SUBJECT: Resolution No. CAP-31-18. AN ACTION RELATING TO HEALTH, EDUCATION AND HUMAN SERVICES, BUDGET AND FINANCE, NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$100,000.00) TO THE DEPARTMENT OF DINE EDUCATION OFFICE OF STANDARDS, CURRICULUM AND ASSESSMENT DEVELOPMENT.

Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. 1005 (C)(10), action for Resolution No. CAP-31-18 is being submitted to the Navajo Nation Council, through the Office of the Speaker within the ten (10) days requirement. Furthermore, the Navajo Nation President has line item veto authority for budget items within the Supplemental Appropriations, which are not subject to override by the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. 164 (A)(17).

After thorough review of Resolution No. CAP-31-18, I hereby exercise my line-veto to:

1. **Section Three. Approving the Supplemental Appropriation from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance in the Amount of \$100,000.00 to the Office Of Standards, Curriculum and Assessment Development in order to complete revisions and development of three language assessment instruments.**

The justification and details for use of the President's line-item veto are set forth below:

The Office of the President and Vice President has offered to the Navajo Nation Council seven (7) priorities for the use of the remaining Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance ("UUFb") budget and Resolution No. CAP-31-18 does not fall within any of the seven designated categories. Secondly, the Department should utilize its own internal budget. Lastly, UUFb monies are needed to prepare and address the impending drought and other unforeseeable emergencies. As the President of the Navajo Nation, I must protect to the best present and future interests of the Navajo People to the best of my ability.

Therefore, I must exercise my line-item veto authority.

AN ACTION

RELATING TO HEALTH, EDUCATION AND HUMAN SERVICES, BUDGET AND FINANCE, NAABIK'ÍYÁTI', AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE UNRESERVED, UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$100,000.00) TO THE DEPARTMENT OF DINÉ EDUCATION OFFICE OF STANDARDS, CURRICULUM AND ASSESSMENT DEVELOPMENT AND WAIVING 12 N.N.C. § 820 (E) AND (F)

BE IT ENACTED:

Section One. Authority

- A. The Navajo Nation established the Health, Education and Human Services Committee as a Navajo Nation Council standing committee and as such gave the Committee oversight over matters impacting the health of the Navajo Nation and its tribal organizations, entities, and enterprises. 2 N.N.C. § 401(B)(1).
- B. The Navajo Nation established the Budget and Finance Committee (BFC) as a Navajo Nation Council standing committee and as such empowered BFC to review and recommend to the Navajo Nation Council the management of all funds. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(9), 300 (A), 301 (B)(2).
- C. The Navajo Nation Council established the Naabik'íyáti' Committee as a Navajo Nation standing committee and as such proposed legislation that requires final action by the Navajo Nation Council shall be assigned to the Naabik'íyáti' Committee. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(9), 700 (A).

Section Two. Findings

- A. The Title 12 Finance Act Supplemental Appropriation requirements include:
 - 1. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(L), when the Controller identifies additional sources of revenues above and beyond the initial or current revenue projections, supplemental appropriations may be allocated by the Navajo Nation Council.

2. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820 (L), "Supplemental appropriations made from non-recurring revenues shall only be made for non-recurring operations or purposes, as set forth at § 820 (F). The Controller of the Navajo Nation shall be responsible for designating recurring and non-recurring revenues and purposes."
 3. Pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 820(M), all requests for annual operating funds and supplemental funds shall be submitted to the Office of Management and Budget ("OMB") for budget impact analysis.
- B. This is a funding request for a supplemental appropriation from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance in the amount of \$100,000.00.
- C. The Navajo Office of Standards, Curriculum and Assessment Development requests this funding to complete revisions and development of three language assessment instruments. See **Exhibit A**.
- D. The language assessments are used to certify Navajo language and culture teachers, determine the progress of language acquisition among Navajo students, and help teachers tailor curriculum and instruction strategies to meet the academic and linguistic needs of students.
- E. The supplemental funding request forms are attached as **Exhibit A**.
- F. The Office of Management and Budget has provided a Budget Impact Analysis as required by 12 N.N.C. § 820(M), attached as **Exhibit C**. The Program's response to OMB is attached as **Exhibit D**.
- G. The Office of the Controller has provided a memorandum dated April 13, 2018, indicating the balance in the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance as of April 11, 2018 is \$10,073,560. This memorandum is provided to meet the requirements of 12 N.N.C. 820 (L); the Controller of the Navajo Nation has designated the funds as recurring. This memorandum is attached as **Exhibit B**.
- H. The Navajo Nation finds it in the best interest of the Navajo people to approve this supplemental appropriation request.

Section Three. Approving the Supplemental Appropriation from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance in the Amount of \$100,000.00 to the Office of Standards, Curriculum and Assessments Development in order to complete revisions and development of three language assessment instruments

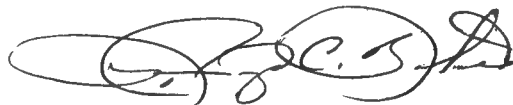
- A. This supplemental appropriation of \$100,000.00 shall be from that amount of funds that exceeds the minimum fund balance of the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance as determined by the Office of the Controller and to Business Unit Number 109005.
- B. The Navajo Nation hereby approves the supplemental appropriation from the Unreserved, Undesignated Fund Balance to the Diné Education Office of Standards, Curriculum and Assessment Development for Business Unit 109005 for \$100,000.00. With the Controller's designation of this appropriation as a recurring cost, the Navajo Nation waives 12 N.N.C. § 820 (E) and (F) regarding the restriction on recurring and non-recurring costs.

Section Four. Effective Date

The provisions of this Act shall become effective in accordance with 2 N.N.C. § 221(B).

PART II. REASON FOR REQUEST AND STATEMENT OF NEED:

OSCAD has three assessment instruments under revision or development, ODLA and the Native American Language & Culture Certification (NALCC) exam and the Diné Content Standards Assessments study (DCSA). ODLA and NALCC were developed in 2005 and are now outdated. The former is in its final phase of revisions, scheduled to be completed and fully ready for implementation by September 2018. The second is in its second year of revisions; the third in its final phase of development. It is used to certify Navajo language and culture teachers. ODLA and NALCC were developed by grants from NM Public Education that start July 1 and end June 30 of the following year. The DCS Assessment study has been funded by the BIE and the NN.

It is crucial that the work be completed. ODLA is a language test that will determine the progress of language acquisition among Navajo students K-12. It will help teachers tailor their curriculum and instruction strategies to meet the linguistic and academic needs of their students. The NALCC exam tests prospective language and culture teachers on their knowledge of Navajo language and culture, and their readiness as teachers. In order for NN to revive and maintain their language and culture, it is crucial that these assessment instruments be revised and readied for implementation. NN is one of a handful of Indian nations that have assessment instruments to measure student and teacher progress in language and culture learning. The DCS Assessment study will evaluate and monitor the progress of students as they learn through the Diné Content Standards (DCS).

All three projects are crucial to DODE's efforts to bring quality education standards to the classroom. It is imperative that the revisions be updated and adjusted to the needs of students and teachers today and that the DCS Assessment study be completed so the instrument can be made available to schools. DODE is venturing to run its own school system. Both instruments will make that possible. Both will be used to upgrade instruction and enhance and improve student performance. With NN funds, we can work on the revisions year round, instead of only a few weeks. It is doubtful that the 164 Review process will allow enough time to adequately use the NM grant. The Reliability & Validity Study of the DCS Assessment is near completion; however, the progress of the assessment is requiring additional funds to complete by the end of December 2017.


PART III. CONTINGENCY PLAN IF REQUEST IS NOT FUNDED:

To put the revisions and R&V study on hold until such time additional funds is identified.

PART IV. ALTERNATIVE FUNDING SOURCES BEING PURSUED:

This year the Intergovernmental Agreement was not sent to the President's office until August 28, 2017. OSCAD was not notified until October 2nd, 2017. The delays puts the 164 Review process behind by six months. Normally it takes six (6) months to complete the review and allow access of the funds by January; however, this year with the delays that would mean April 2018. The finance office begins closing out grants in May which further shortens the time to (6) weeks at the most to use and expend the funds. It then becomes impossible to do

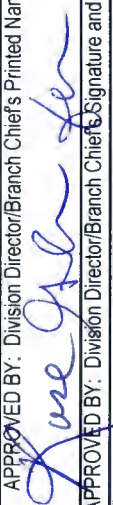

The Office of the Controller has reviewed the above referenced document.

1. The un-audited balance of the UUFB is \$10,073,560 as of April 11, 2018; there are a number of other supplemental requests that will be considered by the Navajo Nation Council in the near future. This supplemental request is for \$100,000 for operational costs, travel, supplies, and meetings for the Office of Standards, Curriculum and Assessment Development. Also please be reminded that the UUFB balance is unaudited and is subject to change pending the completion of the FY 2017 audit.
2. The costs for this request we determined are RECURRING costs.
3. Important Note: Our office is currently monitoring the Nation's actual minerals revenue to-date versus the projected revenues for FY 2018. Additionally, our office has started the revenue projection task for the upcoming 2019 operating budgets. Being that minerals revenue levels are decreasing, we recommend the Nation spend the UUFB in a prudent and conservative manner for these reasons The Navajo Nation actual minerals revenue to date vs. the projection for FY 2018 is a real concern going forward as well as for the upcoming Fiscal 2019 therefore is this type of spending prudent as there may be possible shortfall in revenue in the near future which would affect the UUFB.

SUBJECT : Legislation 0439-17: Supplemental Appropriation for Office of Standards, Curriculum and Assessment Development in the amount of \$100,000.

1. The balance in the available UUFB as of October 13, 2017 is \$31,258,217, according to the Office of the Controller.
2. The Plan of Operation resolution number for this business unit number on Form 2 is incorrect. The program has been informed numerous times regarding this information. It should be GSCO-44-10.
3. On budget form 2, the performance criteria #1 and #2 are already on the FY 2018 budget form 2. Are these performance criteria additional to the fiscal year form 2 with the number of goals?
4. There is an error in the resolution on page 3 of 3, under Section Three (B), the program name has NN Office of Uranium Workers.
5. In a memorandum dated October 2, 2017, OMB informed the Branch Chiefs and Navajo Nation Council that there are 30 UUFB proposals totaling more than \$46 million. Since then, there are at least 45 and the new total amount requested is about \$60 million. What are the priorities?
6. This proposal legislation should be routed through the Navajo Nation 164 document review process.
7. What are the priorities for the Department of Dine Education, there are nine (9) other proposals going through the process for education.

SUBJECT: Legislation 0439-17 Supplement Request for \$100,000

The Office of Standards, Curriculum & Assessment Development (OSCAD) is in receipt of the memorandum dated November 27, 2017 from the Office of Legislative Counsel regarding the Supplemental Request for \$100,000. Attached to that document is a memo from Dominic Beyal, dated November 17, 2017, subject: Legislation 0439-17. We will be making an official response to Chief Legislative Counsel regarding Mr. Beyal's questions and clarification, as follows:

1. In FY 2017 OMB staff was adamant that the HEHSCO-031-12 was the official Resolution for this program. All of a sudden, in FY 2018 the GSCO-44-10 Resolution was the official document. One question we have is: does that mean the Program name is still "Office of Diné Culture, Language & Community Services?"
2. Item #3 talks about Form 2 Performance Criteria / Program Performance Area: 1 and 2 which does not apply to the supplemental request. However, PPA 3 refers to the continuation of ODLA, NALCC revisions and to finalize the DCS assessments Reliability & Validity Study. [This goes back to our question to OMB, when the supplemental request was being made: Do we need to submit a new Form 2 or do we just attach the one for FY 18 from our official budget packet. There was no feedback by OMB or anyone else.] Yes, the funds are still needed.
3. Response to #7; the Department of Diné Education has many priorities. However, the priorities for the Office of Standards, Curriculum & Assessment Development are to finish the revisions of the ODLA, NALCC and the DCS assessment study. These assessments are important components of DSAP in DoDE moving toward becoming an SEA entity.
