Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CAP-10-23, herein by reference, mandates that amendments to the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Project Plan for Honorable Helena Nez Begay's Delegate Region (Chapter: Coppermine, K'aibii'to, LeChee, Tonalea/Red Lake, Bodaway/Gap) be approved by a Navajo Nation Council resolution and signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A)(17), and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005 (C) (10), (11), and (12).

#### SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

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A. Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CJN-29-22, AN ACTION RELATING TO THE NAABIK'IYATI' COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; ALLOCATING \$1,070,298,867 OF NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS: APPROVING THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND EXPENDITURE PLANS FOR: CHAPTER AND REGIONAL PROJECTS; PUBLIC SAFETY EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS, E911. AND RURAL ADDRESSING PROJECTS; CYBER SECURITY; PUBLIC HEALTH PROJECTS; HARDSHIP ASSISTANCE; WATER AND WASTEWATER PROJECTS; BROADBAND PROJECTS; HOME ELECTRICITY CONNECTION AND AND ELECTRIC CAPACITY **PROJECTS**; HOUSING PROJECTS HOUSING FACILITIES; BATHROOM ADDITION MANUFACTURED PROJECTS; CONSTRUCTION CONTINGENCY FUNDING; AND REDUCED ADMINISTRATIVE FUNDING, was signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation on July 15, 2022.

B. CJN-29-22, Section Three, states, in part and among other things, that

 The Navajo Nation hereby approves total funding for the NNFRF Chapter and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan from the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund in the total amount of two hundred eleven million two hundred fifty-six thousand one hundred forty-eight dollars (\$211,256,148) to be divided equally between the twenty-four (24) Delegate Regions in the

amount of eight million eight hundred two thousand three hundred forty dollars (\$8,802,340) per Delegate Region ... and allocated through Delegate Region Project Plans approved by Navajo Nation Council resolution and signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation .... See CJN-29-22. Section Three (B). 2. The Delegate Region Project Plan funding will be allocated to the Navajo Nation Central Government, specifically the Division of Community Development or other appropriate Navajo Nation Division or Department, to implement the projects rather than directly to the Chapters. See CJN-29-22, Section Three (D). 3. The Navajo Nation Central Government, specifically the Division of Community Development or other appropriate Navajo Nation Division or Department, shall manage and administer funds and Delegate Region Project Plans on behalf of Non-LGA-Certified Chapters. The Navajo Nation Central Government may award funding to LGA-Certified Chapters through sub-recipient agreements to implement and manage specific projects, but shall maintain Administrative Oversight over such funding and Delegate Region Project Plans. See CJN-29-22, Section Three (E). 4. Each Navajo Nation Council delegate shall select Fiscal Recovery Fund eligible projects within their Delegate Region to be funded by the NNFRF Chapter and Regional Projects Expenditure Plan through a Delegate Region Projects Plan. The total cost of projects selected by each Delegate shall not exceed their Delegate Region distribution of eight million eight hundred two thousand three hundred forty dollars (\$8,802,340). See CJN-29-22, Section Three (F). 5. Each Delegate Region Project shall identify its Administrative Oversight entity and its Oversight Committee(s) and be subject CJY-41-21's NNDOJ initial eligibility determination. 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C. The Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CAP-10-23, AN ACTION RELATING TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND DELEGATE REGION PROJECT PLAN FOR HONORABLE HELENA NEZ BEGAY'S DELEGATE REGION (CHAPTERS: COPPERMINE, K'AIBII'TO, LECHEE, TONALEA/RED LAKE, BODAWAY/GAP), was signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation on May 5, 2023.

D. CAP-10-23, Section Four, states that:

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 Amendments to this legislation or to the Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein shall only be adopted by resolution of the Navajo Nation Council and approval of the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A)(17) and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005 (C) (10), (11), and (12).

E. All additional projects listed in the Hon. Helena Nez Begay's Delegate Region Projects Plan, attached as Exhibit A, have been deemed Fiscal Recovery Fund eligible by NNDOJ. In addition, Hon. Helena Nez Begay's Delegate Region Projects Plan does *not* exceed the amount of \$8,802,340, as set forth in CJN-29-22, Section Three (F).

F. The Navajo Nation Council hereby finds that it is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation and the Hon. Helena Nez Begay's Delegate Region Chapters and communities to approve and adopt the additional projects as part of the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Project Plan for Hon. Helena Nez Begay's Delegate Region (Chapters: Coppermine, K'aibii'to, LeChee, Tonalea/Red Lake, Bodaway/Gap) as set forth in **Exhibit A**.

SECTION THREE. AMENDING CAP-10-23, THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND DELEGATE REGION PROJECT PLAN FOR HONORABLE HELENA NEZ BEGAY'S DELEGATE REGION (CHAPTERS: COPPERMINE, K'AIBII'TO, LECHEE, TONALEA/RED LAKE, BODAWAY/GAP), TO INCLUDE ADDITIONAL PROJECTS FOR THIS DELEGATE REGION

- B. The Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein shall comply with all applicable provisions of CJY-41-21, CJN-29-22, and BFS-31-21.
- C. Any inconsistencies between this legislation, the Delegate Region Project Plan, and the individual project appendix, shall be resolved in favor of the project appendix reviewed by Department of Justice during their eligibility determination(s).

#### SECTION FOUR. AMENDMENTS

Amendments to this legislation or to the Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein shall only be adopted by resolution of the Navajo Nation Council and approval of the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A)(17) and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005 (C) (10), (11), and (12).

#### SECTION FIVE. EFFECTIVE DATE

This legislation shall be effective upon its approval pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 221(B), 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A)(17), and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005 (C) (10), (11), and (12).

#### SECTION SIX. SAVING CLAUSE

If any provision of this legislation is determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or by a Navajo Nation District Court without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, those provisions of this legislation not determined invalid shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.

Good afternoon Navalyn,

In receipt of your email from Delegate Paul Begay's LDA, Jerry Williams. Thanks for sending out the email to him requesting additional information on the approval for our chapter.

Here are my responses to the four questions you had asked.

1. A community needs assessment based on multi generation homes, with overcrowding. Alot of our residents here in LeChee were affected by COVID 19 and had to leave their employment and homes off the reservation, then when they moved home there was no housing available for them to move their young families into, also they had to move back into their parents place or live with grandparents, and take a lower salary position to make monthly ends meet. We have an overcrowded household living together, ie. 2 bedrooms with 2 families of more than 6+ people.

2. Our request is to purchase module homes and get them placed within the community where they have infrastructure set up already. 3 bedroom home with a 704+ square foot. (This information was provided to you in the original proposal we turned in)

3. The City of Page is near by which we will make a comparison to.

a. The 3 bedroom home is estimated at \$250k with the land/taxes - City of Page

b. 3 bedroom modular home \$91,000.00 + infrastructure setup \$3,000.00 - Mobile home vendor.

c. To build a 3 bedroom house in LeChee with manpower/infrastructure estimated by square footage of 704 feet = \$175k.

4. I am not sure what these programs are and never research them. I have never researched them because the chapter assumed that during our presentation from Tom Platero the ARPA funding was made available to all chapters to assist the

community members based on the impact of COVID 19 Pandemic. During his presentation he did not mention we need to look for other funds that could help the chapters. This is the first time this question has come up.

The homes will be a single modular home with two bedrooms, kitchen, living room and bathroom area. Homes will either be built or be mobile homes. The square footage is 864 square feet and approximately  $24 \times 36$  in size.

## 3. Please describe how the estimated size and cost per home compares to homes in the area?

I do not know the estimated size and cost per home in the area as most homes are based on different income criteria and eligibility determination for housing assistance. Some homes are old and there are a lot of mobile homes that are purchased by homeowners.

#### 4. Please explain whether the home construction projects would qualify for any federal funded housing programs, including, but not limited to the National Housing Trust Fund, Indian Housing Block Grant program, the Indian Community Develop Block Grant program, or the BIA Housing Improvement Program.

I am not familiar with those programs and do not know how this will benefit these families in need. I am sure that majority of these families have applied for assistance for housing with Navajo Housing Authority and other entities to try to secure housing, but to no avail as housing was not available. With that being said, this is the opportune time to get these families in homes especially those that are in dire need and the eligibility criteria being used.

#### NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS KAIBETO CHAPTER NEW HOUSING APPLICATION CRITERIA

#### 1. Eligibility Determination:

- a. One new housing application per applicant
- b. Applicant must be 18 years old or older
- c. All information on the application is accurate and filled out entirely. If any information is not provided, your application will be considered incomplete and placed in "pending status".
- d. All information on the application will be true and complete, any misrepresentation or false information will be justification for refusal of housing assistance.
- e. All applications must have applicant's required supporting documents attached:
  - Identification Card
  - Certificate of Indian Blood (CIB)
  - Proof of Chapter Voter Registration
  - Approved homesite/residential lease (with Navajo Nation environmental Compliance Forms)
- f. All records shall be considered confidential information pertaining to the applicant(s) request for assistance, and/or assistance provided shall not be made public without the written consent of the applicant.
- g. Applications shall not be taken over the phone or fax and verbal applications shall not be accepted.
- h. A map of residence is required to provide directions to the primary residence/home.
- i. A referral from a governmental agency, official representative or medical physician will justify the applicant's need for housing assistance.

#### 2. Application Homesite Assessments:

- a. Kaibeto Chapter officials/Chapter Administration will conduct applicant homesite assessment to verify all information on the application is accurate, if any information on application is determined false, applicant will be ineligible for housing assistance.
- b. Visual assessment of the existing home will determine if a new home is to be constructed or a possible renovation to a livable standard.
- c. Existing homes will also be considered for demolition and removal if a new home is considered.
- d. A mobile home shall not be worked on if it is unsafe and unsanitary to live in.
- 3. Application Selection Criteria:
  - a. Applicant has a burnout home
  - b. Applicant is disabled/severe health concerns
  - c. Overcrowded or multi-generational home
  - d. Applicant's existing home is dilapidated (unrepairable)
  - e. Carefully review applicants' name on the homesite lease, will not assist applicant if applicant is not on the lease.


