# RESOLUTION OF THE RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE 23rd Navajo Nation Council --- Third Year, 2017

#### AN ACTION

RELATING TO RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT; APPROVING THE GRANT OF RIGHT-OF-WAY TO RAMAH NAVAJO UTILITY AUTHORITY FOR INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE OF THE RAMAH NAVAJO MOUNTAIN VIEW ESTATES WATER SYSTEM EXTENSION PROJECT LOCATED ON NAVAJO NATION FEE LANDS IN THE RAMAH CHAPTER VICINITY, NAVAJO NATION (CIBOLA COUNTY, NEW MEXICO)

#### BE IT ENACTED:

#### SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. Section §501 (B)(2), The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council has the authority to grant final approval for all land withdrawals, non-mineral leases, permits, licenses, rights-of-way, surface easements and bonding requirements on Navajo Nation lands and unrestricted (fee) land. This authority shall include subleases, modifications, assignments, leasehold encumbrances, transfers, renewals, and terminations.

#### SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. Ramah Navajo Utility Authority, P.O. Box 207, Pine Hill, New Mexico 87357, has submitted a right-of-way (ROW) application for to construct, operate and maintain water distribution lines, up to 6 inches in diameter on, over and across Navajo Nation Fee Lands in Ramah Chapter vicinity, Cibola County, New Mexico. The application request is attached hereto and incorporated herein as **Exhibit "A."**
- B. The proposed right-of-way is described on the maps attached hereto and incorporated herein as **Exhibit "B."**
- C. The General Land Development Department with the Division of Natural Resources has determined that there are no grazing permittees within the project site. The General Land Development Department memorandum dated February 13, 2017 is attached hereto as **Exhibit "C."**

- D. A waiver of consideration is requested by the Ramah Navajo Utility Authority. The right-of-way project would serve a public purpose because the project will benefit Navajo residents.
- E. A waiver of appraisal is requested by the Ramah Navajo Utility Authority.
- F. The environmental and archaeological studies including the Biological Resource Compliance Form, the Cultural Resources Compliance Form, the Finding of No Significant Impact have been completed and attached hereto as **Exhibit "E."**
- G. The application for the Right-of-Way as submitted by Ramah Navajo Utility Authority has been reviewed by the Navajo Land Department; Fish and Wildlife; Historic Preservation; Minerals; Navajo Nation Environmental Protection; Division of Natural Resources and the Department of Justice and "Approved" or found "Sufficient" by all. See Exhibit "F."

#### SECTION THREE. APPROVAL

- A. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby approves the Grant of Right-of-Way to Ramah Navajo Utility Authority on, over and across Navajo Nation Fee Lands in Ramah Chapter vicinity, Cibola County, New Mexico. The location is more particularly described on the survey map attached hereto as **Exhibit "B."**
- B. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby approves a waiver of consideration and a waiver of appraisal for the right-of-way.
- C. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby waives consideration for the right-of-way project because the project will benefit Navajo residents.
- D. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby approves the right-of-way subject to, but not limited to, the following terms and conditions incorporated herein and attached as **Exhibit "D"**.
- E. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby authorizes the President of the Navajo Nation to execute any and all documents necessary to affect the intent and purpose of this resolution.

Ramah Navajo Utility Authority (RNUA) respectfully hereby requests permission for Right-of-Way on the Navajo Tribal Fee (TNF) Lands for the Ramah Mountain View Estates Waterline Distribution Project.

Souder, Miller & Associates (SMA) is currently assisting the Navajo Nation Department of Water Resources to design and construct a distribution water line project within the Ramah Chapter of the Navajo Nation, which will be owned and operated by the Ramah Navajo Utility Authority. The project will consist of a total of approximately 2 miles of 6-inch diameter or smaller water distribution lines, providing potable water supply to unserved chapter residents. The enclosed plats show the proposed project Right-of-Way on Navajo Tribal Fee lands.

#### NAVAJO NATION RIGHT-OF-WAY TERMS AND CONDITIONS

## RAMAH NAVAJO UTILITY AUTHORITY (GRANTEE) (Ramah Mountain View Estates Water Line)

- 1. The term of the right-of-way shall be for <u>twenty</u> (20) years, beginning on the date the right-of-way is granted by the Secretary of the Interior.
- 2. Consideration for the right-of-way is assessed at \$ 67,706.33. The Navajo Nation contributes this amount to the project to provide installation and maintenance of water distribution to Navajo homes.
- 3. The Grantee may develop, use and occupy the right-of-way for the purpose(s) of <u>installation and maintenance of water distribution pipeline</u>. The Grantee may not develop, use or occupy the right-of-way for any other purpose, without the prior written approval of the Navajo Nation. The approval of the Navajo Nation may be granted, granted upon conditions or withheld in the sole discretion of the Navajo Nation. The Grantee may not develop, use or occupy the right-of-way for any unlawful purpose.
- 4. In all activities conducted by the Grantee within the Navajo Nation, the Grantee shall abide by all laws and regulations of the Navajo Nation and of the United States, now in force and effect or as hereafter may come into force and effect, including but not limited to the following:
  - a. Title 25, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 169, subject to the terms of this right-of-way;
  - b. All applicable federal and Navajo Nation antiquities laws and regulations, with the following additional condition: In the event of a discovery all operations in the immediate vicinity of the discovery must cease and the Navajo Nation Historic Preservation Department must be notified immediately. As used herein, "discovery" means any previously unidentified or incorrectly identified cultural resources, including but not limited to archeological deposits, human remains, or location reportedly associated with Native American religious/traditional beliefs or practices;
  - c. The Navajo Preference in Employment Act, 15 N.N.C. §§ 601 et seq., and the Navajo Nation Business Opportunity Act, 5 N.N.C. §§ 201 et seq.; and
  - d. The Navajo Nation Water Code, 22 N.N.C. § 1101 et seq., Grantee shall apply for and submit all applicable permits and information to the Navajo Nation Water Resources Department, or its successor.
- 5. The Grantee shall ensure that the air quality of the Navajo Nation is not jeopardized due to violation of applicable laws and regulations by its operations pursuant to the right-of-way.
- 6. The Grantee shall clear and keep clear the lands within the right-of-way to the extent compatible with the purpose of the right-of-way, and shall dispose of all vegetation and other materials cut, uprooted, or otherwise accumulated during any surface disturbance activities.
- 7. The Grantee shall reclaim all surface lands disturbed related to the right-of-way, as outlined in a restoration and revegetation plan, which shall be approved by Navajo Nation Environmental Protection Agency

(NNEPA) prior to any surface disturbance. The Grantee shall comply with all provisions of such restoration and revegetation plan and shall notify the Director of the NNEPA immediately upon completion of the surface disturbance activities so that a site inspection be can made.

- 8. The Grantee shall at all times during the term of the right-of-way and at the Grantee's sole cost and expense, maintain the land subject to the right-of-way and all improvements located thereon and make all necessary and reasonable repairs.
- 9. The Grantee shall obtain prior written permission to cross existing rights-of-way, if any, from the appropriate parties.
- 10. The Grantee shall be responsible for and promptly pay all damages when they are sustained.
- 11. The Grantee shall indemnify and hold harmless the Navajo Nation and their respective authorized agents, employees, landusers and occupants, against any liability for loss of life, personal injury and property damages arising from the development, use or occupancy or use of right-of-way by the Grantee.
- 12. The Grantee shall not assign, convey, transfer or sublet, in any manner whatsoever, the right-of-way or any interest therein, or in or to any of the improvements on the land subject to the right-of-way, without the prior written consent of the Navajo Nation. Any such attempted assignment, conveyance or transfer without such prior written consent shall be void and of no effect. The consent of the Navajo Nation may be granted, granted upon conditions or withheld in the sole discretion of the Navajo Nation.
- 13. The Navajo Nation may terminate the right-of-way for violation of any of the terms and conditions stated herein. In addition, the right-of-way shall be terminable in whole or part by the Navajo Nation for any of the following causes:
  - a. Failure to comply with any terms and conditions of the grant or of applicable laws or regulations;
  - b. A non-use of the right-of-way for the purpose for which it is granted for a consecutive two (2) year period;
  - c. An abandonment of the right-of-way.
  - d. The use of the land subject to the right-of-way for any purpose inconsistent with the purpose for which the right-of-way is granted.
- 14. At the termination of this right-of-way, the Grantee shall peaceably and without legal process deliver up the possession of the premises, in good condition, usual wear and tear excepted. Upon the written request of the Navajo Nation, the Grantee shall provide the Navajo Nation, at the Grantee's sole cost and expense, with an environmental audit assessment of the premises at least sixty (60) days prior to delivery of said premises.
- 15. Holding over by the Grantee after the termination of the right-of-way shall not constitute a renewal or extension thereof or give the Grantee any rights hereunder or in to the land subject to the right-of-way or to any improvements located thereon.
- 16. The Navajo Nation shall have the right, at any reasonable time during the term of the right-of-way, to enter upon the premises, or any part thereof, to inspect the same and any improvements located thereon.

- 17. By acceptance of the grant of right-of-way, the Grantee consents to the full territorial legislative, executive and judicial jurisdiction of the Navajo Nation, including but not limited to the jurisdiction of the Navajo Nation, including but not limited to the jurisdiction of levy fines and to enter judgments for compensatory and punitive damages and injunctive relief, in connection with all activities conducted by the Grantee within the Navajo Nation or which have a proximate (legal) effect on persons or property within the Navajo Nation.
- 18. By acceptance of the grant of right-of-way, the Grantee covenants and agrees never to contest or challenge the legislative, executive or judicial jurisdiction of the Navajo Nation on the basis that such jurisdiction is inconsistent with the status of the Navajo Nation as an Indian nation, or that the Navajo Nation government is not a government of general jurisdiction, or that the Navajo Nation government does not possess full police power (i.e., the power to legislate and regulate for the general health and welfare) over all lands, persons and activities within its territorial boundaries, or on any other basis not generally applicable to a similar challenge to the jurisdiction of a state government. Nothing contained in this provision shall be construed to negate or impair federal responsibilities with respect to the land subject to the right-of-way or to the Navajo Nation.
- 19. Any action or proceeding brought by the Grantee against the Navajo Nation in connection with or arising out of the terms and conditions of the right-of-way shall be brought only in the Courts of the Navajo Nation, and no such action or proceeding shall be brought by the Grantee against the Navajo Nation in any court of any state.
- 20. Nothing contained herein shall be interpreted as constituting a waiver, express or implied, of the sovereign immunity of the Navajo Nation.
- 21. Except as prohibited by applicable federal law, the law of the Navajo Nation shall govern the construction, performance and enforcement of the terms and conditions contained herein.
- 22. The terms and conditions contained herein shall extend to and be binding upon the successors, heirs, assigns, executors, administrators, employees and agents, including all contractors and subcontractors, of the Grantee, and the term "Grantee," whenever used herein, shall be deemed to include all such successors, heirs, assigns, executors, administrators, employees and agents.
- 23. There is expressly reserved to the Navajo Nation full territorial legislative, executive and judicial jurisdiction over the right-of-way and all lands burdened by the right-of-way, including without limitation over all persons, including the public, and all activities conducted or otherwise occurring within the right-of-way; and the right-of-way and all lands burdened by the right-of-way shall be and forever remain Navajo Indian Country for purposes of Navajo Nation jurisdiction.
- 24. The Navajo Nation reserves the right to grant rights-of-way within the right-of-way referenced herein for utilities, provided that such rights-of-ways do not unreasonably interfere with the Grantee's use of the right-of-way.
- 25. The Grantee shall construct the power line in accordance with "suggested practices for Raptor Protection on Power Lines: State of the Art in 2006."

This FONSI was completed in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA), Council of Environmental Quality Regulations, Department of Interior procedures and Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) NEPA manual.

#### **Proposed Project:**

The Ramah Chapter proposed to construct and operate a waterline extension that would tie into the existing Mountain View Water System. The proposed waterline alignment is approximately 2 miles in length, located in sections 20, 21, 28, and 29 of Township 9 North, Range 15 West, Ramah Chapter, Navajo Nation, Cibola County, Ramah, New Mexico. The proposed project would provide water from an existing 54,000-gallon water tank to 10 residents.

BIA federal actions include Grant of Easement of Right-of-Way (ROW), temporary construction easements, and permits for (3) roadways for the proposed project.

Based on the analysis of the NEPA documents entitled "Environmental Assessment for the Proposed Ramah Mountain View Estates Waterline Extension Project" it has been determined that the proposed action will not constitute a significant impact on the quality of the human environment. Therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) is not required. The reasons supporting these findings are as follows:

- There will be no contamination of soils or water from the proposed project, erosion control/management strategies will be developed utilizing Best Management Practices (BMP). The Contactor will obtain a Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) approval and National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) from Environmental Protection Agency (EPA).
- 2. BMP will be implemented to ensure that construction will limit impacts to meet federal air quality standards to reduce potential impacts to air quality.
- Vegetation removal will be minimal and occur only within construction limits. BMP would be implemented to prevent establishment of noxious weeds in the proposed ROW.
- 4. Wildlife will be displaced during construction of proposed action, however there is adjacent suitable habitat available, and there will be no long-term impacts on non-avian wildlife. Pre-construction surveys for migratory birds will occur to avoid any nesting birds.
- Section 7 of the Endangered Species Act (ESA) has been completed and a No Effect
  determination had been made by a wildlife biologist for the federally-listed species with
  the potential to occur within the proposed project area.
- 6. Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) has been completed with a No Effect determination by the Navajo Nation Tribal Historic Preservation Office

(THPO). If undiscovered cultural resources are found during construction the THPO will be contacted immediately for consultation on the treatment of the discovery.

- 7. There would be short term benefits resulting from the creation of potential job opportunities during actual construction activities. Environmental Justice impacts would not result in disproportionate negative effects to minority or low-income populations. The residents would acquire access potable water, thereby resulting in long-term, beneficial impacts.
- The contractor will provide adequate traffic control device and warning signs to alert local drivers of equipment and activities in or near roadway. A traffic safety plan will be submitted to BIA-Division of Transportation and included in final plans for the proposed project.
- 9. There will be short-term impacts to noise and visual aesthetics, upon completion of the proposed project base-line conditions will resume in the area.
- 10. There will be no impacts to Hunting, Fishing, Gathering, Timber Harvesting, Mineral Extraction and Recreation Resources.
- 11. Solid waste will be disposed at an approved sanitary landfill. There are no known hazardous waste sites within the proposed project. Any contaminated soils will be tested and disposed of as required by federal regulations.

For these reasons, I declare a Finding of No Significant Impact to the human environment resulting from the proposed project. The EA for the proposed project will be available for review upon request at the BIA-Ramah Navajo Agency, HC61, Box 14, Ramah, New Mexico 87321.

#### RESOLUTION OF THE RAMAH NAVAJO CHAPTER

NO. 011202

Supporting the Ramah Navajo Chapter Community Planning and Development Department to coordinate with the Navajo Nation Water Resource Department to submit a funding proposal to upgrade the Ramah Waterline Extension Project located on Section 29, Mountain View Estates within the Ramah Navajo Community, Cibola County.

#### WHEREAS:

- 1. The Ramah Navajo Chapter is a certified and recognized Chapter of the Navajo Nation Pursuant to Tribal Council Resolution No. CJ-20-55, to execute projects in the best interest of the local community people at large; and,
- 2. The Navajo Nation has recognized the Ramah Chapter to be uniquely situated as a satellite community of the Navajo Nation and a recognized local government entity of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 26 N.N.C. Section 3 and 11 N.N.C., Part 1, Section 10; and,
- 3. The Ramah Navajo Chapter delegates the Chapter officials the authority and responsibility to plan and implement community projects with the assistance of the Ramah Navajo Chapter P.L. 93-638 programs, which will benefit the entire community; and,
- 4. The Ramah Navajo Chapter 638 Grants and Contracts/Department of Community Planning & Development Department administer various projects. A goal for the Ramah Navajo Chapter's Department of Community Planning and Development is developing community projects to benefit the Ramah Navajo Community people,
- 5. The Ramah Navajo Chapter has the authority to address local, state, national and federal issues that may affect their livelihoods; and
- The current Ramah waterline is very insufficient, and increasing its capacity will enable more homes, businesses and other much needed facilities to be served; and,
- 7. Improving the operation and increasing the capacity of this facility will help to enable broad community and economic development within the chapter.

#### NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The Ramah Navajo Chapter hereby request and recommends that the Navajo Department of Water Resources, RNC Community Planning/Development and the Ramah Navajo Utility Authority work together to address the waterline's deficiencies and increase its capacity.
- 2. The Ramah Chapter also request and recommends that the Navajo Department of Water Resources, RNC Community Planning/Development and the Ramah Navajo Utility Authority attempt to secure funding from the U.S. Department of Agriculture Rural Development.
