growth and sustainability including construction of public facilities and a new three-phase power line to serve its 50 acre land development according to its developed master plan. The leadership of the Mexican Water Chapter Community Land Use Planning Committee (CLUPC), administrative guidance of the chapter manager (CM), and partnership with a multitude of agencies resulted in requesting for main line construction of Twelve (12) miles of a new three-phase power line to its 50 acre site development and to present for AML funding by this application.

The Mexican Water Chapter CLUPC has worked together diligently with the land ownership/permittees to withdraw 50 acres of land to develop a community/economic project for the benefit of its community. Land User consent and chapter approval were obtained in 2008 with earnestly planning the project.

### **C. Primary Intent and Outcome**

The primary intent of this project is to provide additional power line capacity to community to serve and proposed development in the community particularly to the Red Water Ranch Development site. The outcome is a new 12.3 mile three-phase power line extending from Red Mesa Substation to Red Water Ranch Development located in Mexican Water, Utah.

### **D. Administrative Capacity**

The executive administrator for the Mexican Water Chapter is the Chapter Manager (CM). The current CM has been employed by the chapter for over fifteen years. The CM is thoroughly familiar with the Navajo Nation governmental process, has hands-on experience with project management, acquainted with the

rules and regulations of numerous tribal programs and has access to technical assistance from the Northern Navajo Administrative Service Center (ASC), Navajo Utah Commission (NUC), and Utah Navajo Trust Fund (UNTF) Administration. The CM has earned the respect of chapter officials, trust of the community, established excellent working relationships with the Community Land-Use Planning Committee (CLUP), and funding partners.

**E. Project Management Experience**

The Mexican Water Chapter accumulated valuable project management experience and knowledge with a variety of capital projects undertaken by the community. The Mexican Water Chapter has successfully completed one AML Multi-purpose Building Complex 1 project since 2011 totaling \$1,108,000.00 in AML/UNRF/Chapter Capital Outlay General Funds appropriations. The projects were closed-out without any findings. The Mexican Water Chapter has also successfully completed infrastructure projects financed by the Navajo Nation Capital Improvement Program (CIP) and the tribally-administered Abandoned Mine Lands/Uranium Mill Tailings Remedial Action – Public Facilities Funding. And from the State of Utah, the Mexican Water Chapter has managed numerous housing and power line extension projects with the support of Utah Navajo Trust Fund and Utah Navajo Revitalization Fund (NRF) appropriations. Finally in collaboration with Navajo Utah Commission, the Mexican Water Chapter has constructed homes financed by the Utah O'lene Walker Housing Loan fund (OWHLF), USDA Rural Development, and HUD-Rural Housing & Economic Development. (RHED).

**F. Status of the Chapter's Management**

As an entity of the Navajo Nation, all federal funds received by the Mexican Water Chapter are administered by the Navajo Nation Office of Contracts & Grants. Tribal Council appropriations are handled by Navajo Nation General Accounting. The Navajo Tribal Utility Authority will serve as the lead agency for the project to facilitate a timely flow of project spending. The Mexican Water Chapter will be responsible for all performance reporting required by the funding agencies.

**G. Status of Land Use Plan**

The Mexican Water Chapter proudly approved their Comprehensive Land Use Plan on December 7, 2007 by resolution no. MWC071207-80011. The chapter's Land Use Plan was certified by the Navajo Nation Transportation & Community Development Committee (TCDC) at the Mexican Water Chapter on December 20, 2007. The Mexican Water Chapter Community Land Use Planning Committee, chapter officials, and administrator worked closely with consultant JJ Clacs & Company to complete this document. The location for this particular project is identified as the Red Water Ranch site in the Land Use Plan. The Mexican Water Chapter CLUP Committee remains very active in assisting the chapter with strategic planning including development and advancement of the Mexican Water Multipurpose Complex Project. The Mexican Water Chapter is also working with other Utah chapters in supplementing their individual land-use plans with a regional water plan in collaboration with consultant Brown & Caldwell Environmental Engineers of Salt Lake City, Utah.

**H. Chapter Capital Plan**

The Mexican Water Chapter's capital plan includes prioritized goals including infrastructure development for residential utilities, preservation/development of housing stock, and development of community facilities. The Mexican Water Chapter is currently master-planning 50 acres recently withdrawn to serve as the new hub of the Mexican Water community. The first phase will include 50 acres which include a multipurpose building complex 1 with a town hall facility and multipurpose building complex 2 Senior Citizens Center. This project has been entered into the Navajo Nation's computerized infrastructure project tracking system identified as WIND (Woven Information of Navajo Data).

### III. NEEDS AND GOALS OF THE PROJECT

#### A. *Need and Extent of Project*

The Mexican Water Chapter is a strong advocate to provide improved living conditions for all its community members. Therefore, the Mexican Water Chapter has identified the new Three-Phase Project as a vital chapter project for a power line extension to provide electrical services to the development area.

The chapter is in need of construction funds for construction of new three-phase power line extension. The engineering and design have been completed and the project is construction ready, thus Navajo Nation Capital Improvement funds are needed to construct this project.

#### B. *Number of People to Be Served*

The people to be served are the Mexican Water residents and visitors. The 2010 Census found the Mexican Water Chapter community population to be 933. In a study entitled "2005-2006 Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy of the Navajo Nation", the Navajo Nation Division of Economic Development projected the Mexican Water Chapter population to grow to 976 in 2010. The calculation was based on an annual growth rate of 1.82%. The Division of Economic Development has conducted regular surveys since 1991 and calculated the unemployment rate on the Navajo Nation to be 27.9% in 1990, 42.16% in 2001, and 48.04% in 2004.

#### C. *Impact and Benefits of Project*

The new three-phase power line extension will serve the new 50 acre development site that consists of various types delivery program that will be made available to serve the Utah portion of the chapter and its communities. The identified facilities on the master plan will require 3-phase power source to ensure that facilities will be operated and maintained by those various programs to be located on the site.

Future plans envision a truck stop/gas station, RV park, vendor village for local artisans and cabins for tourist accommodations. This project demonstrates community involvement, proactive leadership and creation of partnerships can collaboratively bring ambitious plans to fruition.

#### D. *Goals and Objectives*

This project is a community project that is consistent with the guiding principles adopted by the Mexican Water chapter. The community recently donated 50 acres of land for phased development including the initial construction of multi-purpose complex 1 and 2.

The specific goals and objectives of the project are twofold:

- To construct 12.3 miles of three phase power line extension, and
- To provide capacity for future development

With the approval of the combined resources, Mexican Water Chapter is most willing to complete this project as soon as possible. Completion of this project is a priority of the chapter.

## IV. SCOPE OF WORK

The three-phase power line extension project extends from existing Red Mesa Substation located twelve (12) miles northeast of the proposed project. Power line will be extended for 12 miles to serve the multi-purpose 50 acre site. The existing Red Mesa Sub-station has the capacity to distribute power.

Mexican Water Phase Three Power line Extension project will be implemented jointly by a Sub grant agreement between the Navajo Tribal Utility Authority and the Navajo Nation. Navajo Tribal Utility Authority will be responsible for the electrical services line to see that ne necessary utilities are tapped into the main substation. Navajo Tribal Utility Authority will be responsible for the main construction and will handle the operation and maintenance responsibilities once the project is completed.

### **A. Role of Key Personnel & Entities**

The Mexican Water Chapter has recognized the importance and necessity of a team concept in planning and implementing this project. The Mexican Water Chapter will play a major role in the construction of this project. A chapter organizational chart showing the relationship of key personnel is included in the supporting documents. The Mexican Water Chapter created a planning team consisting of chapter leadership including CLUP Committee, chapter staff, project architect, administrators from Utah Navajo Trust Fund (UNTF) and NUC as well as funding agencies. The Navajo Tribal Utility Authority will in fact serve as lead agency and fiscal agent for the project.

Critical contributions were necessary from utility companies NTUA as well as representatives for communications and transportation to produce a well-planned project. The UNRHF administrator will provide additional construction and contracting consultation. The Mexican Water Chapter Manager will serve as the project manager responsible for coordination, implementation, completion of project and keeping the community abreast of progress. The chapter's two council delegates will be available for SAS Review processing support and committee presentations.

## ***B. Project Tracker***

The project tracker form provided by Navajo Nation CIO program will be used to track this project so that all stakeholders will know when significant phases of the project have been reached or completed. According to this form, this project 2 is in phase 6 – Construction with pre-design to design development completed. Only the construction and bidding/award phases are needed.

## V. BUDGET INFORMATION

In the interest of sharing cost, the Mexican Water Chapter is requesting the financial and technical assistance of several sources to bring this urgently needed project to the people and its community. With the legal surveys, environmental assessments, archeological clearances included, the total project cost is estimated to **\$1,863,427.90**

The total project cost for the Three Phase Power Line Extension Project is \$1,863,427.90. The cost includes required clearances, staking, preliminary drawings, and construction. In planning this project, the Mexican Water Chapter recognized the costliness of this undertaking, understood the need to share cost, and created match-funding partnerships to accomplish the project. The Mexican Water Chapter accumulated \$129,380.70 in matching funds. The cost-sharing effort includes the Utah Navajo Revitalization Fund, State of Utah agencies, are contributing \$129,380.70 respectively. The Mexican Water Chapter is requesting \$1,634,047.20 from 2017 Supplemental funding appropriations from the Undesignated Unreserved Fund Balance (UUFB) for the Three Phase Power Line Extension Project.

1. Although paragraph #2-B refers to attached funding forms, there are no budget forms and no supplemental funding proposal summary form. The project forms should be updated with the new FY 2018 forms and signed by DCD/CPMD.
2. The Legislation is outdated. The supplemental proposal includes a quote from NTUA dated January, 2016. Is NTUA quote still valid?
3. The resolution refers to Exhibit "C" as the Office of the Controller memorandum. However, proceeding this memorandum are two pages which actually are a part of Exhibit "C". The document is not properly appended, apparently.
4. The Appropriation Act, at 12 NNC 820(I), requires that capital projects comply with an adopted Capital Plan. Currently, there is no approved Capital Plan.
5. The Budget Instructions Manual states that Supplemental Funding requests for Capital Projects shall be submitted to DCD Capital Project Management Department for review, guidance, and advice. There is no indication that this was done.
