TITLE OF RESOLUTION: AN ACT RELATING TO LAW AND ORDER COMMITTEE, NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; AMENDING 2 N.N.C §104 AND 11 N.N.C. § 8(B), REGARDING COUNCIL DELEGATES SERVING ON BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS OR SERVING AS MEMBERS OR AS SHAREHOLDERS IN ANY ENTERPRISE OF THE NAVAJO NATION

**PURPOSE:** This resolution will address and restrict Council Delegates serving on boards and commissions or serving as members or as shareholders in any enterprise of the Navajo Nation.

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review each proposed resolution in detail.

17	BE IT ENACTED:	
18	Section One. Authority	
19	A. The Law and Order Committee of the Navajo Nation Council has the authority to	
20	review and make recommendations to the Navajo Nation Council on proposed	
21	amendments to and enactments to the Navajo Nation Code. 2 N.N.C. §601(B)(14).	
22	B. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §164(A)(9), "a proposed resolution that requires final action by	
23	the Navajo Nation Council [must] be assigned to standing committee(s) having authority	
24	over the subject matter at issue and the Naabik'íyátí Committee."	
25	C. The Navajo Nation Council, pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §102(A), is the "governing body of	
26	the Navajo Nation" A primary role of Navajo Nation Council delegates is policy-	
27	making.

29	Section Two. Findings	
30	A. Elected officials of the Navajo Nation must avoid conflicts of interest, including	

personal and financial conflicts. 2 N.N.C. §3741 et seq. The Navajo Ethics in Government Law provides that elected officials "shall not ... [h]ave direct or indirect financial or other economic interests nor engage in such other employment or economic activity which ... necessarily involve inherent substantial conflict, or appears to have such substantial conflict, with their responsibilities and duties as public officials ... of the Navajo Nation." 2 N.N.C. § 3747(A), Restrictions Against Incompatible Interests or Employment.

- B. For Council Delegates, "conflicts" provisions of law include serving as an elected official of the federal or state government, being employed as an employee of the federal or state government, practicing law while serving as a delegate or serving simultaneously as a school board member. See 2 N.N.C. § 104.
- C. Under current law, delegates, by virtue of serving as delegate to the Navajo Nation Council, may serve as directors or commissioners of Navajo Nation boards and commissions, respectively. Delegates may also serve as shareholder representatives for companies owned by the Navajo Nation or as "members" of such companies, including limited liability companies.
- D. The policy of the Navajo Nation is that all elected officials of the Navajo Nation must represent the interests of constituents electing them into office. All potential conflicts must be avoided. Multiple duties of elected officials may cause potential conflicts in decision-making. Other problems concerning multiple duties are those related to conflicting meeting schedules, in particular, between delegate meetings and meetings of boards, commissions and enterprises.
- E. The duties and responsibilities of Council Delegates should be limited to setting policy for the Navajo Nation and lawmaking, such as the review and consideration of proposed bills. Delegates should not serve on Navajo Nation boards and commissions, or serve as "members" for or shareholders to any Navajo Nation enterprise.

## Section Three. Amending 2 N.N.C. § 104

The Navajo Nation Council hereby amends 2 N.N.C. §104 as follows:

#### § 104. Incompatible service

- A. No person shall serve as a delegate if he or she is in the permanent employment of the United States or any state or any subdivisions thereof; nor shall an elected official of the United States or the several states thereof serve as a delegate. This Section shall not apply to service on a sehool board or in an elective county office.
- B. No person shall be eligible for election to the Navajo Nation Council if that person is permanently employed or an elected official as described in § 104(A).
- C. If any delegate, after his/her election, enters such service, the delegate shall immediately forfeit his/her office as a Council Delegate.
- D. No Council Delegate shall engage in the private practice of law while serving as a Navajo Nation Council Delegate.
- E. No Council Delegate shall serve as a member of a Navajo Nation board or commission, or serve in any capacity as a representative of any Navajo Nation enterprise, corporation or company, including member and shareholder representative.

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## Section Four. Amending 11 N.N.C. §8(B)

The Navajo Nation hereby amends the Election Code at 11 N.N.C. § 8(B) as follows:

## §8. Qualifications for office

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B. Qualifications for Delegate to the Navajo Nation Council:

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 Must not, if elected, serve in any other elected Navajo Nation Office with the exception of the office(s) of the school board(s).

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11. Must not be in the permanent employment of the United States or any state or subdivision thereof, or be an elected official of the United States

12. Candidates elected, who serve as members of Navajo Nation boards or commissions, or serve in any capacity as representatives of any Navajo Nation enterprise, corporation or company, including members and shareholder representatives, shall resign from such positions before taking the Council Delegate oath of office. Delegates sworn into office as delegates shall not simultaneously serve as members of Navajo Nation boards or commissions, or serve in any capacity as representatives of any Navajo Nation enterprise, corporation or company, including members and shareholder representatives.

## Section Five. Effective date; directive to amend Plans of Operation

A. The amendments enacted herein shall be effective pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 221(B). Provided, the effective date for implementation purposes shall be January 16, 2019.

B. Oversight committees, with the assistance of the affected boards, commissions and enterprises, and the divisions, departments and programs responsible for assisting such boards, commissions and enterprises, shall within 90 days of the approval of this action amend the respective Plans of Operation to ensure that delegate positions are abolished. The effective dates of these new Plans of Operation, for purposes of implementing the new provisions enacted herein, shall be January 16, 2019.

#### Section Six. Codification

The provisions of these amendments of the Navajo Nation Code shall be codified by the Office of Legislative Counsel. The Office of Legislative Counsel shall incorporate such amendments in the next codification of the Navajo Nation Code.

## Section Seven. Savings Clause

Should any provision of these amendments be determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or the District Courts of the Navajo Nation without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, those amendments that are not determined invalid shall remain the law of the Nation.

As to format, the resolution as drafted is legally sufficient. Regarding substance, as with any legislation, it can be subject to review by the courts in the event of proper challenge. Please ensure that this particular resolution request is precisely what you want. Further, the Speaker may decide to assign this proposed resolution to other committees than ones suggested in the title of the resolution. Passage and adoption of the resolution will require a 2/3 vote of the full membership of the Navajo Nation Council. CD-68-80, clause 6.
