The Naabik'íyáti Committee of the 23rd Navajo Nation Council passed NABIF-13-18 titled "AN ACTION RELATING TO RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT, LAW AND ORDER AND NAABIK'ÍYÁTI'; REQUESTING FIRSTNET AND AT&T, IN DEVELOPING NATIONWIDE PUBLIC SAFETY BROADBAND NETWORK TO RECOGNIZE AND ACCEPT NATION-TO-NATION RELATIONS; REQUESTING AN ASSESSMENT AND STRATEGIC PLAN FROM NAVAJO NATION PUBLIC SAFETY AND TELECOMMUNICATIONS PROGRAMS" and is attached hereto as **Exhibit A**.
