# RESOLUTION OF THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL

### 23RD NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL -- Fourth Year, 2018

#### AN ACTION

RELATING TO HEALTH, EDUCATION AND HUMAN SERVICES, NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING THE REINSTATEMENT OF ALVINA RAY GUTIERREZ AS A MEMBER OF THE NAVAJO NATION

### BE IT ENACTED:

### SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. Under the laws of the Navajo Nation, any enrolled member of the Navajo Nation may renounce [her] membership by written petition to the President of the Navajo Nation requesting that her name be stricken from the Navajo Nation roll. See 1 N.N.C. § 705.
- B. "No person, otherwise eligible for membership in the Navajo Nation, may enroll as a member of the Navajo Nation, who, at the same time, is on the roll of any other tribe of Indians." See 1 N.N.C. § 703
- C. Renounced members may be reinstated by the Navajo Nation only by the vote of majority of the Navajo Nation Council. See 1 N.N.C. § 705.

### SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. On October 1, 2008, Alvina Ray Gutierrez executed a "Relinquishment of Navajo Nation Membership" form which was acknowledged by the President of the Navajo Nation on January 16, 2009, form is attached as **Exhibit A**.
- B. Alvina Ray Gutierrez relinquished her Navajo Nation membership with the intent to relocate to southern Arizona and enroll with the Tohono O'odham Nation. See Exhibit C.
- C. Alvina Ray Gutierrez has been a resident of the St. Michaels community since 1958 but left the Navajo Nation to seek employment and to serve in the United States Army. *Id.*
- D. On February 9, 2017, the Tohono O'odham Nation Legislative Council passed Resolution No. 17-044 which relinquished the Tohono O'odham membership of Alvina Ray Gutierrez, resolution is attached as **Exhibit B**.

- E. The St. Michaels Chapter supports and recommends the reinstatement of Alvina Ray Gutierrez to the Navajo Nation, resolution of St. Michaels Chapter is attached as **Exhibit D**.
- F. Alvina Ray Gutierrez has formally requested reinstatement into the Navajo Nation, letter attached as **Exhibit C**.

### SECTION THREE. REENROLLMENT

Alvina Ray Gutierrez, is and shall be reinstated, or otherwise reenrolled, as a member of the Navajo Nation. By this action of the Navajo Nation Council and pursuant to the laws of the Navajo Nation, she shall be entitled to all rights, benefits and privileges associated with membership with the Navajo Nation.

WHEREAS, Article VI, Section 1(b) of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation vests the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council with the power to "enact laws and ordinances governing the enrollment and adoption of members and the relinquishment and loss of membership"; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Tohono O'odham Nation's Enrollment Ordinance.

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Tohono O'odham Nation's Enrollment Ordinance, Ordinance No. 05-81 as amended the Enrollment Committee has received written statements from 1 tribal members who have expressed their intent to relinquish their membership with the Tohono O'odham Nation and the members are identified in the February 2017 Relinquishment List, which is incorporated by this reference; and

A member of the Nation may relinquish his membership in the Nation by submitting a written statement clearly expressing an intent to relinquish his membership to the Council, a copy of which must be served on the committee. The written statement must be signed by the person wishing to relinquish his

membership or, if a minor or incompetent, by the parent(s), guardian or other person legally authorized to act on his behalf. Relinquishment does not require the approval of the Council, but is effective upon receipt of the statement by the Council and cannot be subsequently denied. Upon recognition by the Council

that the individual has renounced his membership, his name shall be deleted from the membership roll.

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

# ST. MICHAELS CHAPTER RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE REINSTATEMENT OF ALVINA RAY GUTIERREZ TO THE NAVAJO CENSUS ROLL.

No. 08-27-17-136

### WHEREAS:

- 1. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C. Section 3(A), the St. Michaels Chapter is a certified Chapter of the Navajo Nation as listed under 11 N.N.C. Part 1. Section 10; vested with the authority and responsibility to provide and address local planning within its community; and
- 2. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C. Section 1(B), the St. Michaels Chapter is delegated the governmental authority to make decisions over local matters consistent with the Navajo law, custom and tradition; and to allow the chapter to make decisions to govern with responsibility; and
- 3. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., \$101 Local Governance Act, St. Michaels Chapter is mandated to adopt and operate under a five-management system; and
- 4. The St. Michaels Chapter adopted the standard FMS manual in July 2010; and
- 5. Pursuant to 1 N.N.C. §705, any enrolled member of the Navajo Nation may renounce his membership by written petition to the President of the Navajo Nation requesting that his name be stricken from the Navajo Nation Roll. Such person may be reinstated in the Navajo Nation only by the vote of a majority of the Navajo Nation Council; and
- 6. Alvina Ray Gutierrez (Prior Navajo Census\*) petitioned the President of the Navajo Nation for relinquishment of Navajo Nation membership on October 1, 2008, upon becoming an enrolled member of the Tohono O' odham Nation (see Exhibit "A"); and
- 7. The Tohono O' odham Enrollment Committee has notified Alvina Ray Gutierrez of enactment of Resolution No. 17-044, Resolution of the Tohono O' odham Legislative
  . Council (Recognition of Relinquishment from membership in the Tohono O'odham Nation for the Month of February 2017), see Exhibit "B"; and

- 8. Pursuant to 1 N.N.C. §751, anyone wishing to apply for enrolment in the Navajo Nation may submit an application pursuant to 1 NNC §760, such application must be verified before a notary public; and
- 9. Alvina Ray Gutierrez, a former enrolled member of the Navajo Tribe, born for Tabaha Clan, with lifetime ties to Tabaha Clan and community ties with the Navajo since 1958, having honorable service of four years with the United States Army and one year with the National Guard, and current resident of the St. Michaels Chapter; requested support of the St. Michaels Chapter, for reinstatement enrollment with the Navajo Nation Indian Census Roll because its where she feels she belongs; and
- 10. The St. Michaels Chapter supports the reinstatement of Alvina Ray Gutierrez to the Navajo Indian Census Roll due to her family and clan relationships, lifetime community ties, former membership with the Navajo Nation, honorable military service to the United States, and membership with the Navajo is where she feels she belongs: and
- 11. St. Michaels Chapter requests the support of the Health. Education and Human Services Committee, Naa'bik'iyai' Committee and the Navajo Nation Council to support the reinstatement enrollment of Alvina Ray Gutierrez to the Navajo Indian Census Roll, with all rights, benefits, and privileges associated with membership with the Navajo Nation.

### NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

- 1. The St. Michaels Chapter supports the reinstatement of Alvina Ray Gutierrez to the Navajo Indian Census Roll due to her family and clan relationships, lifetime community ties, former membership with the Navajo Nation, honorable military service to the United States, and membership with the Navajo is where she feels she belongs; and
- 2. St. Michaels Chapter requests the support of the Health, Education and Human Services Committee, Naa'bik'iyai' Committee and the Navajo Nation Council to support the reinstatement enrollment of Alvina Ray Gutierrez to the Navajo Indian Census Roll, with all rights, benefits, and privileges associated with membership with the Navajo Nation.

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
