Section Two. Findings

- A. The Navajo Nation Council approved the Síhasin Fund Powerline and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan (the "Expenditure Plan") in Council Resolution CAP-35-18. The Expenditure Plan approves the total capital from the Síhasin Fund in amount of one hundred million six hundred thousand dollars \$100,600,000.00 (less amounts that were line item vetoed by the Navajo Nation President) with \$18,696,787.92 allocated to Navajo Tribal Utility Authority for power line projects.
- B. Resolution CAP-35-18 authorized the Resources & Development Committee to approve the expenditure of funding on "any project cost saved or reduced through leveraging or otherwise shall be available for expenditure on any other project within the respective Chapter deemed construction-ready by CPMD; if there are no construction-ready projects within the respective Chapter, then, with the approval of the Resource & Development Committee, the saved or reduced costs shall be available for expenditure on any other project within the respective district." CAP-35-18, Section 4.B.3.
- C. During Year One of the Expenditure Plan, the Navajo Tribal Utility Authority initiated fifteen (15) different projects in eight (8) communities and realized savings within such projects through initiatives such as the Light Up Navajo Project. Cost savings of \$189,777.12 were realized from the Teesto Scattered Powerline Project alone.
- D. Under the Light up Navajo Project, NTUA partnered with the American Public Power Association with a shared goal of connecting Navajo families on the Navajo Nation to the electric grid for the first time. Between April and May 2019 over 28 utilities and their communities across 13 states and over 138 external non-NTUA volunteers and 349 NTUA volunteers came to the Navajo Nation and fulfilled their goal by connecting 233 Navajo families to the electric grid for the first time. The Navajo families that benefited from the Light Up Navajo Project are located throughout the Navajo Nation within the states of Arizona, New Mexico and Utah.
- E. As a result of cost saving measures achieved by NTUA, additional dollars are available to connect more Navajo families to the electric grid.

Section Four. Approval

- A. The Resource Development Committee hereby approves the expenditure of funds for projects from the Teesto Scattered Powerline Project in the amount of \$189,177.12, which NTUA realized project costs savings or reductions.
- B. NTUA shall expend the cost savings of \$189,177.12 in Teesto Chapter on other construction ready projects in Teesto Chapter, or if there are no construction ready projects in Teesto, on projects within the respective Navajo Nation Council Delegate District in accordance with the Sihasin Fund Powerline and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan (CAP-35-18, Section 4.B.3.).
