This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committee. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each committee member to review the proposed resolution in detail.

15	A. The Navajo Nation established the Naabik'íyáti' Committee as a Navajo Nation
16	Council standing committee. 2 N.N.C. § 700.
17	B. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee has the power to "coordinate with all committees,
18	Chapters, branches and entities concerned with all Navajo appearances and testimony
19	before Congressional committees, departments of the United States government, state
20	legislatures and departments and county and local governments." 2 N.N.C. §
21	701(A)(8).
22	C. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee has the power to "recommend to the United States
23	departments and agencies, the states and various regional agencies the appointment of
24	individuals who, in the judgment of the Committee, will fulfill the requirements of their
25	office and serve the interests of the Navajo Nation." 2 N.N.C. § 701(A)(9).
26	D. Honorable Neil Gorsuch is the U.S. President's nominee to the Supreme Court of the
27	United States and currently sits on the 10 th Circuit Court of Appeals, a court that includes
28	the portion of the Navajo Nation which lies in New Mexico.
29	E. Native Americans inhabited North America since time immemorial; however, the United
30	States recognized Native Americans as citizens in 1924 with the passage of the Indian

Citizenship Act, Approved June 2, 1924, Sixty-Eighth Congress, 8 U.S.C., Sec. 1401(b) and it was not until 1965 that Native Americans were provided the right to vote through the passage of the Voting Rights Act, 52 U.S.C. §§ 10101 – 10702.

- F. The Navajo Nation has a long history of legal disputes being decided in U.S. courts, including such matters as taxation, trust responsibility and mismanagement and trademark infringement.
- G. Honorable Neil Gorsuch, as he stated in his testimony, is familiar with cases for Native Americans seeking to protect tribal lands and has tried to treat all who come to court fairly and with respect.
- H. The Navajo Nation, with its 300,000 or more citizens and a large voting population, ask only to be treated fairly and with respect in legal issues that come before the Supreme Court of the United States.
- I. The Navajo Nation courts coined the phrase "words are sacred and never frivolous in Navajo thinking," so too Honorable Gorsuch stated his mentor, Justice Antonin Scalia, reminded people "that words matter, that the judge's job is to follow the words that are the law, not replace them with words that aren't;" the Navajo Nation encourages this principle.
- J. Honorable Gorsuch's experience in 60 cases before the 10th Circuit Court of Appeals involving tribal issues provides him with a background that is needed on the Supreme Court of the United States.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

- A. The Navajo Nation supports the nomination of the Honorable Neil Gorsuch to the Supreme Court of the United States.
- B. The Navajo Nation calls on its Congressional representatives to support the nomination of the Honorable Neil Gorsuch to the Supreme Court of the United States.
